
Sounds like you can finalize the legal we discussed for your research below.

I have created a NWSE Lot 3 shape which splits the current Govt Lot 2 in to two parts; the southern half being Lot 3. This has been updated to the QQ layer on production.

There could be some updating here as this changes the PLS designation for a number of claims, recommendations etc. The recommendations are the most important to get right as they will become the 'new' water rights after the Director's Reports. Sounds like this basin is a year or two out. Is it possible to update each of the recommendations POU/POD PLS now before the director's report? I have attached a spreadsheet with the recommendations in this 'new' QQ and Lot 3.

I have cc'ed Carter and Craig about these changes. From the email below, BLM agrees with this change and is implementing it as well. Let me know if you have questions.
