Conditions of Approval

- 1. Proof of application of water to beneficial use shall be submitted on or before **December 01, 2025.**
- 2. Subject to all prior water rights.
- 3. A fish screen of 1/4 inch or smaller mesh shall be installed and maintained at the point of diversion.
- 4. The approach velocity at the point of diversion shall not exceed 0.5 feet per second.
- 5. After specific notification by the Department, the right holder shall install a suitable measuring device or shall enter into an agreement with the Department to use power records to determine the amount of water diverted and shall annually report the information to the Department.
- 6. This right when combined with all other rights shall provide no more than 0.02 cfs per acre nor more than 3.0 afa per acre at the field headgate for irrigation of the place of use.




This map depicts the IRRIGATION place of use boundary for this water right at the time of this approval and is attached to the approval document solely for illustrative purposes.

EXPLANATORY INFORMATION TO ACCOMPANY A PRELIMINARY ORDER

(To be used in connection with actions when a hearing was **not** held)

(Required by Rule of Procedure 730.02)

The accompanying order or approved document is a "Preliminary Order" issued by the department pursuant to section 67-5243, Idaho Code. It can and will become a final order without further action of the Department of Water Resources ("department") unless a party petitions for reconsideration, files an exception and brief, or requests a hearing as further described below:

PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION

Any party may file a petition for reconsideration of a preliminary order with the department within fourteen (14) days of the service date of this order. Note: the petition must be <u>received</u> by the department within this fourteen (14) day period. The department will act on a petition for reconsideration within twenty-one (21) days of its receipt, or the petition will be considered denied by operation of law. See Section 67-5243(3) Idaho Code.

EXCEPTIONS AND BRIEFS

Within fourteen (14) days after: (a) the service date of a preliminary order, (b) the service date of a denial of a petition for reconsideration from this preliminary order, or (c) the failure within twenty-one (21) days to grant or deny a petition for reconsideration from this preliminary order, any party may in writing support or take exceptions to any part of a preliminary order and may file briefs in support of the party's position on any issue in the proceeding with the Director. Otherwise, this preliminary order will become a final order of the agency.

REQUEST FOR HEARING

Unless a right to a hearing before the Department or the Water Resource Board is otherwise provided by statute, any person aggrieved by any final decision, determination, order or action of the Director of the Department and who has not previously been afforded an opportunity for a hearing on the matter may request a hearing pursuant to section 42-1701A(3), Idaho Code. A written petition contesting the action of the Director and requesting a hearing shall be filed within fifteen (15) days after receipt of the denial or conditional approval.

ORAL ARGUMENT

If the Director grants a petition to review the preliminary order, the Director shall allow all parties an opportunity to file briefs in support of or taking exceptions to the preliminary order and may schedule oral argument in the matter before issuing a final order. If oral arguments are to be heard, the Director will within a reasonable time period notify each party of the place, date and hour for the argument of the case. Unless the Director orders otherwise, all oral arguments will be heard in Boise, Idaho.

CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE

All exceptions, briefs, requests for oral argument and any other matters filed with the Director in connection with the preliminary order shall be served on all other parties to the proceedings in accordance with IDAPA Rules 37.01.01302 and 37.01.01303 (Rules of Procedure 302 and 303).

FINAL ORDER

The Director will issue a final order within fifty-six (56) days of receipt of the written briefs, oral argument or response to briefs, whichever is later, unless waived by the parties or for good cause shown. The Director may remand the matter for further evidentiary hearings if further factual development of the record is necessary before issuing a final order. The department will serve a copy of the final order on all parties of record.

Section 67-5246(5), Idaho Code, provides as follows:

Unless a different date is stated in a final order, the order is effective fourteen (14) days after its service date if a party has not filed a petition for reconsideration. If a party has filed a petition for reconsideration with the agency head, the final order becomes effective when:

- (a) The petition for reconsideration is disposed of; or
- (b) The petition is deemed denied because the agency head did not dispose of the petition within twenty-one (21) days.

APPEAL OF FINAL ORDER TO DISTRICT COURT

Pursuant to sections 67-5270 and 67-5272, Idaho Code, if this preliminary order becomes final, any party aggrieved by the final order or orders previously issued in this case may appeal the final order and all previously issued orders in this case to district court by filing a petition in the district court of the county in which:

- i. A hearing was held,
- ii. The final agency action was taken,
- iii. The party seeking review of the order resides, or
- iv. The real property or personal property that was the subject of the agency action is located.

The appeal must be filed within twenty-eight (28) days of this preliminary order becoming final. See section 67-5273, Idaho Code. The filing of an appeal to district court does not itself stay the effectiveness or enforcement of the order under appeal.

Dear Tammy:

We have reviewed the above-named water right application. The permit request is to divert 0.85 cfs from Ole Creek for stock water and to irrigate 41 acres of land. The purpose of these comments is to assist the decision-making authority by providing technical information addressing potential effects on wildlife and wildlife habitat and how any adverse effects might be mitigated.

Ole Creek is a small creek that drains approximately 1.3 square miles of land, approximately half of which is in the State of Washington. The average flow near the proposed diversion is approximately 1 cfs according to the USGS StreamStat Estimate for un-gaged sites in Idaho. Only 0.03 cfs will be used year round for stockwater, but during the irrigation season an additional 0.82 cfs will be used. If the entire amount is diverted from Ole Creek during average flows it will be over 75% of Ole Creeks flow, and have the potential to dewater a portion of the stream during dry months. No flow monitoring data exists to evaluate how the loss will potentially affect aquatic biota in this small tributary. The applicant runs the risk of totally dewatering a portion of the creek on low water years. We are concerned that the cumulative loss of flow from private diversions may negatively impact habitat availability for native species.

The applicants state that they plan to divert water from two locations along Ole Creek using a "water catch basin" along the creek, and pump water from the creek to pipes for irrigation. We recommend that a low maintenance diversions be installed for minimal disturbance in the creek channel. According to Idaho Code 36-906, a diversion must be properly screened in order to prevent fish entrainment. We recommend less than 0.25" mesh screen and approach velocity of less than 0.5 feet per second in order to protect juvenile fish from the proposed diversion and pump.



Tammy,

Please consider this email as comment from Idaho Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) regarding Water Right # 97-7583.

On August 27, 2019, DEQ performed a stream survey on Ole Creek at 48.309033, -117.010585. At that time, flow was estimated to be around 0.1 cubic feet per second (cfs); the crew characterized this as "low flow".

Ole Creek is presumed to have the cold water aquatic life beneficial use and should be protected. Given that Ole Creek is known to experience low flow conditions in late summer, all upstream waters likely also experience these conditions. DEQ recommends IDWR consider limiting water diversion from the unnamed creek during late summer months in order to maintain adequate flow and temperature, thus supporting the cold water aquatic life use.
