## **EXPLANATORY INFORMATION TO ACCOMPANY A PRELIMINARY ORDER**

(To be used in connection with actions when a hearing was **not** held)

(Required by Rule of Procedure 730.02)

The accompanying order or approved document is a "**Preliminary Order**" issued by the department pursuant to section 67-5243, Idaho Code. **It can and will become a final order without further action of the Department of Water Resources ("department") unless a party petitions for reconsideration, files an exception and brief, or requests a hearing as further described below:**

### **PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION**

Any party may file a petition for reconsideration of a preliminary order with the department within fourteen (14) days of the service date of this order. **Note: the petition must be received by the department within this fourteen (14) day period.** The department will act on a petition for reconsideration within twenty-one (21) days of its receipt, or the petition will be considered denied by operation of law. See Section 67-5243(3) Idaho Code.

### **EXCEPTIONS AND BRIEFS**

Within fourteen (14) days after: (a) the service date of a preliminary order, (b) the service date of a denial of a petition for reconsideration from this preliminary order, or (c) the failure within twenty-one (21) days to grant or deny a petition for reconsideration from this preliminary order, any party may in writing support or take exceptions to any part of a preliminary order and may file briefs in support of the party's position on any issue in the proceeding with the Director. Otherwise, this preliminary order will become a final order of the agency.

### **REQUEST FOR HEARING**

Unless a right to a hearing before the Department or the Water Resource Board is otherwise provided by statute, any person aggrieved by any final decision, determination, order or action of the Director of the Department and who has not previously been afforded an opportunity for a hearing on the matter may request a hearing pursuant to section 42-1701A(3), Idaho Code. A written petition contesting the action of the Director and requesting a hearing shall be filed within fifteen (15) days after receipt of the denial or conditional approval.

### **ORAL ARGUMENT**

If the Director grants a petition to review the preliminary order, the Director shall allow all parties an opportunity to file briefs in support of or taking exceptions to the preliminary order and may schedule oral argument in the matter before issuing a final order. If oral arguments are to be heard, the Director will within a reasonable time period notify each party of the place, date and hour for the argument of the case. Unless the Director orders otherwise, all oral arguments will be heard in Boise, Idaho.

## **CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE**

All exceptions, briefs, requests for oral argument and any other matters filed with the Director in connection with the preliminary order shall be served on all other parties to the proceedings in accordance with IDAPA Rules 37.01.01302 and 37.01.01303 (Rules of Procedure 302 and 303).

## **FINAL ORDER**

The Director will issue a final order within fifty-six (56) days of receipt of the written briefs, oral argument or response to briefs, whichever is later, unless waived by the parties or for good cause shown. The Director may remand the matter for further evidentiary hearings if further factual development of the record is necessary before issuing a final order. The department will serve a copy of the final order on all parties of record.

Section 67-5246(5), Idaho Code, provides as follows:

Unless a different date is stated in a final order, the order is effective fourteen (14) days after its service date if a party has not filed a petition for reconsideration. If a party has filed a petition for reconsideration with the agency head, the final order becomes effective when:

- (a) The petition for reconsideration is disposed of; or
- (b) The petition is deemed denied because the agency head did not dispose of the petition within twenty-one (21) days.

## **APPEAL OF FINAL ORDER TO DISTRICT COURT**

Pursuant to sections 67-5270 and 67-5272, Idaho Code, if this preliminary order becomes final, any party aggrieved by the final order or orders previously issued in this case may appeal the final order and all previously issued orders in this case to district court by filing a petition in the district court of the county in which:

- i. A hearing was held,
- ii. The final agency action was taken,
- iii. The party seeking review of the order resides, or
- iv. The real property or personal property that was the subject of the agency action is located.

The appeal must be filed within twenty-eight (28) days of this preliminary order becoming final. See section 67-5273, Idaho Code. The filing of an appeal to district court does not itself stay the effectiveness or enforcement of the order under appeal.

## NEW ADDRESS ASSIGNMENT

### SAVE THIS LETTER FOR FUTURE REFERENCE

Dear Resident:

In the interest of health and safety for the citizens of Bonner County, staff is in the process of updating the emergency response system to provide a Next Generation 9-1-1 system (NG-9-1-1). Next Generation 9-1-1 refers to an initiative aimed at updating the 9-1-1 service infrastructure in the United States to improve public emergency communications services in a growing wireless mobile society. In addition to calling 9-1-1 from a phone, it intends to enable the public to transmit text, images, video and data to the 9-1-1 center (referred to as a Public Safety Answering Point, or PSAP). The initiative also envisions additional types of emergency communications and data transfer. The Next Generation 9-1-1 system allows dispatchers and emergency response personnel to see the phone number, account name, physical address, and a map showing the physical location of the call. The system is effective on unlisted or unpublished phone numbers. This system will automatically identify the correct law, fire, and ambulance agencies to dispatch to that location the moment the call is made, saving precious time in an emergency.

All possible efforts have been made to reduce the need for readdressing. However, updating to the NG-9-1-1 system will require some residents to receive new addresses in a format compatible with the new system. This will ensure that the NG-9-1-1 system works effectively and provides residents, mail carriers, 9-1-1 dispatchers, and emergency response personnel with the best available location information.

The County is attempting to minimize the impact this address change will have on residents and businesses while at the same time comply with the NG-9-1-1 system for the health and safety of the citizens. **Your new address and additional details are provided on the reverse side of this letter.** We are working closely with local and regional post offices to ensure the transition will be conducted efficiently and accurately.

**For re-addresses:** You do not have to fill out a change-of-address card (Form 3575) at your local post office. The Postal Service will deliver mail to both your old and new address for up to 12-months from this notification. This should allow you sufficient time for notification of this new address to relatives and friends, and others (utility, phone, credit cards, etc). Following this 12-month period, all mail must have the correct new address.

You must post the address in full on your mailbox. Your home or business should also have your new numbers displayed. If a structure is not visible from the road, the numbers should be posted at the beginning of your driveway no more than six feet (6') above the ground and mounted on a support structure not exceeding the standards listed in Section 8 of the "Road Standards Manual" (Title 2, BCRC) published by the Bonner County Public Works Department. All primary letters, numbers, and symbols should be a minimum of three and one-half inches (3 ½") in height, with a one-half inch (1/2") stroke, and should contrast with the background color. This will greatly assist emergency services in locating your property.
