I have spoken with our administrative staff, and we have agreed to extend the time to provide the information requested in the September 17, 2019, Notice of Intent to Void (Notice) permit 63-10327. We have agreed to extend the time to provide the information requested in the Notice until April 30, 2019. No further extensions will be granted, and if we do not receive the information requested by that time, we will void the permit without any further notification from our office.

I also would like to re-iterate the history of this permit discussed in my earlier email. This permit was lapsed and was not considered to be a valid water right from January 6, 1994 until it was reinstated on July 29, 2006. Therefore, this was not active permit until it was reinstated in 2006. An attempt to resolve this the status of this permit was made by Idaho Department of Water Resources (Department) staff in April of 2013, and again with Ms. Skoro and myself this year. The Department has given your organization multiple opportunities to show us the spring that is diverting into this lake, but neither attempt has provided any evidence that there is a spring at this location. This could be why the original owners of the permit allowed this permit to lapse in 1994.

The conditions of this permit also require that a measurement device and lockable controlling works be permanently installed and maintained as part of the diversion works to allow the Watermaster of Basin 63 the ability to properly regulate this diversion. Therefore, if this spring has ever diverted water into the lake as stated in the permit, there should be a record of that diversion in the Basin 63 Water District records. We can find no records of water diverted into the lake in the Water District records, nor could we find any evidence of a spring from the two field exams performed by Department staff. We want to give water users every opportunity possible to show they have developed and are complying with the conditions of the water right permit, but in this case we cannot find any evidence that the water use was ever developed or that there is even a spring at this location.

As I stated in my earlier email, your water use from the lake is covered by water right 63-10326, so any water diverted directly from the lake is covered by that decreed water right. This permit is for a separate spring diverting into the lake. I would assume that the original "As Built" plans for this development should have shown the location of the spring and the structure used to divert it into the lake if it exists. If the original plans do not provide that information, then there is a possibility that the spring either dried up during the development or there really wasn't a spring at this location. If the spring dried up or doesn't exist, then we are required by law to void the permit.

I would also like to speak to you concerning the need to resolve this permit. The Snake River Basin Adjudication (SRBA) required that a majority of Department resources be allocated to bring this process to completion, which created a backlog of permits needing to be licensed. Permits to be licensed were not focused on during this time period, because the water user could continue to divert water authorized by the permit even if it wasn't licensed. Once the SRBA was completed, Department staff were then able to focus on the backlogs created by the SRBA process. The Department was given a directive in 2012 to reduce the number of permits needing licensed. In 2012, the Department had approximately 3,800 permits that needed licensing. Since that time, we have reduced the backlog of permits needing licensing to approximately 800 permits statewide. We are now at the point where we must focus on those permits that have been held for years and not acted upon. This is the reason that we are currently working to resolve this permit either through a license or by voiding the permit. I agree that this permit should have been resolved in 2006 when it was reinstated, but we simply didn't have the resources to complete the process at that time. I hope this helps you understand why it has taken so long to reach this point.

Dear Mr. Nelson – Since we spoke on the phone on September 20th, I have been spent a great deal of time studying the history of the "Spring Permit No 63-10237" matter and speaking with any and all resources with knowledge of the origination of the original permit request and approval by the Department of Water Resources in 1985.

In addition, we have been working with our Lake Management Vendor and staff to identify various scenarios around the location of the spring and where it might be channeled into the lake.

In my last meeting with the Board of Directors of the Lake Harbor Master Association, I was directed to continue pursuit of the location of the spring using necessary resources to ensure we exhaust all efforts in our search. The Board of Directors are quite perplexed with the urgency of intent to void this permit since it has been in place since 1985, and until your September 17, 2019 letter giving us 30 days to verify the location of the spring, very little concern or communication has been made, or request for information provided to them over the years.

On behalf of the Board of Directors, we have yet to receive verification of the impact of voiding this permit on the Master Association, Local Associations, Businesses and individuals who have since 1985 enjoyed the benefits of this permit. You have requested we "develop a beneficial use of the water under Permit 63-10327 from a spring that is

clearly identified on a map and the amount of water from that spring supplying the lake". This is not a simple task, and will require significant and complex technical support.

We are for instance, in the process of hiring a dive team to scour the bank of the lake for any signs of piping, or indications of spring activity, and continue to request from various sources what the impact voiding this permit will have on the various parties around the lake.

Therefore, I respectfully request a continuance of the deadline on this matter for 6 months to April 30, 2020. There is still much work to be done and communication with appropriate authorities to take place in order for the Board of Directors to render a reasonable and knowledgeable decision regarding this matter.

I am assisting Ms. Skoro with the processing of this permit, so she asked if I could respond to you inquiry. I was involved in the processing of the reinstatement of this permit in 2006, so I have a fairly good knowledge base of this permit. I feel that there may be a bit of confusion concerning the water rights associated with the lake known locally as Silver Lake. On October 4, 1985, The Idaho Department of Water Resources (Department) received two applications of permit from Jeffrey C. Fereday of law office of Givens, McDevitt, Pursley, Webb, and Buser. These two applications for permit were filed for ground water and an unnamed spring.

The ground water application permit was latter approved as a permit and licensed as water right 63-10326. 63-10326 diverted sallow ground water developed as the lake now known locally as Silver Lake, and the source was changed to an unnamed lake to allow the information to make more sense at the time. Water Right 63-10326 was licensed and decreed in the Snake River Basin adjudication, and is now considered a valid water right to store 1,030 af of water in what is known locally as Silver Lake and to use the water in this lake for irrigation of 22.6 acres. Water Right 63-10326 authorize the storage of water and irrigation from Silver Lake.

The spring application for permit was latter approved as a permit, but the permit was allowed to lapse. A request to reinstate the permit was received in 2006, and the permit was reinstated. In the reinstatement, there was a field examination performed by Sherl Chapman, a certified water right examiner. In Mr. Chapman's field report, he described the water as being diverted from Silver Lake and not from a spring. Therefore, Mr. Chapman's field exam was considered deficient. However, the Department moved forward with the reinstatement of the permit, and agreed to go out and perform the field examination for this permit. Rick Collingwood met with J. Steven Fender in 2013 to find the spring. Unfortunately, they were not able to find the spring and could not complete the field examination. Emily Skoro

and I met with your representative September 13, 2019. Mr. Chapman, Rick Collingwood, and our visit makes the third attempt to find and measure the spring diversion authorized by this permit.

From the information available to the Department at this time, it appears as though with the development of the lake and the surrounding area, the spring may have dried up or is piped to the lake through a French drain. In order to license permit 63-10327, we need to see the point where the spring is diverted and measure the amount of water being diverted to Silver Lake. If we cannot locate and measure the spring then the permit must be voided. The only way you can get a license for permit 63-10327 is to go over the original development plans and find the location of the spring, and show us where they are located and provide us access to measure the water being delivered from the spring to Silver Lake.

I hope this information helps you with understanding what we need to move forward with the licensing of this permit. The water for this permit originates in a spring, and not through the development of Silver Lake. Unfortunately, we need to move forward with the processing of this permit. I have enclosed a "Notice of Intent Void" letter we are mailing out today. In order to allow you additional time to address this issue, I have attached a copy of this letter to this email. Without a spring diverting into Silver Lake, we cannot issue a license for this permit.

Notice of Intent to Void Permit

RE: Water Appropriation Permit No. 63-10327

Ladies and Gentlemen:

The Department of Water Resources (Department) is reviewing the above referenced permit to determine if a license can be issued. In order for a permit to be licensed, the permit holder must show that a beneficial use has been developed in excess of existing water rights on the property.

This permit was originally filed for a spring. I have attached a map from the application for permit that shows the spring just south of Highway 44 (State Street) and in the northeast corner of the SW1/4SW1/4 of Section 29, Township 4 North, Range 2 East. I have also attached aerial imagery from 1980 and 2013 showing the same location. I have outlined the area where the spring should be located in the two aerial images with a yellow box.

On September 13, 2019, Emily Skoro and I visited the property to perform a field examination. During that examination, we were met by Orland Bradley, of Cutting Edge Landscape. Mr. Bradley was not aware of the location of the spring. He did describe the irrigation system out of the canal that is marked on aerial imagery with a green dot. Mr. Bradley walked around the lake with us to see if we could see any piping that could be associated with the spring. We were unable to find anything that could be attributed to the spring inlet into the lake.

This permit has underwent a long history to license the permit. Originally, two applications for permit were filed with the Department. The first application was for the development of Silver Lake from shallow ground water. The second application was filed for a spring that would divert into Silver Lake and be used to fill the lake and supply irrigation water. I have enclosed a copy of the initial letter sent by Jeffrey C. Fereday on October 4, 1985.

The application for shallow ground water was permitted and eventually licensed and decreed in the Snake River Basin Adjudication as water right 63-10326. The Department changed the source of permit 63-10326 to an unnamed lake, since there was already a small lake at the location at the time of approving the permit.

The second application was for a spring that would divert into the lake developed by 63-10326 to supply storage and irrigation uses from this spring. On January 6, 1994, a lapsed notice was sent to the owners of the permit stating that proof of beneficial use had not been submitted on this permit. On June 30, 2006, a request was made to reinstate the permit using the unsigned field report and proof of beneficial use form that supposedly was submitted by Sherl Chapman on December 30, 1993. An order was issued on July 28, 2006, reinstating the permit. The field report that was supposedly submitted by Sherl Chapman did not identify the location of the spring, provide any flow information from the spring, and it was not signed. Therefore, the field exam sent in with the 2006 request cannot be used to license this permit.

On November 25, 2013, Department staff met with J. Steven Fender, and again was unable to locate the spring. Staff suggested during correspondence setting up this field examination that you acquire the original development plats to find the actual location of the spring. Staff could not find the spring for this permit during that field examination.

The final step in the water appropriation process is the issuance of a Water Right License. By issuing a license, IDWR recognizes that you have met the requirements for establishing a water right. A water appropriation permit authorizes development of a water right within a specific time frame in excess of the water rights already used in the system. Without being able to locate and measure the spring, the Department cannot issue a water right license for this permit. The Department has made several attempts to work with your organization to locate and measure the spring discussed in the permit, but have not been able to find the spring or measure the water available from the spring.

Unless you supply information within thirty days or by October 17, 2019, demonstrating that you have developed a beneficial use of water under Permit 63-10327 from a spring that is clearly identified on a map and the amount of water from that spring supplying the lake, I will take action to void your permit. Any future field examination attempts from Department staff could be subject to additional field examination fees. If you are no longer interested in your permit, you can shorten the voiding process by signing and returning the enclosed relinquishment form.



Summary:

Dan Nelson and Emily Skoro conducted a water right field exam for water permit 63-10327 on September 13, 2019 at 10 am. Department staff met with Orland Bradley of Cutting Edge Landscaping, who irrigates the property. Mr. Brandley and Department staff walked around Area 1, Area 2, and Area 3 in search of the water permit point of diversion which is documented as a spring. Mr. Bradley and Department staff were unable to locate a spring or spring inlet into the lake.

After the failed field exam, the applicant was notified that the point of diversion could not be located. The Department requested that the applicant locate the spring and inform Department staff of the location.
