FOURTH OF JULY CREEK LLC, 533 MAIN ST., SALMON, ID 83467-4220 has filed Application No. 84146 for changes to the following water rights within LEMHI County(s): Right No(s): 75-14463; to see a full description of these rights and the proposed transfer, please see <https://research.idwr.idaho.gov/apps/waterrights/querynewtransfers>. The purpose of the transfer is to change a portion of the above rights as follows:

This transfer application proposes to add an additional point of diversion along Fourth of July Creek, tributary to the Lemhi River located approximately 2 miles NE of the intersection of 4th of July Creek Rd and Little 4th of July Creek Rd or approximately 0.24 miles NE from the confluence of Cottonwood Creek and Fourth of July Creek. The application also proposes to reconfigure the place of use for water right 75-14463 and be divided into separate parcels held by Fourth of July Creek, LLC.
