REFERENCE: TEMPORARY WATER RIGHT APPLICATION

IDFG has reviewed your draft application for a temporary permit to withdraw 0.044 AF per day, not to exceed a total withdrawal of 0.62 from the Clearwater River at Lenore for dust abatement. You have asked to withdraw up to 350 gpm, the daily volume not to exceed 0.044 AF and the total volume not to exceed 0.62 AF. You indicate that you wish to withdraw water July 1 and July 30, 2010.

IDFG does not anticipate that the requested withdrawal would have an adverse effect on fish, wildlife or stream habitat. We have no objection to the proposed withdrawals as long as all other required state and federal permits are secured. You have asked to pump up to 350 gpm. Because of this volume at the pump, it is important to note that your water intakes must be screened to prevent entrainment or impingement of fish and that screen approach velocities should not exceed 0.5 ft/second to prevent losses of juvenile fish. The maximum screen mesh size should be 0.25 inches.

Finally, we noted that your application indicated that you wish to back the pump truck onto the boat ramp at Lenore to obtain the water. IDFG owns and maintains the boat ramp at Lenore for fishing and other recreational access. Public use of the ramp must take precedence over your use of the ramp to obtain water. Please feel free to use the ramp for access, but immediately yield to anyone who wishes to use the ramp to launch water craft. Also, please ensure that your operations do not impede launching, trailer turning area or parking for recreational users.

We received your letter requesting our comments on the application for a temporary approval of water appropriation from the Clearwater River at the Lenore boat ramp. Assuming all federal, state and local permits have been obtained, regulations met, and reviews completed, we offer the following comments.

In the Idaho Water Quality Standards, the Clearwater River at this location is included in water body unit 17060306C13 and is protected for cold water and salmonid spawning aquatic life, primary contact recreation, drinking water supply, and special resource water designated beneficial uses. This section of the Clearwater River is currently listed in Section 5 of the Idaho 2008 Integrated Report as not supporting beneficial uses due to total dissolved gas. DEQ believes the Clearwater River flow at this location is significant enough that the beneficial uses should not be impacted by this temporary water appropriation.
