 4. This approval does not grant a right-of-way across the land of another, does not create a continuing right to use the water and may not be used in connection with a use which requires a continuing water supply.
 5. The department may cancel this approval at any time if the department identifies injury to other water rights.
 6. This approval expires on 11/1/2010.
 7. This approval does not create a continuing right to use water.
 8. The holder of this temporary permit shall not divert at a rate or in a manner that will significantly reduce the flow in the water source or otherwise adversely affect fish, wildlife or other public values.
 9. Other: Water intakes should be screened to prevent entrainment or impingement of fish or other aquatic life. The maximum screen mesh size should be 0.25 inches; approach velocities should not exceed 0.5 ft/second.
 10. Contact the DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES prior to diversion of water from streams.

RE: Application for Approval of Water Appropriation

IDFG has reviewed three draft applications for a water appropriations from the Idaho Dept of Water Resources. You wish to withdraw 0.1 cfs, total volume of 4 AF from Whiskey Creek; 0.1 cfs, total volume 5 AF from Orofino Creek; and 0.1 cfs, total volume 4 AF from Cow Creek. All withdrawals would be between June 15 and November 1, 2020. The water is to be used for dust control and asphalt plant operation.

IDFG does not believe the requested withdrawals will adversely impact fish, wildlife or habitat. IDFG has no objection to the requested withdrawals.

Please note, however, that we were initially concerned about the potential for the Whiskey Creek withdrawal to negatively impact trout in that stream by reducing naturally low summer flows. However, you informed us that your withdrawal would be from a pond or ponds situated on or near Whiskey Creek. Based on that information, we do not anticipate the proposed withdrawal will significantly reduce flows. Please inform us if that information is not correct.

We received a request for our comments from Mr. Chris Rehder, Seubert Excavators, Inc., on the approval of three applications for temporary rights to withdraw 200 gallons per minute or 4 acre-feet of water from Cow Creek, 4 acre-feet from Whiskey Creek, and 5 acre-feet from Orofino Creek, Clearwater County, between June 15 and November 1, 2010. The water is needed for road construction and dust abatement for the federal highway project to recondition the Grangemont Road, Clearwater County. Assuming all federal, state and local permits have been obtained, regulations met, and reviews completed, we offer the following comments.

In the Idaho Water Quality Standards, Cow Creek is included in water body ID 17060306CL039_02, and is currently listed in Section 2 of the Idaho 2008 Integrated Report as supporting most beneficial uses. In order to protect and maintain aquatic life beneficial uses, stream flow adequate to sustain existing aquatic life needs to be maintained (IDAPA 58.01.02.100.01). Based on our flow data, DEQ believes the flow in this section of Cow Creek may not be significant enough to protect and maintain optimum conditions for aquatic life during the requested withdrawal. DEQ would like to suggest an alternative location be considered where flow is adequate to protect beneficial uses while still allowing for the requested withdrawal.

In the Idaho Water Quality Standards, Whiskey Creek is included in water body ID 17060306CL040_03, and is currently listed in Section 5 of the Idaho 2008 Integrated Report as not supporting beneficial uses due to the combined biota and habitat bioassessment. In order to protect and maintain aquatic life beneficial uses, stream flow adequate to sustain existing aquatic life needs to be maintained (IDAPA 58.01.02.100.01). In order to protect aquatic life beneficial uses in Whiskey Creek, water should be withdrawn from an area within the creek where flow can be maintained at 1 cfs or greater while still allowing for the requested withdrawal.

In the Idaho Water Quality Standards, Orofino Creek is included in water body ID 17060306CL039_04 and is currently listed in Section 3 of the Idaho 2008 Integrated Report as not assessed.

DEQ believes the Orofino Creek flow in this section is significant enough that the beneficial uses should not be impacted by the temporary water appropriation.
