SUBJECT: Processing Recommendation

The enclosed Application for Permit, 47-08403, was filed by George C. Rathke - Rathke Trust in August of 1996. The application was advertised in October of 1996. The application proposes diverting surface water from a small stream along Magic Waters Road near the confluence of Salmon Falls Creek and the Snake River. The proposed use of the water is for miscellaneous domestic purposes (less than 13,000 gallons per day) for a home site located along Highway 30. The applicant proposed piping the water from the stream to his property.

Problems with the application arose because the applicant does not own the property where he proposes to divert the water or run his pipeline across (see Allen Merritt's 11/21/96 memo). The properties are owned by two different individuals. The application was advertised without protest, but the application was advertised with an incorrect legal description of the point of diversion.

The applicant was contacted several times (by letter and telephone) requesting that he obtain statements agreeing to the proposed application from the individuals who owned the property that he proposed diverting the water from and running his pipeline across. He provided a statement (copy in file) from one of the property owners allowing him to divert water, but the statement specified an amount of water far less than the amount applied for on the application. I contacted the landowner who signed the statement in order to verify that the amount on the statement was correct (not a typo) and he said that it was. The applicant never did provide a statement from the other property's owner.

I have attempted to contact the applicant several times in an attempt to get the issues resolved with this application, but the applicant has not responded to my requests and inquiries. On September 8th, 1997, I sent a letter to the applicant requesting a response and giving the applicant 30 days to respond before the application is processed with a recommendation for denial. As of this date, I have not heard from the applicant.

In my dealings with the applicant regarding this particular application, it appears to me that the applicant is not exactly sure what he wants to do. He changed his mind on the proposed use(s) for the water before the application was advertised. In addition, he appears unsure exactly where to divert the water and run his pipeline. It appears to me that the Department would be justified in processing the application and denying it (perhaps by preliminary order, or by an order to show cause) based on the application not being filed in good faith because it appears to have been filed for speculative purposes. In addition, the water source may not be sufficient for the proposed uses.

SUBJECT: Review and Recommendation

This application proposes to develop a small spring for Domestic ralated uses. On final review of the application I found that there is an apparent mistake in descibing the point of diversion. The application indicates there is only one P/D intended and the exact location is unclear. The application lists NW\{\frac{1}{3}\text{SW}\{\frac{1}{3}\text{SE}\{\frac{1}{3}}\} and the SW\{\frac{1}{3}\text{NW}\{\frac{1}{3}\text{NE}\{\frac{1}{3}}\}, Section 30, Twp.8S, Rge.14E, B.M. as the site of the point of diversion. Inspection of the map and the field review confirms that the SW\{\frac{1}{3}\text{NW}\{\frac{1}{3}\text{NE}\{\frac{1}{3}\}\} was intended to be the SW\{\frac{1}{3}\text{NW}\{\frac{1}{3}\text{SE}\{\frac{1}{3}\}\}. The application further indicates it is unknown as to ownership of the proposed point of diversion. On this day I visited the Twin Falls County Assessors office and found that in the area of the spring the ownerships are as follows:

From the center of the S½ of Section 30:

-The USA owns land to the West (SW¼)

-Robert Ring owns land to the Northeast (SW¼NW¼SE¼)

-Larry Olsen owns land to the Southeast (NW¼SW¼SE½)

I do not see the need to re-advertise the application at this time; but the applicant needs a statement from Ring and Olsen about agreement for access to spring. If he fails to gain agreement then the application should be amended and re-advertised allowing Ring specifically to protest. If agreement is gained the application still needs to be change to correct typo.

Recommend that Jim work with Rathke.

SUBJECT: Staff Review & Field Check

The enclosed application for permit, filed by George Rathke - Rathke Trust, seeks to divert surface water from an unnamed stream for domestic use(s) on property that Mr. Rathke owns. Mr. Rathke originally filed the application for irrigation and recreation use, but the next day, Mr. Rathke came in and changed his application. When Mr. Rathke came in to change his application, we discussed the water development plans for his property and based the changes on his proposed use(s).

Mr. Rathke plans on using the surface water for various uses in connection with a mobile home he is planning to install on his property along Highway 30. According to the Twin Falls County Assessor's office, Mr. Rathke's property is recorded as Parcel 2, Lot 14, Salmon River Ranches Subdivision. Mr. Rathke plans on using the water in a small swimming pool $(8' \times 16' \times 4')$, for a little bit of irrigation (less than ½ acre), and possibly for in house use (pending water quality results?). A well currently exists on Mr. Rathke's property that he also plans on using for the same uses listed above. This particular well is covered under water right L47-07520 and is appurtenant to Mr. Rathke's property. Based on my conversation with Mr. Rathke, the total proposed uses for both the well water (covered under L47-07520) and the surface water (proposed to be diverted upon possible approval of this application) would not exceed the domestic use definition of \$42-111, IDAHO CODE.

On September 11th, while in the area, I visited the property involved with Mr. Rathke's application. Based on my observations, other than the well mentioned above, there currently exists nothing remotely resembling water use on Mr. Rathke's property. In addition, there appears to be no water rights appurtenant to Mr. Rathke's property other than L47-07520. Therefore, there should be no overlap problems with the enclosed application.

During my visit, I observed that there is a small stream that "runs" down a channel along the northwest edge of the Magic Waters Road. The channel runs down to Highway 30, crosses in a culvert under the highway, and then enters Mr. Rathke's property. Mr. Rathke proposes to divert the water approximately 425 feet up the channel, along the Magic Waters Road, from Highway 30. He will then pipe the water down to his property through a pipeline that runs down the channel, under the highway through the culvert, and onto his property.

During my visit, water was present in the channel up to the general area where Mr. Rathke proposes to divert the water. However, lush growth (willows, russian olives, etc.) existed further up the channel indicating that additional water may be present in the channel earlier in the year. The Thousand Springs Quad Map (BB20) shows the channel draining a fairly large area with the upper channel reaches being intermittent and the lower channel reach being perennial and draining into Salmon Falls Creek.

The enclosed application should be pretty straightforward and there appears to be no problems with this application. If the application is approved, conditions limiting the use of this water to the limits of §42-111 should be implemented. In addition, limits should be implemented for combined use(s) with water right L47-07520.




