We have reviewed the above-named application by the Inland Empire 49er's Gold Club to temporarily extract 0.62 cfs from Potosi Creek for high bank mining purposes. The application describes the location as T49N, R4E, Sections 10, 11, 22, and 23.

Potosi Creek does not fall in Sections 22 and 23; therefore, these sections should be removed from the application.

Westslope cutthroat trout, which is an Idaho State Species of Special Concern, inhabit the North Fork of the Coeur d'Alene River and may be found in Beaver Creek. Additionally, macro-invertebrates and other aquatic species inhabit the stream bottom, which provides food, nursery habitat, and hiding places. High bank mining causes extensive erosion and water quality is a concern. Fine sediment created by the mining process can cover the bottom gravel with silt.

The application does not describe any measures that will be used to protect water quality and prevent turbid water from entering the stream. We strongly recommend that the applicant describe BMPs for this project prior to considering this permit application. Fuel, oil and other waste products should be stored upland and prevented from entering the stream channel.
