 - 6. This approval expires on <u>1</u> <u>0</u> 9.
 - 7. This approval does not create a continuing right to use water.
 - 8. The holder of this temporary permit shall not divert at a rate or in a manner that will significantly reduce the flow in the water source or otherwise adversely affect fish, wildlife or other public vaules.
- 9. Other: <u>Nater intakes should be screened to prevent entrainment or impingement of</u> fish or other aquatic life. The maximum screen mesh size should be 0.25 inches; approach velocities should not exceed 0.5 ft/second.

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

Idaho Department of Fish and Game has reviewed your draft application for a temporary permit to withdraw up to 0.3 cfs from Lochsa River from 4/1/09 to 10/31/09. The water will be used for various activities related to construction on US Highway 12. Water will be pumped from the Lochsa at the Knife Edge River access.

IDFG does not anticipate this withdrawal will have a significant effect on the flows of the Lochsa River at or below the proposed point of diversion, nor do we expect the withdrawal to adversely impact fish and wildlife or their associated habitat. As long as all other federal and state permits have been obtained, we do not object to your proposed withdrawal.

The Idaho Department of Water Resources (IDWR) is in receipt of Knife River's application to temporarily appropriate 5 acre feet of water from the Lochsa River for road construction purposes. The Lochsa River is located within the Salmon-Clearwater River Basins which are now considered sensitive water basins. Each application within this sensitive area must undergo close scrutiny to ensure the Department is not negatively impacting sensitive ESA (Endangered Species Act) species.

The IDWR has developed a process by which each application is reviewed. Idaho State Code requires "approval is in the public interest and a determination that the temporary approval will not injure the public values associated with the water source or any other water right". Therefore, the applicant must obtain written comments regarding their proposal from the Idaho Department of Fish & Game and the Idaho Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) to make sure the proposed use will not harm sensitive species or public values.

Enclosed is an information sheet which explains the process. For a temporary water appropriation application, you are only required to seek comments from Fish & Game and DEQ. When the applicant provides this information to the Department, IDWR's northern regional staff will continue with the processing of the application.

Dear Mr. Bennett:

We received a copy of your application to the Idaho Department of Water Resources for a Temporary Water Appropriation permit to draw 200 gallons per minute or maximum daily volume of 0.3 acre feet/total volume of 5.0 acre feet, from the Lochsa River at the Knife Edge River access point of diversion, Idaho County. In your application you state the proposed beneficial use of water is for "various construction activities" along U.S. Highway 12, from MP 90.70 to MP 113.80. The duration of diversion is from 4/1/09 to 10/31/09.

In the Idaho Water Quality Standards, the section of the Lochsa River at the proposed point of withdrawal is included in water body ID 17060303CL003_05. Water body ID 17060303CL003_05 is currently listed in Section 5 of the Idaho 2008 Integrated Report as not supporting beneficial uses due to temperature pollutants. The Lochsa River is protected for cold water and salmonid spawning aquatic life, primary contact recreation, drinking water supply, and special resource water beneficial uses.

DEQ believes the flow in the Lochsa River at the point of withdrawal is significant enough that the beneficial uses should not be impacted by the temporary water appropriations.
