

EXPLANATORY INFORMATION TO ACCOMPANY A PRELIMINARY ORDER

(To be used in connection with actions when a hearing was **not** held)

(Required by Rule of Procedure 730.02)

The accompanying order or approved document is a "Preliminary Order" issued by the department pursuant to section 67-5243, Idaho Code. It can and will become a final order without further action of the Department of Water Resources ("department") unless a party petitions for reconsideration, files an exception and brief, or requests a hearing as further described below:

PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION

Any party may file a petition for reconsideration of a preliminary order with the department within fourteen (14) days of the service date of this order. **Note: the petition must be <u>received</u> by the department within this fourteen (14) day period.** The department will act on a petition for reconsideration within twenty-one (21) days of its receipt, or the petition will be considered denied by operation of law. See Section 67-5243(3) Idaho Code.

EXCEPTIONS AND BRIEFS

Within fourteen (14) days after: (a) the service date of a preliminary order, (b) the service date of a denial of a petition for reconsideration from this preliminary order, or (c) the failure within twenty-one (21) days to grant or deny a petition for reconsideration from this preliminary order, any party may in writing support or take exceptions to any part of a preliminary order and may file briefs in support of the party's position on any issue in the proceeding with the Director. Otherwise, this preliminary order will become a final order of the agency.

REQUEST FOR HEARING

Unless a right to a hearing before the Department or the Water Resource Board is otherwise provided by statute, any person aggrieved by any final decision, determination, order or action of the Director of the Department and who has not previously been afforded an opportunity for a hearing on the matter may request a hearing pursuant to section 42-1701A(3), Idaho Code. A written petition contesting the action of the Director and requesting a hearing shall be filed within fifteen (15) days after receipt of the denial or conditional approval.

ORAL ARGUMENT

If the Director grants a petition to review the preliminary order, the Director shall allow all parties an opportunity to file briefs in support of or taking exceptions to the preliminary order and may schedule oral argument in the matter before issuing a final order. If oral arguments are to be heard, the Director will within a reasonable time period notify each party of the place, date and hour for the argument of the case. Unless the Director orders otherwise, all oral arguments will be heard in Boise, Idaho.

CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE

All exceptions, briefs, requests for oral argument and any other matters filed with the Director in connection with the preliminary order shall be served on all other parties to the proceedings in accordance with IDAPA Rules 37.01.01302 and 37.01.01303 (Rules of Procedure 302 and 303).

FINAL ORDER

The Director will issue a final order within fifty-six (56) days of receipt of the written briefs, oral argument or response to briefs, whichever is later, unless waived by the parties or for good cause shown. The Director may remand the matter for further evidentiary hearings if further factual development of the record is necessary before issuing a final order. The department will serve a copy of the final order on all parties of record.

Section 67-5246(5), Idaho Code, provides as follows:

Unless a different date is stated in a final order, the order is effective fourteen (14) days after its service date if a party has not filed a petition for reconsideration. If a party has filed a petition for reconsideration with the agency head, the final order becomes effective when:

(a) The petition for reconsideration is disposed of; or
 (b) The petition is deemed denied because the agency head did not dispose of the petition within twenty-one (21) days.

APPEAL OF FINAL ORDER TO DISTRICT COURT

Pursuant to sections 67-5270 and 67-5272, Idaho Code, if this preliminary order becomes final, any party aggrieved by the final order or orders previously issued in this case may appeal the final order and all previously issued orders in this case to district court by filing a petition in the district court of the county in which:

- i. A hearing was held,
- ii. The final agency action was taken,
- iii. The party seeking review of the order resides, or
- iv. The real property or personal property that was the subject of the agency action is located.

The appeal must be filed within twenty-eight (28) days of this preliminary order becoming final. See section 67-5273, Idaho Code. The filing of an appeal to district court does not itself stay the effectiveness or enforcement of the order under appeal.

Re: Review & Evaluation of Sufficiency of Information

Background:

Joel and/or Nancy Bender filed an Application for Transfer of Water Right – Point(s) of Diversion on October 16, 2019. This is one of four transfers that were submitted along with an application for permit. The four applications for transfer and the application for permit are part of the same project. The application and water right numbers are listed below.

A letter from Chris Gaughan, Project Planner for the Upper Salmon Basin Watershed Program (USBWP), accompanied the applications. Mr. Gaughan is not listed as a representative, but has been included in the correspondence with respect to these applications.

Purpose:

The application is for a change in the POD. All other elements of the water right would remain the same.

The applicants propose moving the point of diversion (POD) from the NWSE of Section 13, Township 24N, Range 19E approximately 0.75 miles upstream to the SWSE of Section 12, in the same Township and Range. All five applications that were submitted together propose the same POD.

Mr. Gaughan states in his letter that accompanied the applications that USBWP is assisting Trout Unlimited and the five landowners with an irrigation efficiency project. The change in location is an effort to gain elevation in order to enable gravity pressure to assist with delivery. If the new POD is approved for all of the applications, the project would close an unscreened ditch. The new POD would have an Idaho Fish & Game approved fish screen feeding a closed system pipeline.

Authority to File:

The Benders are the owners of record of water right 75-4409. County tax parcel data identify Joel Bender as the owner of the property containing the place of use (POU). Both Joel and Nancy signed the application. The required fee to transfer the entire 0.08 cfs was paid at the time of filing.

Vessey Fishing & Trading Company are the owners of the land at the proposed POD. A signed statement authorizing access to construct the new POD was submitted with the applications.

Water Right Validity:

The right was decreed in 2008. The decreed right authorizes the irrigation of the entire 3.5 acre parcel. Using available satellite imagery, I was unable to confirm where irrigation may have occurred during the previous five years.

On November 18, 2019 I sent a letter to the applicants requesting additional information to establish the use and validity of the water right. I received a phone call from the applicant, Nancy Bender, on January 14, 2020. The applicant said that they have tried to irrigate as often as they could, but the diverting works are not functioning well and the ditch is often dry. Trying to repair the existing system has been difficult. The applicant said that this application for transfer is intended to replace the ditch which loses almost all of the diverted water through conveyance losses with the proposed closed pipe system.

On March 31, 2020, in an email reply to my request for comments, Department staff supported the validity of the water rights, and the claims that the water right owners have been trying to make use of their rights.

Injury to Other Water Rights:

Between the existing and the proposed PODs, there is only one other POD along Indian Creek. The other POD is shared by the three existing water rights that are also requesting transfers as a part of this shared project. If the project is approved as planned, all four water rights would share the same POD. The place and nature of use would remain the same. Injury to other water rights is not expected.

Enlargement of Use:

The quantity of water diverted for this use is to remain the same. Enlargement is not a concern.

Local Public Interest:

There are no apparent issues with local public interest. The place of use for this transfer is within the Wild and Scenic Watershed of the Salmon River and is upstream of Minimum Streamflow water right 74-14119, however there should be no increase in diversion rate or acreage as a result of this transfer.

Comments were sought from the public through advertisement and requested from the watermaster for Water District 170 and from regional Department staff. On March 31, in an email reply to the request for comments, Department staff from Salmon (who is also the watermaster for Water District 170) requested that conditions for a measuring device be placed on each of the transfers (condition # 215). Individually the water rights do not exceed the 0.24 cfs threshold that would require a measuring device. The proposed transfers would place all four water rights on the same point of diversion. Collectively the combined diversion rate of the four water rights is 0.39 cfs, which would require a measuring device.

Beneficial Use/Conservation of Water Resources:

The water right was decreed in the Snake River adjudication, and the transfer would not change the authorized beneficial use. The transfer appears to be consistent with conservation of water resources in Idaho.

Effect on Economy the Local Area:

No adverse effects to the local economy are expected.

Effect on Agricultural Base of the Local Area:

Proposed changes are not expected to affect the local agricultural base.

Review of the application finds there is no clear inconsistency with criteria set forth in Section 42-222 Idaho Code preventing processing of this application.

Hello Cindy,

With respect to the transfers, I have received a response from each of the water right owners. With the responses from the owners and after discussing these validity questions with others in my section, I feel satisfied that we have addressed the question of validity in the review of the transfers. We should be able to move forward without requiring more than should be expected from the applicants. I have addressed the comments from the owners in my review memos, but I don't believe we scanned my review memos before advertising. Combined, the comments from the owners were similar to your description of the deteriorating diverting works. At least a couple of the owners included some photos of their irrigation systems which will add to the documentation that they have been trying to make use of their water.

Thank you for all of your comments and recommendations for conditions. It will be good to keep these applications moving forward.

Dave -

I recognize that IDWR must do an analysis of beneficial use related to all transfer applications. You have asked all four transfer applicants to submit evidence of ongoing irrigation. I am asking that you approach the issue of forfeiture or partial forfeiture very carefully. The reason this pipeline project is so attractive to the water users is because the existing ditch can no longer be maintained to carry sufficient water for irrigation of all the acres. The ditch and the point of diversion appear to be quite fragile and prone to washouts.

This is one of those defenses to forfeiture that appears to fall squarely within 42-223 (6), situations beyond the water user's control. These situations must be evaluated on a case by case basis, but there is a recent Supreme Court decision (see link below) which suggests that such evaluations be liberal, and that they not favor forfeiture especially when there is not an intent to abandon the water right(s).

In this scenario, water users are attempting to irrigate from Indian Creek, but there is simply not enough water coming down the ditch. The rights cannot be considered forfeited if there is not adequate supply. Both Mr Harrison and Mr Meadville described their efforts to spread a meager amount of water. The users are also attempting to maintain the ditch, but there is only so much they can do. Mr Meadville related to me that every time the ditch washes out, it is harder and harder to repair. There has been expressed desire to resume full beneficial use under these rights.

Measurement conditions:

Individually, each of these rights falls below the 0.24 cfs measurement threshhold of the suggested W&S conditions. However, the rights with a total combined diversion rate of 0.41 cfs will share a conveyance system and cumulatively exceed the threshhold. Measurement orders issued in WD170 require measurement of any system authorized to divert water for more than 5 acres of irrigation. I expect the future measurement order for Basin 75 to mirror existing orders. This system should be required to have a measuring device installed.

Please use Measurement Condition 215 on all irrigation rights.

The Shively domestic application is likely be excluded from future water districts but may be subject to administration by virtue of the shared diversion. A measurement condition is not necessary for this right.
