This is to certify that the department has examined this application for temporary approval to use water under the provisions of Section 42-202a, Idaho Code, and has determined that:

 4. This approval does not grant a right-of-way across the land of another, does not create a continuing right to use the water and may not be used in connection with a use which requires a continuing water supply.
 5. The department may cancel this approval at any time if the department identifies injury to other water rights.
 6. This approval expires on 7/31/07.
 7. This approval does not create a continuing right to use water.
 8. The holder of this temporary permit shall not divert at a rate or in a manner that will significantly reduce the flow in the water source or otherwise adversely affect fish, wildlife or other public values.
 9. Other: Water intakes should be screened to prevent entrainment or impingement of fish or other aquatic life. The maximum screen mesh size should be 0.25 inches; approach velocities should not exceed 0.5 ft/second.
 10. Contact the DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES prior to diversion of water from streams.

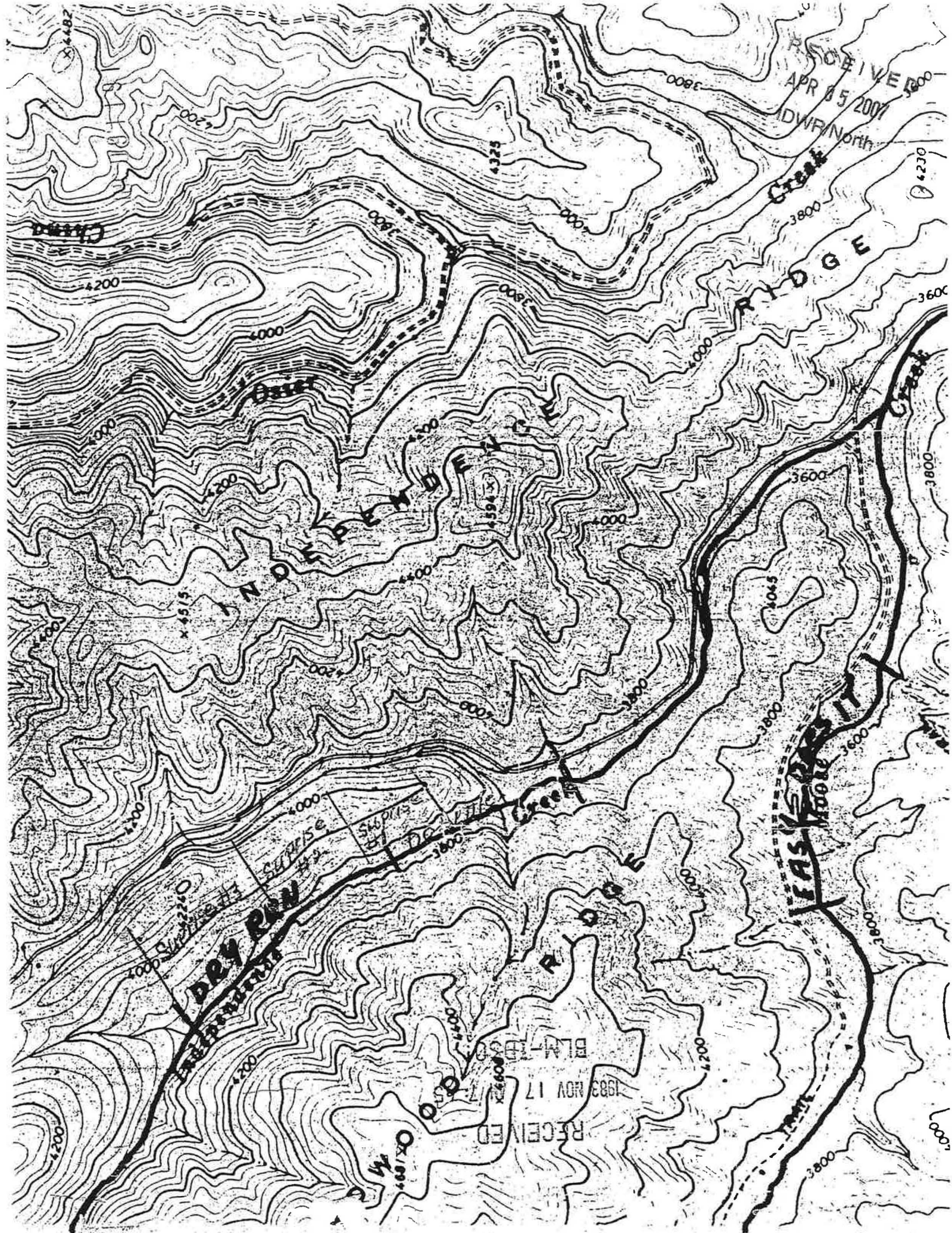

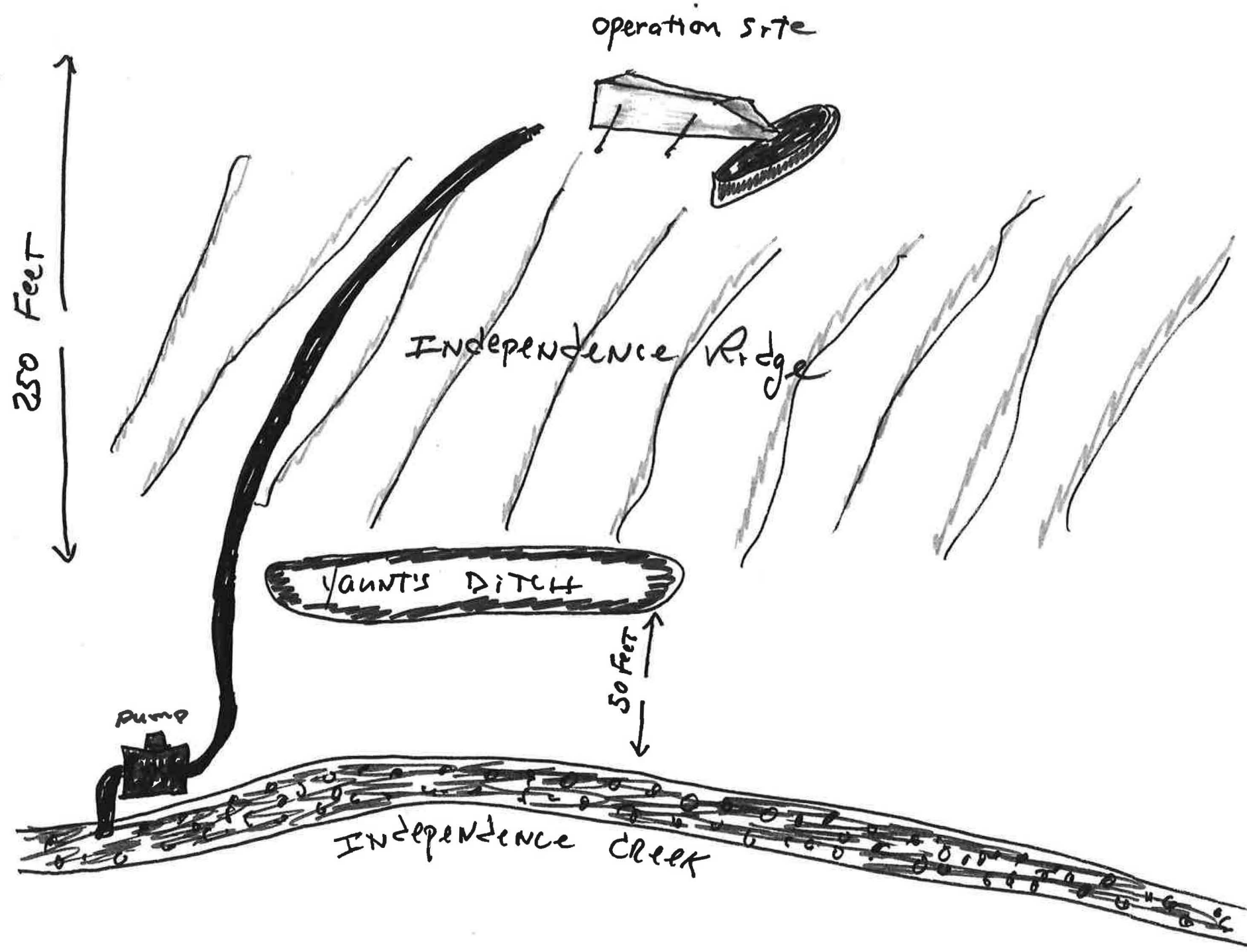

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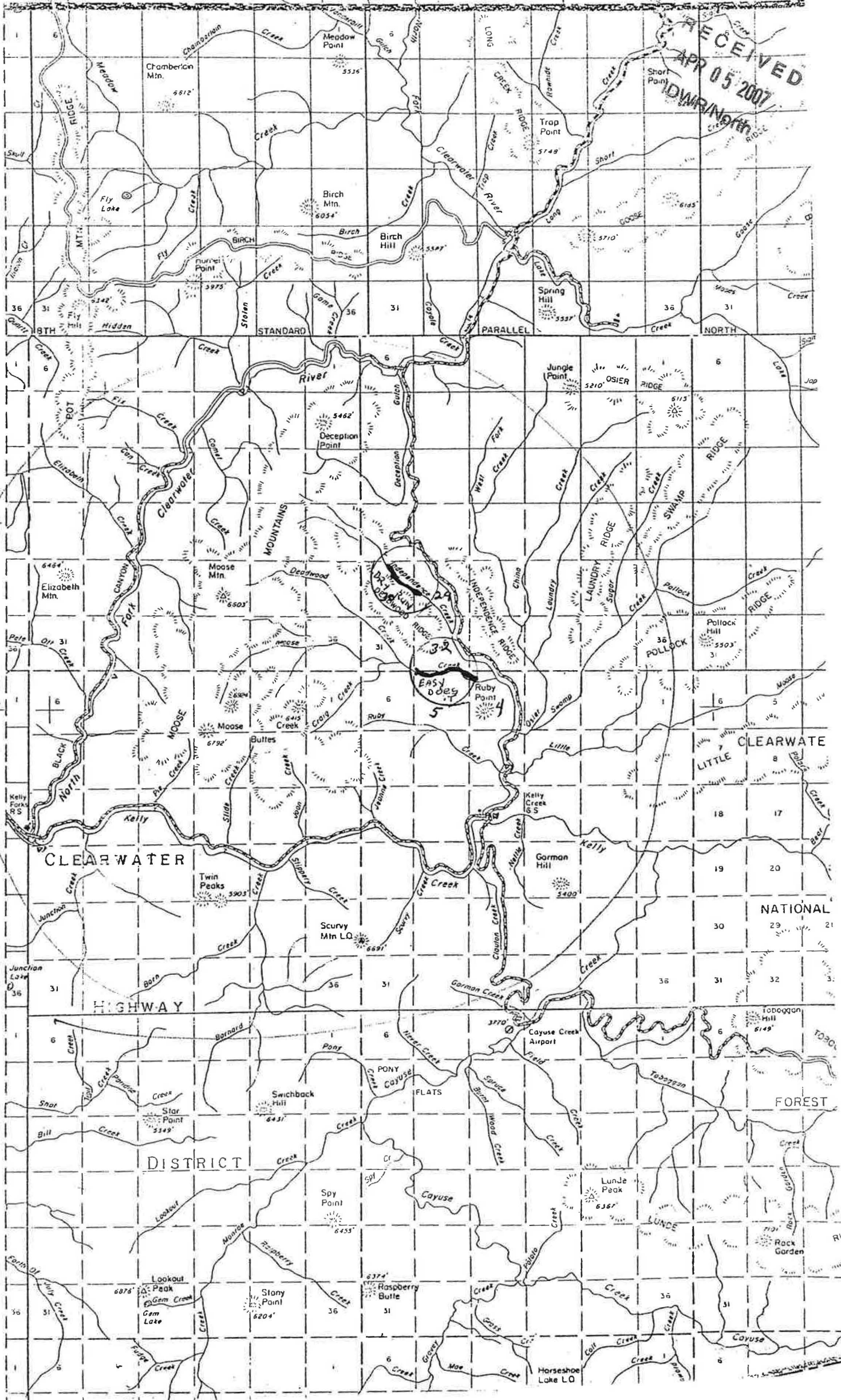

Explanation of water need:

I plan to prospect an area on Independence Ridge that borders my claim, The Dry Run. At one time, the area was part of the Yaunt's Sunrise Claim. The ridge is about 250 feet above my claim.

I use a self-contained system that draws water from a forty gallon tub, and circulates it through the ripple box back into the tub. The ripple box is just over two feet in length, using a small 1250 circulating pump.

My need is to replenish the water in the tub on half hour intervals. It will take five minutes of pumping time twice an hour from the creek up the 250 foot embankment to the work site. Used water will be released down the embankment to a large holding ditch. The ditch was a result of a Yaunt's mining operation. However, because of the gassy slope, the small amounts of water, and the interval between water release times, little or no water will be returned and held in the ditched area that is located about 50 feet from the creek. If any of the used water does return to the ditch, it would return to the creek through seepage.

The planned work time is four days between Monday, the 2nd of July and Friday, 13th of July. Total work time will be no longer than six hours a day, or a total of 24 working hours. I am requesting the use of 1440 gallons over a four day period.
