Conditions of Approval

- 1. Proof of application of water to beneficial use shall be submitted on or before September 01, 2025.
- 2. Subject to all prior water rights.
- 3. A fish screen of 3/32 inch or smaller mesh shall be installed and maintained at the point of diversion.
- 4. The approach velocity at the point of diversion shall not exceed 0.5 feet per second.
- 5. This right when combined with all other rights shall provide no more than 0.02 cfs per acre nor more than 3.0 afa per acre at the field headgate for irrigation of the place of use.
- 6. Prior to diversion of water under this right, the right holder shall install a lockable device, subject to the approval of the Department, in a manner that will provide suitable control of the diversion.
- 7. The right holder shall install or construct a straight length of conduit or ditch suitable for installation of a device for measuring the entire flow of water being diverted in connection with this right. If the right holder uses conduit, the straight length of conduit shall be at least fifteen times the diameter of the conduit and shall be above ground or otherwise easily accessible.
- 8. Upon specific notification by the Department, the right holder shall install and maintain acceptable measuring device(s), including data logger(s), at the authorized point(s) of diversion, in accordance with Department specifications.
- 9. When notified by the Department or by a watermaster with regulatory authority over this right, the right holder shall report the amount of water diverted in connection with this right. The report shall be submitted in the manner and frequency specified by the Department or the watermaster.

- 10. Water shall not be diverted under this right when flows in the Lochsa River are below minimum flow amounts as defined by Right 81-10513, nor when flows in Crooked Fork Creek are below the minimum flows allowed by Right 81-11938, nor when flows in Brushy Fork Creek are below the minimum flows allowed by Right 81-11934. The right holder shall be responsible for monitoring the daily flow of the Lochsa River using real-time data and shall cease diverting water when flows in the Lochsa River are below established minimum flow amounts. Unless otherwise specified by the Director of the Department of Water Resources, data from the U.S. Geological Survey Lowell gauging station, No. 13337000, may be used for purposes of determining the daily flow amounts.
- 11. This right does not grant any right-of-way or easement across the land of another.

This permit is issued pursuant to the provisions of Idaho Code § 42-204.





Dear Permit Holder(s):

The Department of Water Resources ("Department") has issued the enclosed permit authorizing you to establish a new water right. Please be sure to thoroughly review all the conditions of approval listed on your permit. The conditions include requirements that you must accomplish, such as timely submittal of proof of beneficial use or installation of a measuring device, as well as information about how your water use may be administered, such as regulation by a watermaster in a water district. Failure to comply with the conditions of approval may result in your permit lapsing or being canceled.

The permit is a PRELIMINARY ORDER issued pursuant to Rule 730 of the Department's Rules of Procedure (IDAPA 37.01.01.730). It can and will become a final order without further action by the Department unless a party petitions for reconsideration, files exceptions, or requests a hearing as described in the enclosed information sheet.

The Department will send you a *Proof Due Notice* approximately 60 days prior to the date listed in condition no. 1 of your permit.

You may also require approvals from other Department programs, such as Ground Water Protection, Safety of Dams, or Stream Channel Protection, to accomplish your proposed development. Please call or visit any Department office or see the Department's website at idwr.idaho.gov for more information about these programs.

Also, please note that permit holders are required to report any change of ownership and/or mailing address to the Department within 120 days of the change. Failure to report these changes could result in a \$100 late filing fee. Forms to assign ownership or update your address are available from any office of the Department or on the Department's website.

EXPLANATORY INFORMATION TO ACCOMPANY A PRELIMINARY ORDER

(To be used in connection with actions when a hearing was not held)

(Required by Rule of Procedure 730.02)

The accompanying order or approved document is a "Preliminary Order" issued by the department pursuant to section 67-5243, Idaho Code. It can and will become a final order without further action of the Department of Water Resources ("department") unless a party petitions for reconsideration, files an exception and brief, or requests a hearing as further described below:

PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION

Any party may file a petition for reconsideration of a preliminary order with the department within fourteen (14) days of the service date of this order. Note: the petition must be <u>received</u> by the department within this fourteen (14) day period. The department will act on a petition for reconsideration within twenty-one (21) days of its receipt, or the petition will be considered denied by operation of law. See Section 67-5243(3) Idaho Code.

EXCEPTIONS AND BRIEFS

Within fourteen (14) days after: (a) the service date of a preliminary order, (b) the service date of a denial of a petition for reconsideration from this preliminary order, or (c) the failure within twenty-one (21) days to grant or deny a petition for reconsideration from this preliminary order, any party may in writing support or take exceptions to any part of a preliminary order and may file briefs in support of the party's position on any issue in the proceeding with the Director. Otherwise, this preliminary order will become a final order of the agency.

REQUEST FOR HEARING

Unless a right to a hearing before the Department or the Water Resource Board is otherwise provided by statute, any person aggrieved by any final decision, determination, order or action of the Director of the Department and who has not previously been afforded an opportunity for a hearing on the matter may request a hearing pursuant to section 42-1701A(3), Idaho Code. A written petition contesting the action of the Director and requesting a hearing shall be filed within fifteen (15) days after receipt of the denial or conditional approval.

ORAL ARGUMENT

If the Director grants a petition to review the preliminary order, the Director shall allow all parties an opportunity to file briefs in support of or taking exceptions to the preliminary order and may schedule oral argument in the matter before issuing a final order. If oral arguments are to be heard, the Director will within a reasonable time period notify each party of the place, date and hour for the argument of the case. Unless the Director orders otherwise, all oral arguments will be heard in Boise, Idaho.

CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE

All exceptions, briefs, requests for oral argument and any other matters filed with the Director in connection with the preliminary order shall be served on all other parties to the proceedings in accordance with IDAPA Rules 37.01.01302 and 37.01.01303 (Rules of Procedure 302 and 303).

FINAL ORDER

The Director will issue a final order within fifty-six (56) days of receipt of the written briefs, oral argument or response to briefs, whichever is later, unless waived by the parties or for good cause shown. The Director may remand the matter for further evidentiary hearings if further factual development of the record is necessary before issuing a final order. The department will serve a copy of the final order on all parties of record.

Section 67-5246(5), Idaho Code, provides as follows:

Unless a different date is stated in a final order, the order is effective fourteen (14) days after its service date if a party has not filed a petition for reconsideration. If a party has filed a petition for reconsideration with the agency head, the final order becomes effective when:

- (a) The petition for reconsideration is disposed of; or
- (b) The petition is deemed denied because the agency head did not dispose of the petition within twenty-one (21) days.

APPEAL OF FINAL ORDER TO DISTRICT COURT

Pursuant to sections 67-5270 and 67-5272, Idaho Code, if this preliminary order becomes final, any party aggrieved by the final order or orders previously issued in this case may appeal the final order and all previously issued orders in this case to district court by filing a petition in the district court of the county in which:

- i. A hearing was held,
- ii. The final agency action was taken,
- iii. The party seeking review of the order resides, or
- iv. The real property or personal property that was the subject of the agency action is located.

The appeal must be filed within twenty-eight (28) days of this preliminary order becoming final. See section 67-5273, Idaho Code. The filing of an appeal to district court does not itself stay the effectiveness or enforcement of the order under appeal.

Water Supply Information

Water supply from Brushy Fork Creek, which is a tributary of Crooked Fork Creek, should be available at the applicant's property. Future use amounts for the Lochsa River allow for withdrawals of up to 40 cfs and the irrigation of 500 acres. The withdrawals for this application has been entered into the accounting system and does not exceed those limitations. Minimum stream flow to protect Water Right(s) 81-11934 (Brushy Fork Creek MSF) and 81-11938 (Crooked Fork Creek MSF) will be added to the Lochsa River MSF condition listed below. A minimum stream flow condition will be added to this permit to protect Water Right 81-10513 (Lochsa River MSF), with U.S. Geological Survey Lowell gauging station identified for monitoring MSF.

Good Faith, Delay, or Speculative Information

The applicant plans to divert water for his/her own use on property that he/she owns and there are no know issues with any other party.

Financial Resources Information

No significant resources are anticipated for the proposed irrigation.

Local Public Interest

The Idaho Department of Fish & Game (IDFG), Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), and the Idaho Water Resource Board have been asked for comments on the proposed projects. The Idaho Water Resource Board did not respond; IDFG responded that pump intake should use 3/32" mesh screen and approach velocities at intake should not exceed 0.5 feet per second. DEQ responded that the proposed withdrawals should not be allowed to dry up the Creek.

Injury to Other Water Rights

None anticipated.

Recommendation

The Northern Region recommends proceeding with the processing of this water right application.

DEQ has received a request for comment on the approval of a water right application to withdraw 0.42 cubic feet per second from Brushy Fork Creek, a tributary to Crooked Fork Creek. The applicant will be using the withdrawal for irrigation. The source is located at Township 37N, Range 15E, and Section 5 in Idaho County. The time period requested for the withdrawal is 04/15 through 10/31.

Assuming all federal, state, and local permits have been obtained, regulations met, and reviews completed, we offer the following comments. The water source is in assessment unit ID17060303CL035_04. This assessment unit is not designated but is assumed to support cold water aquatic life and secondary contact recreation and is listed in Category 3 of Idaho's 2016 Integrated Report as not assessed.

At no time should the stream be allowed to go dry as a result of legally appropriated and allowable water withdrawals. DEQ recommends that withdrawals be made during high flows or when flow is greater than 1 cubic foot per second.
