

Other water sources are not readily available. 3. The approval is in the public interest. 4. The approval will not injure known public values associated with the water source or any known water rights. This application is therefore hereby: _ A. DENIED B. APPROVED, subject to the following conditions: 1. Diversion and use of water under this approval is subject to all valid existing water rights. 2. The applicant assumes all risk the use of the water under this approval may injure other water rights. 3. This approval authorizes a maximum diversion of 5.0 AF and a maximum rate of diversion of 0.78 cfs. 4. This approval does not grant a right-of-way across the land of another, does not create a continuing right to use the water and may not be used in connection with a use which requires a continuing water supply. 5. The department may cancel this approval at any time if the department identifies injury to other water rights. 6. This approval does not create a continuing right to use water. 7. The holder of this temporary permit shall not divert at a rate or in a manner that will significantly reduce the flow in the water source or otherwise adversely affect fish, wildlife or other public values.  of invasive aquatic species prior to use. If equipment involved with transporting water
 has been moved into Idaho from another state (Particularly from NV, CO, UT, AZ, CA or
 TX) contact ISDA for an inspection. We recommend contacting ISDA (Amy Ferriter @
 208-332-8686) for treatment recommendations.

RE: Application for Temporary Approval of Water Appropriation

Application proposes the diversion of a volume up to 0.106 af per day, with a maximum total diversion of 5 af for road building and dust control in the northern portion of Power County from 1/1/2015 to 12/31/2015. Proposed point of diversion is on the Rock Creek in the NENW1/4 of Sec. 15, Twp 9S, Rge 30E. The majority of the water will be utilized in April and May for the application of mag-chloride on gravel roads. Watermaster for Water District 41, James Robinson, stated has no concerns regarding the diversion of the water prior to his having to make priority cuts, but stated he typically has to make cuts starting around Memorial day (depending on water availability) and that he will let the Highway District know if they need cease diverting water. I also spoke with Dave Teuscher, Regional Manager for Idaho Fish and Game at the Pocatello Regional Office, and he has no concerns with the proposed appropriation as long as the diversion is screened and equipment is treated/sterilized to prevent the spread of invasive aquatic species.
