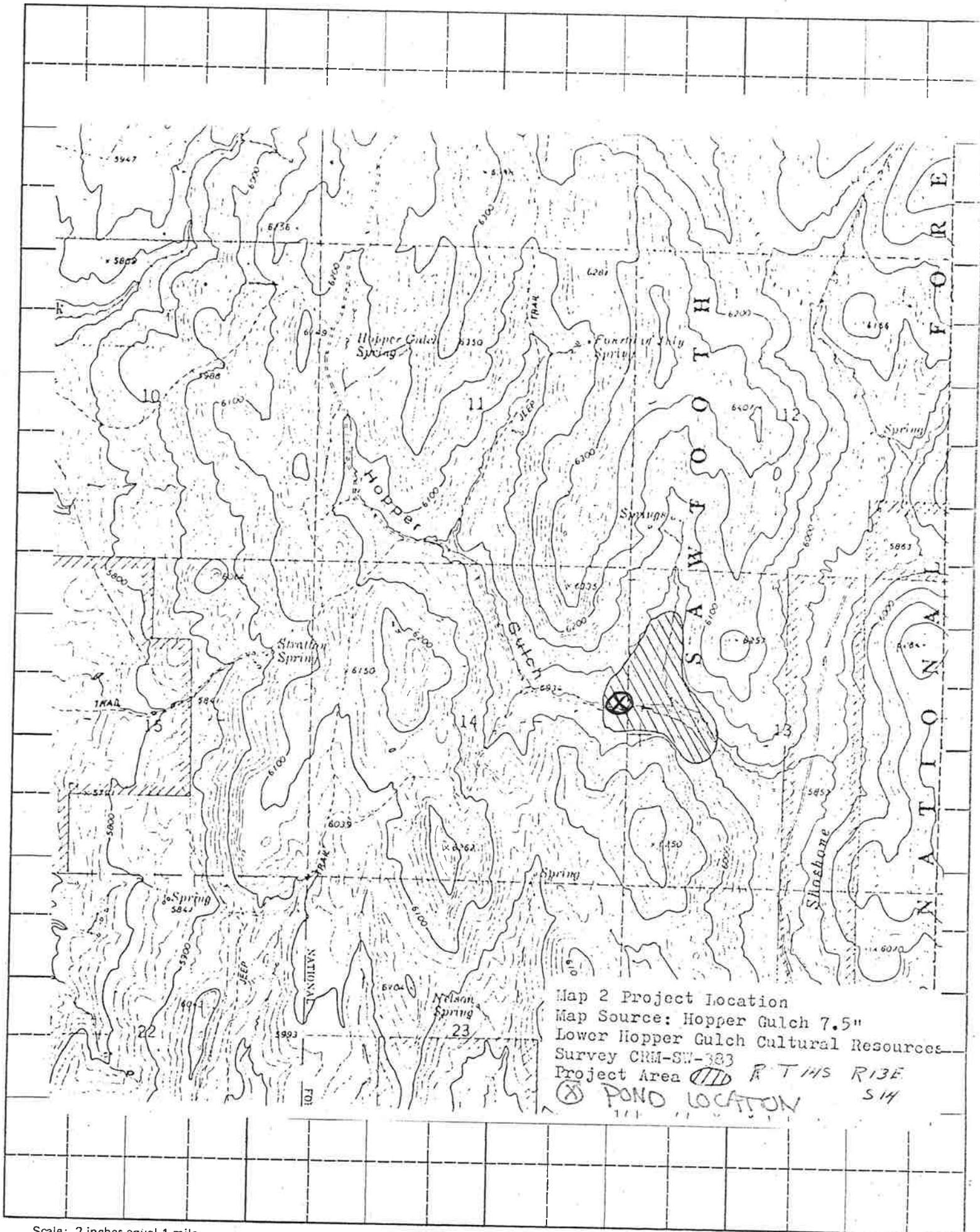

ACTION OF THE DIRECTOR, DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES

This is to certify that I have examined Application for Permit to appropriate the public waters of the State of Idaho No. 47-7939, and said application is hereby APPROVED.

1. Approval of said application is subject to the following limitations and conditions:

a. SUBJECT TO ALL PRIOR WATER RIGHTS.

b. Proof of construction of works and application of water to beneficial use shall be submitted on or before October 1, 19 85.

c. The rate of diversion, if water is to be used for irrigation under this permit, when combined with all other water rights for the same land shall not exceed 0.02 cubic feet per second for each acre of land.

d. Other: A lockable device, subject to the approval of the Department, shall be installed on the diverting works in a manner that will provide the watermaster suitable control of the diversion.

Use of water under this permit is subject to control by the watermaster of State Water District No. 47C, Cedar, Devil & Deadwood Creeks.
