RE: Application for Temporary Approval of Water Appropriation



Application proposes the diversion of 0.167 cfs or 75 gallons per minute, with a maximum daily volume of 0.02 acre feet with a total volume of 1.077 acre feet. Diverted water will be used to irrigate an area of 0.32 acres (0.12 acres in the NENE of Sec. 25, Twp 01S, Rge 19E and 0.2 acres in the SESE of Sec. 24 Twp 01S, Rge 19E) where the Nature Conservancy has established vegetative plantings used for wetland habitat creation. Point of diversion will utilize a gas powered irrigation pump on the northwest side of Kilpatrick Bridge (NWNENE of Sec. 25, Twp 01S, Rge 19E) and water will be delivered to the place of use using an aluminum hand line. Watermaster for Water District 37, Kevin Lakey, stated he has no concerns regarding the diversion of the water. Recommend conditioning this permit with standard Fish and Game screening requirements.
