

DEQ has received a request for comment regarding two applications to temporarily appropriate a total of 0.006 acre feet of water from Leggett Creek and Moose Creek, tributaries to the South Fork Clearwater River, for drilling purposes. Assuming all federal, state and local permits have been obtained, regulations met, and reviews completed, we offer the following comments.

Leggett Creek is included in water body ID # 17060305CL075_02 and is protected for cold water aquatic life, salmonid spawning and secondary contact recreation beneficial uses. Moose Creek is included in water body ID # 17060305CL030_02 and is protected for cold water aquatic life, salmonid spawning and primary contact recreation beneficial uses. Leggett Creek and Moose Creek are listed in Category 4a of the Idaho 2012 Integrated Report as not supporting the cold water aquatic life and salmonid spawning beneficial uses due to temperature impairment. Flow in Leggett Creek and Moose Creek must be significant enough that the maximum rate of diversion of 10 gallons per minute, total volume .0030 acre feet from both Leggett and Moose Creek from July 14 to July 31 will not impact water quality, and stream flow adequate to sustain existing aquatic life will be maintained at all times.

Subject: ITD temporary water right applications

Adam -- IDFG has reviewed two separate applications from Idaho Dept of Transportation to withdraw water from Leggett Creek and Moose Creek. The appropriations would be the same: screened pumping of 10 gpm, with a maximum daily appropriation of 0.0015 AF, and a total appropriation 0.003 AF. Water would be withdrawn between July 14 and July 31. Based on the minor amount of water requested, IDFG does not anticipate impacts to fish or habitat.

We suggest, however, that coffer dams around intakes should not be necessary to protect emerging fry and may, in fact, prove more disruptive than necessary. Most fry should have emerged by July 15, especially with this year's unseasonably high temperatures and early low-flow conditions. Therefore, we believe the screening suggested in the application should provide adequate protection against entrainment of fry without the added disturbance of installing and removing coffer dams.
