

3. This approval authorizes a maximum diversion of 5.0 AF and a maximum rate of diversion of 100 cfs (gpm)
4. This approval does not grant a right-of-way across the land of another, does not create a continuing right to use the water and may not be used in connection with a use which requires a continuing water supply.
5. The department may cancel this approval at any time if the department identifies injury to other water rights.
6. This approval expires on August 1, 2014.
7. This approval does not create a continuing right to use water.
8. The holder of this temporary permit shall not divert at a rate or in a manner that will significantly reduce the flow in the water source or otherwise adversely affect fish, wildlife or other public values. At no time shall this diversion exceed 25% of the total creek flow.
9. ¼ inch mesh screen shall be installed on the pump intake
10. Direct discharge of waste water/slurry into rivers, creeks, or streams is not authorized.
11. The water use approved herein is subject to and shall conform to the terms of the Forest Service approved Plan of Operations and/or required authorizations for this location.
12. This approval is subject to the availability of Boise River Rental Pool water to mitigate water losses and injury to existing river water rights. This authorization will require the rental of 5.0 acre foot of water from the Boise River Rental Pool, (2 acre foot minimum). *Contact: Rex Barrie, Boise River Watermaster, phone 208-908-5480.*
13. The Department reserves the right to cancel this appropriation due to water quality degradation or lack of sufficient water flow for downstream water rights and public values relating to Elk Creek and tributaries.


Our ore deposits are normally 50 feet to over 300 feet from the stream. The organic and overburden materials are removed. The gravels and water that go through the highbanker are temporarily stored in a natural swale and then returned to the test hole, the overburden and organics are replaced, and area is seeded with Granite Seed Company certified weed free grass seed.

None of the water we use flows back to the stream, but soaks back into the ground water.

Our State Exploratory Leases in this area are L600099, L600100, L600101 and L600102.

We are bonded and approved through the Idaho dept. of Lands.


Your application for Temporary Approval of Water Appropriation has been granted.

Please be advised, this permit is subject to the effective dates and conditions stated on page 2 of the application. I would draw your attention to condition #6 in which the approval expires on August 1, 2014. Water sufficiency for senior water rights along with associated public values must be protected during summer-fall low flows. Elk Creek is the primary water source for Idaho City.

Also, note condition #12 which requires the purchase of storage water from the Boise River Rental pool to mitigate injury to downstream water right holders below Lucky Peak.
