

EXPLANATORY INFORMATION TO ACCOMPANY A PRELIMINARY ORDER

(To be used in connection with actions when a hearing was **not** held)

(Required by Rule of Procedure 730.02)

The accompanying order or approved document is a "Preliminary Order" issued by the department pursuant to section 67-5243, Idaho Code. It can and will become a final order without further action of the Department of Water Resources ("department") unless a party petitions for reconsideration, files an exception and brief, or requests a hearing as further described below:

PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION

Any party may file a petition for reconsideration of a preliminary order with the department within fourteen (14) days of the service date of this order. Note: the petition must be <u>received</u> by the department within this fourteen (14) day period. The department will act on a petition for reconsideration within twenty-one (21) days of its receipt, or the petition will be considered denied by operation of law. See Section 67-5243(3) Idaho Code.

EXCEPTIONS AND BRIEFS

Within fourteen (14) days after: (a) the service date of a preliminary order, (b) the service date of a denial of a petition for reconsideration from this preliminary order, or (c) the failure within twenty-one (21) days to grant or deny a petition for reconsideration from this preliminary order, any party may in writing support or take exceptions to any part of a preliminary order and may file briefs in support of the party's position on any issue in the proceeding with the Director. Otherwise, this preliminary order will become a final order of the agency.

REQUEST FOR HEARING

Unless a right to a hearing before the Department or the Water Resource Board is otherwise provided by statute, any person aggrieved by any final decision, determination, order or action of the Director of the Department and who has not previously been afforded an opportunity for a hearing on the matter may request a hearing pursuant to section 42-1701A(3), Idaho Code. A written petition contesting the action of the Director and requesting a hearing shall be filed within fifteen (15) days after receipt of the denial or conditional approval.

ORAL ARGUMENT

If the Director grants a petition to review the preliminary order, the Director shall allow all parties an opportunity to file briefs in support of or taking exceptions to the preliminary order and may schedule oral argument in the matter before issuing a final order. If oral arguments are to be heard, the Director will within a reasonable time period notify each party of the place, date and hour for the argument of the case. Unless the Director orders otherwise, all oral arguments will be heard in Boise, Idaho.

CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE

All exceptions, briefs, requests for oral argument and any other matters filed with the Director in connection with the preliminary order shall be served on all other parties to the proceedings in accordance with IDAPA Rules 37.01.01302 and 37.01.01303 (Rules of Procedure 302 and 303).

FINAL ORDER

The Director will issue a final order within fifty-six (56) days of receipt of the written briefs, oral argument or response to briefs, whichever is later, unless waived by the parties or for good cause shown. The Director may remand the matter for further evidentiary hearings if further factual development of the record is necessary before issuing a final order. The department will serve a copy of the final order on all parties of record.

Section 67-5246(5), Idaho Code, provides as follows:

Unless a different date is stated in a final order, the order is effective fourteen (14) days after its service date if a party has not filed a petition for reconsideration. If a party has filed a petition for reconsideration with the agency head, the final order becomes effective when:

- (a) The petition for reconsideration is disposed of; or
- (b) The petition is deemed denied because the agency head did not dispose of the petition within twenty-one (21) days.

APPEAL OF FINAL ORDER TO DISTRICT COURT

Pursuant to sections 67-5270 and 67-5272, Idaho Code, if this preliminary order becomes final, any party aggrieved by the final order or orders previously issued in this case may appeal the final order and all previously issued orders in this case to district court by filing a petition in the district court of the county in which:

- i. A hearing was held,
- ii. The final agency action was taken,
- iii. The party seeking review of the order resides, or
- iv. The real property or personal property that was the subject of the agency action is located.

The appeal must be filed within twenty-eight (28) days of this preliminary order becoming final. See section 67-5273, Idaho Code. The filing of an appeal to district court does not itself stay the effectiveness or enforcement of the order under appeal.

The transfer application received on 4/19/2019 in the name of Idaho Forest Group LLC did not have a change in nature of use historic consumptive volume. The applicant submitted information related to the history of the site and how the change occurred in 1970. Because there is no ET data from that far back, current values will be used off of the University of Idaho ETIDAHO site. The station used is Bonners Ferry and the crop is grass hay as it was mentioned in the backfile that the irrigation was for pasture. The precipitation deficit for that crop was 518 mm which when converted into feet is 1.7 AF/Acre (518 X .0032808). You then multiple that by the 20 acres of irrigation which is equal to 34 acre-feet (1.7 AF/Acre X 20 Acres). The transfer will be approved with a diversion rate of 0.4 cfs with an annual volume for Industrial of 34.0 acre-feet.

The system is turned on when the temperature exceeds 70 degrees for three consecutive days. When the system operating, it runs from sunup to sundown. Thus, in the early spring the system operates for approximately 10 hours per day. The hours the system operates gradually increases until reaching the maximum of 17 daylight hours in August and then system operation gradually decreases until it is turned off in late summer early fall when the temperature falls below 70 degrees.


A schematic of the log yard diversion system is shown on the attached flow chart. Water is pumped from the cistern by a Model30SPM70 pump at 180 gpm (.4cfs). The limiting factor for the length of operation of the cistern pump is controlled by the amount of water produced by Moyie Spring. The spring flow is highly variable, but on average produces approximately 15-20 gpm. The spring water is captured in an 8x8x2 reservoir. The water flows from the reservoir into the cistern and is pumped to a 20,000-gallon storage tank.

Water is pumped from the storage tank to a one zone sprinkler line by a Model 15HM03N40T6PBQE pump at 130 gpm and applied under the guidelines described in paragraph 1 above. In order to avoid over saturation of the ground, which impairs operation of large equipment through creation of ruts, the length of time logs are watered is carefully monitored. Once the logs are wet, the sprinkler line is turned off until the logs begin to dry out from evaporation.


A float in the storage tank turns the yard pump off when the remaining volume in the storage tank reaches 5,000 gallons. Once the tank is refilled by the cistern pump, the yard pump and sprinkler line are reactivated. The amount of time it takes to refill the tank varies depending upon the rate of spring flow. The number of times during day the tank refills also varies depending upon how many times the sprinkler line is operated during the day.

Like a typical irrigation water right, log watering follows a bell shaped curve starting off with a lower daily diversion volume in the spring, gradually increasing to a peak daily diversion volume in the hot summer months and then gradually reducing until the system is turned off in late summer or early fall.
