

ACTION OF THE DIRECTOR, DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES

This is to certify that the department has examined this application for temporary approval to use water under the provisions of Section 42-202A, Idaho Code, and has determined that: A. The application for temporary approval should be denied. B. The application for temporary approval should be approved, since 1. The temporary approval can be properly administered. Other water sources are not readily available. The approval is in the public interest. The approval will not injure known public values associated with the water source or any known water rights. This application is therefore hereby: A. DENIED APPROVED, subject to the following conditions: 1. Diversion and use of water under this approval is subject to all valid existing water rights. The applicant assumes all risk the use of the water under this approval may injure other water rights. This approval authorizes a maximum diversion of 5.0 AF and a maximum rate of diversion of 0.78 cfs. This approval does not grant a right-of-way across the land of another, does not create a continuing right to use the water and may not be used in connection with a use which requires a continuing water supply. The department may cancel this approval at any time if the department identifies injury to other water rights. This approval does not create a continuing right to use water. The holder of this temporary permit shall not divert at a rate or in a manner that will significantly reduce the flow in the water source or otherwise adversely affect fish, wildlife or other public vaules. Temporary Water Permits

I spoke by phone with Jerome Hanson from the Idaho Department of Fish and Game regional office in Jerome. After consultation with other biologists in his office, he said that the Highway District's applications would be agreeable to IDFG as long the inlets of the pump hoses were screened to as small a size as was possible without excessive plugging. He said that, if possible, IDFG would like to see the inlets placed in off-channel sites, but they realized that this may not be possible.

Watermaster comments on Power County Highway District Temporary Water Permits

I spoke by phone today with James Robinson, watermaster for Water District 41, regarding three applications for Temporary Water Permits by the Power County Highway District in the Rockland area. I gave him the legal descriptions of the PODs and the details of the applications. He said that if the spring weather is normal, the permits shouldn't be a problem during the months of April and May. He was concerned that if the spring and summer are hot and dry, and he has to administer the water rights on the creek, that there potentially could be a shortage of water later in the summer, and, in that case, there would not be enough water to allow the Highway District to continue pumping out of the creek.
