RENTAL AGREEMENT CONDITIONS OF ACCEPTANCE

- 1. The use of water under this agreement shall be subject to the provisions of Idaho Code § 42-1766.
- Rental of the specified right from the bank does not, in itself, confirm the validity of the right or any elements
 of the water right, or improve the status of the right including the notion of resumption of use. It does not
 preclude the opportunity for review of the validity of this water right in any other department application
 process.
- 3. Use of water under this agreement does not constitute a dedication of the water to renter's place of use, and upon expiration of this agreement, the points of diversion and place of use of the water shall revert to those authorized under the water right and/or again be available to rent from the bank.
- 4. Use of water under this agreement shall not prejudice any action of the Department in its consideration of an application for transfer or permit filed by the applicant for this same use.
- 5. Renter agrees to comply with all applicable state and federal laws while using water under this agreement.
- 6. Renter agrees to hold the Board, the Director and the state of Idaho harmless from all liability on account of negligent acts of the renter while using water.
- 7. Renter acknowledges and agrees that the Director may terminate authorization for the use of a water right based on a water right's priority date.
- 8. Failure of the renter to comply with the conditions of this agreement is cause for the Director to rescind approval of the rental agreement.
- 9. This right when combined with all other rights shall provide no more than 0.02 cfs per acre nor more than 4.0 afa per acre at the field headgate for irrigation of the place of use.
- 10. Rights 36-16458 and 36-16460 when combined for the purposes of this rental agreement shall not exceed a total diversion rate of 0.25 cfs.




- 11. Rights 45-11969 and1-10443 when combined for the purposes of this rental agreement shall not exceed a total diversion rate of 1.29 cfs, a total annual maximum diversion volume of 258 af at the field headgate, and the irrigation of 64.6 acres.
- 12. Use of water under this rental, when combined with water rights 45-4084 and 45-4236, as well as rental agreement 215, is limited to a maximum diversion rate of 1.34 cfs and a maximum diversion volume of 519 af, for the irrigation of 348 acres.
- 13. Use of water under this right may be regulated by a watermaster with responsibility for the distribution of water among appropriators within a water district. At the time of this approval, this water right is within State Water District 45F and 01.
- 14. Prior to diversion of water under this rental agreement, the renter shall install and maintain a measuring device and lockable controlling works of a type acceptable to the Department as part of the diverting works.
- 15. This rental does not authorize the construction of a well.



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



Adam, Nathan,

In light of the curtailment of water right 45-2746, George Kelley has requested to cancel rental agreement 168, and replace it with a new rental. Attached are my review memo, map and draft approval document for Mr. Kelley for 2020.

Based on the existence of water rights 45-4084 and 45-4236, and a possible irrigation of up to 70.5 acres under rental agreement 215, this rental is for an approval to irrigate an additional 220.5 acres. Because WMIS data from last year indicated Mr. Kelley irrigated as many as 348 acres with 314 af of water, an equivalent per-acre diversion volume of 0.9 afa/ac was used to establish a maximum diversion volume of 199 af under this rental. I also added a condition to this rental to affirm that overall irrigation use by Mr, Kelley under this rental, along with water rights 4084/4236 and rental agreement 215, is limited to no more than 4.09 cfs and 607.8 af for the irrigation of 348 acres.

We are almost ready to send out the new rental agreement for signature by the Kelleys. Our Water Rights Section recommended that we reissue an amended version of rental agreement 215 for the Kelleys to sign, to acknowledge that it will now authorize irrigation of 70.5 acres, not 45.2 acres, as is presently stated on the face of the agreement.

One final follow up with you: we've drafted both the new, and the amended rental agreement, to reflect a volume limit of 314 af, which is what the Kelleys diverted last year. The application you

submitted to us did not request a specific diversion volume for their new 2020 rental, so we've assumed the Kelleys will divert 314 af this year, similar to what they did last year. This will equate to a per-acre diversion volume of 0.9 afa/ac. In 2018, it appears they diverted 280 af, and their four year average diversion volume is 360.8 af. Please let us know immediately if the Kelleys are likely to require a diversion volume larger than 314 af or 0.9 afa/ac for their irrigation purposes in 2020.

Please know, because the rental application did not request any diversion volume and a diversion rate of only 0.01 cfs, we have based our diversion rate and rental volume for the 2020 rental based on the per-acre diversion rate and volumes actually realized by the Kelleys in 2019 (0.009 cfs/ac and 0.9 afa/ac).

Re: Water Supply Bank Request for an Irrigation Rental Authorization for George Kelley

Purpose/Narrative: On May 19th, 2020, IDWR received from George Kelley, a request to cancel rental agreement 168 and an application for a new rental agreement for 2020, to replace rental agreement 168. The applications were submitted on Mr. Kelley's behalf by Jonas Reagan, the applicant's legal representative.

Mr. Kelley irrigates three center-pivot fields, approximately 346~348 acres in size, located on property owned by him, at a location approximately one mile northwest of Albion. A sum total of 243.5 acres were requested to be irrigated by the applicant, through rental application 1736. However, the map provided by the applicant indicates irrigation of as many as 348.0 acres might be intended on the applicant's property. The difference between the IDWR's 346.0 acre irrigation observation and the applicant's 348.0 acre irrigation request are outlined in the table below, and this rental will be specific to 348 acres requested by the applicant, as follows:

Mr. Kelley is authorized to irrigate 57.0 acres with ground water diverted under water rights 45-4084 and 45-4236. These two water rights are located within a 1,350.6 acre permissible place of use (PPU). A review of 2019 satellite imagery indicates as many as 346~348 acres may have been irrigated during 2019 (though not all acres were irrigated simultaneously). On average, it appears approximately 209 acres were irrigated monthly, and as few as 141 acres, and as many as 260 acres may have been irrigated during different months of the year. Water Management Information System (WMIS) data for 2019 indicates approximately 313.8 af was diverted, which equates to approximately 0.9 afa/ac for the entire farm. See Appendix A of this memo for imagery and diversion volume data associated with observed irrigation during 2019.

In addition to his two water rights, Mr. Kelley was authorized to irrigate additional acres under approved rental agreements 168 and 215.

Rental agreement 215 authorizes irrigation of up to 45.2 acres at a per-acre diversion volume of 4.0 afa/ac. The basis for the irrigation authorization under agreement 215 is a rental of water rights 45-13998 and 45-14000. These two rights authorize a diversions and use of ground water for commercial and stockwater (dairy) purposes, though they originate from parent irrigation water rights 45-7047A and 45-7221A. Transfer 72692 converted parts of the irrigation consumptive use for portions of water rights 45-7047A and 7221A, to stock and commercial water uses for 45-13998 and 14000. Prior to Transfer 72692, the portions of water rights 13998 and 14000 converted to stock/commercial use authorized the irrigation of 70.5 acres. As such, although rental agreement 215 was established to authorize irrigation of 45.2 acres, irrigation use under agreement 215 could be increased up to 70.5 acres, without causing enlargement in the rented water rights.

Rental agreement 168 was based solely on a rental of water right 45-2746, which became subject to curtailment due on May 13, 2020 (IDWR CM-DC-2011-004 "Rangen" Curtailment Order for Water Rights 36-2551 and 36-7694). In light of the curtailment of water use under rental agreement 168, Mr. Kelley has opted to cancel rental agreement 168, and to replace it with a new rental agreement, which is the subject of this review memo.

Subtracting 57.0 acres (under water rights 45-4084 and 4236) and 45.2 acres (under rental agreement 215) from 346 acres observed irrigated during 2019 leaves a remaining balance of 243.8 acres that would need to be covered by a rental. This 243.8 acre sum is almost exactly what the applicant requested on rental application 1736 and it is assumed that this is how the applicant calculated their 2020 irrigation acre needs.

A review of Water Management Information System (WMIS) data indicates the Kelleys have diverted between 280 and 458 af in recent years. On June 4, 2020, the Kelleys confirmed they desired a diversion volume of 334 af for this year.

Water right backfile information indicates that the ground water pump in the well proposed for this rental is limited to a maximum diversion rate of 1.34 cfs. Based on the minimum, average and maximum number of acres observed as irrigated monthly during 2019, it is assumed that the per-acre diversion rates for irrigation in 2020 might be as high as 0.01 cfs/ac (1.34 cfs / 141 ac) or as low as 0.005 cfs/ac (1.34 cfs / 260 ac), with an average monthly diversion rate of 0.006 cfs/ac (1.34 cfs / 209 ac). As such, irrigation by Mr. Kelley of 348 acres, at a maximum diversion rate of 1.34 cfs and a maximum diversion volume of 334 af, would require a rental authorization of 0.20 cfs, 106.0 af and 291 acres, to augment water rights 45-4084 and 4236 as follows:

Based on a maximum diversion rate of 1.34 cfs, and a maximum per-acre diversion rate and volume of 0.01 cfs/ac and 1.0 afa/ac, it is reasonable for rental agreement 215 to authorize up to 70.5 acres of irrigation, as the diversion rate and volume rented on agreement 215 still exceeds the low irrigation uses of Mr. Kelley (and an amended rental agreement 215 will be issued to the Kelleys with this rental approval). Accordingly, a new rental agreement for irrigation of additional 220.5 acres can be authorized through a rental of water rights 36-4179, 36-16458/16460, 45-13998/14000 and 45-11969, as follows:

Authority to File: The point of diversion and place of use for this rental are located on lands owned by the applicant. No concerns about authority to file.

Water Right Validity/Forfeiture Evaluation: The water rights proposed to be rented are validated and validated are validated and validated are validated are validated as a validated are validated are validated as a validated are validated are validated as a validated are v

Injury Evaluation: Mr. Kelley's rental proposes a diversion of ground water from an aquifer that is tributary to the Snake River and Eastern Snake River Plain Aquifer (ESPA). As such, it is possible to rent ESPA water rights to him. The ESPA transfer tool was used to model the impact of transferring the above listed water right volumes to Mr. Kelley's rental location. Because a significant volume of water is rented, but actual



diversion volumes under the rental are assumed to remain low, at 86 af, no injury to the Snake River is envisioned through this rental.

Enlargement of Use: Because ground water right 45-11969 is combined with 1-10443, a portion of 1-10443 will also be rented on this agreement, however it will provide no additional rate, volume, or irrigable acres. Water right 36-4179 is a fully consumptive industrial water right, and the full rate and volume can be applied to this rental for irrigation purposes.

A total of 1.915 cfs, 881.4 af and 220.5 acres are being rented from water rights 36-4179, 45-11969/1-10443 and 36-16458/36-16460. Rental agreement 215 and the applicant's water rights (45-4084/4236) already authorize a diversion of 2.18 cfs and 408.8 af for the irrigation of up to 127.5 acres. In keeping with a maximum per-acre diversion rate of 0.01 cfs/ac and a maximum per acre diversion volume of 0.9 afa/ac, to avoid enlargement in water use, this rental will be limited to a diversion rate of 1.915 cfs and 199 af for the irrigation of 220.5 acres.

Local Public Interest: Staff have no information to suggest this rental is contrary to local public interests.

Beneficial Use/Conservation of Water Resources: Irrigation is a beneficial use. The low duty of water associated with this rental is conducive to a conservation of ground water resources.

Because the low duty of water proposed to be used for irrigation in association with this rental allows for increased irrigation under rented water rights 45-13998 and 45-14000 without inducing enlargement, an additional 25.3 acres can be irrigated under rental agreement 215 on the southern field, leaving a balance of 52.5 acres of the southern field that will be authorized for irrigation specifically under this rental. The 119.0 acre central field will be authorized for irrigation under this rental, along with 49.0 acres of the northern field. The remaining 57.0 acres that will be irrigated on the northern field will be authorized under the applicant's water rights.

The 220.5 acres being irrigated specifically under this rental are delineated in blue in the image to the right while the 45.2 and 25.3 irrigable acres authorized under rental agreement 215 are delineated in green and yellow, respectively.


Department/Watermaster Comments: Watermaster and IDWR southern regional office comments were requested on May 22, 2020


Water Supply Bank Evaluation: A rental fee of \$17,628.00 was calculated for this agreement, based on a rental of 881.4 af of water. In recognition that a rental payment of \$15,628 was already receipted from the applicant for a 2020 irrigation under rental agreement 168 (Receipt ID C108290), the balance of payment owed for this rental is calculated to be: \$2,000.

Bank staff recommend the approval of this application for a single year.


