



Dear Interested Party:

The accompanying order is a "final order" issued by the department pursuant to section 67-5246 or 67-5247, Idaho Code.

Section 67-5246 provides as follows:

- (1) If the presiding officer is the agency head, the presiding officer shall issue a final order.
- (2) If the presiding officer issued a recommended order, the agency head shall issue a final order following review of that recommended order.
- (3) If the presiding officer issued a preliminary order, that order becomes a final order unless it is reviewed as required in section 67-5245, Idaho Code. If the preliminary order is reviewed, the agency head shall issue a final order.
- (4) Unless otherwise provided by statute or rule, any party may file a petition for reconsideration of any order issued by the agency head within fourteen (14) days of the issuance of that order. The agency head shall issue a written order disposing of the petition. The petition is deemed denied if the agency head does not dispose of it within twenty-one (21) days after the filing of the petition.
- (5) Unless a different date is stated in a final order, the order is effective fourteen (14) days after its issuance if a party has not filed a petition for reconsideration. If a party has filed a petition for reconsideration with the agency head, the final order becomes effective when:
 - (a) the petition for reconsideration is disposed of; or
 - (b) the petition is deemed denied because the agency head did not dispose of the petition within twenty-one (21) days.

Final Order - Page 1

- (6) A party may not be required to comply with a final order unless the party has been served with or has actual knowledge of the order. If the order is mailed to the last known address of a party, the service is deemed to be sufficient.
- (7) A nonparty shall not be required to comply with a final order unless the agency has made the order available for public inspection or the nonparty has actual knowledge of the order.
- (8) The provisions of this section do not preclude an agency from taking immediate action to protect the public interest in accordance with the provisions of section 67-5247, Idaho Code.

PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION

Any party may file a petition for reconsideration of a final order within fourteen (14) days of the service date of this order. The department will act on a petition for reconsideration within twenty-one (21) days of its receipt, or the petition will be considered denied by operation of law. See section 67-5243(4) Idaho Code.

APPEAL OF FINAL ORDER TO DISTRICT COURT

Pursuant to sections 67-5270 and 67-5272, Idaho Code, any party aggrieved by a final order or orders previously issued in a matter before the department may appeal the final order and all previously issued orders in the matter to district court by filing a petition in the district court of the county in which:

- i. A hearing was held,
- ii. The final agency action was taken,
- iii. The party seeking review of the order resides, or
- iv. The real property or personal property that was the subject of the agency action is located.

The appeal must be filed within twenty-eight (28) days a) of the service date of the final order, b) of an order denying petition for reconsideration, or c) the failure within twenty-one (21) days to grant or deny a petition for reconsideration, whichever is later. See section 67-5273, Idaho Code. The filing of an appeal to district court does not in itself stay the effectiveness or enforcement of the order under appeal.

FINAL ORDER

On December 8, 1993, the department issued a Recommended Order in connection with Application for Permit No. 36-08570A in the name of Plateau Trust (applicant). On April 22, 1994, the applicant submitted a Petition for Reconsideration of the Recommended Order (petition). On May 5, 1994, protestant Fish and Game filed a response to the petition. On May 11, 1994, the hearing officer denied the petition for reconsideration.

Based on his understanding of the law, the Director of the Department of Water Resources (Department) makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, Analysis and Final Order:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. On December 12, 1990, the applicant submitted Application for Permit No. 36-08570 to the Department proposing to appropriate 10.5 cubic feet per second (cfs) of water from Bickel Springs to be used year-round for power generation, fish propagation, wildlife and recreation. The application has been divided into part "A" which includes power generation, wildlife and recreation use and part "B" which includes the fish propagation use. This order relates only to Application for Permit No. 36-08570A.
- 2. The Department advertised the application which was protested by the following parties:

3. On November 23, 1993, the Department conducted a hearing in connection with the application. The applicant was represented

by Robert Brailsford. Protestant Idaho Department of Fish and Game (Fish and Game) was present and was represented by Steven Goddard. Protestant Hagerman Valley Citizens Alert was represented by Ned Swisher. Protestants Alice Wilson, Petrena Thompson, Barbara McLeod, and Wynarda Exon were also present but did not actively participate in the hearing.

- 4. Issues identified by the protestants include the following:
 - a. That the application was not made in good faith, but for delay and speculative purposes.
 - b. That the applicant does not have sufficient financial resources with which to complete the project.
 - c. That the application will conflict with the local public interest.
- 5. Exhibits accepted as part of the hearing record were the following:

- 6. The applicant owns and uses a pipeline which has the capacity to divert approximately 10.5 cfs of water from Bickel Springs and convey the water across the Snake River to land of the applicant.
- 7. The applicant filed Snake River Basin Adjudication (SRBA) claim no. 36-04260B for the diversion of 10.5 cfs of water for stockwater, domestic and for the irrigation of 164 acres of land. The Department's recommendation of the claim, however, was that only 4.98 cfs of the 10.5 cfs is beneficially used. The Department's recommendation is of a right to the diversion and use of the 4.5 cfs of water from March 15 to November 15 of each year for irrigation purposes and 0.48 cfs year-round for stockwater and domestic purposes. The applicant has filed an objection to the Department's recommendation regarding the SRBA claim.
- 8. The applicant states that due to the reduced rate of diversion recommended for SRBA claim no. 36-04260B he may have to install a sprinkler system for the land which is presently flood irrigated in order to obtain the same crop production. The land is sandy loam and quite porous. If the applicant installs a sprinkler irrigation system, the applicant proposes to use the power generated, if this application is approved, to operate the pump which will pressurize the sprinkler system. The applicant has not described or identified the intended use of the power produced during the non-irrigation season.
- 9. The plans of the proposed hydroelectric facility are schematic in nature, are not prepared to scale and do not show conduit sizes, elevations, dimensions, capacities, the amount of power to be generated or other specific features. The schematics were not prepared by an engineer and specifications were not provided by the applicant.
- 10. The applicant has not applied to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) or to the Idaho Public Utilities Commission (IPUC) for any needed approvals associated with the proposed hydroelectric use.
- 11. The land of the applicant is adjacent to the Snake River and is close to a substantial natural wildlife habitat and wetland area.
- 12. The plans of the proposed ten (10) ponds associated with the wildlife use are also schematic in nature, are not prepared to scale and do not show ditch sizes, elevations, dimensions of the ponds, capacities, or other specific features.
- 13. The proposed recreational use shown on the application is for hunting.
- 14. The proposed ponds and the ditches connecting them would lose substantial water due to seepage.

15. Protestant Fish and Game contends that the discharge of water directly from Bickel Springs to the wetland area below the springs adjacent to the Snake River constitutes a better use of the water for wildlife habitat than to pipe Bickel Springs across the Snake River for wildlife habitat use in man made ponds.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Section 42-203A, Idaho Code, provides in part as follows:

In all applications whether protested or not protested where the proposed use is such (a) that it will reduce the quantity of water under existing water rights, or (b) that the water supply is insufficient for the purpose for which it is sought (C) where it appears to appropriated, or satisfaction of the director that such application is not made in good faith, is made for delay or speculative purposes, or (d) that the applicant has not sufficient financial resources with which to complete the work involved therein, or (e) that it will conflict with the local public interest, where the local public interest is defined as the affairs of the people in the area directly affected by the proposed use, or (f) that it is contrary to conservation of water resources within the state of Idaho; the director of the department of water resources may reject such application and refuse issuance of a permit therefor ...

- 2. In Shokal v. Dunn, 109 Idaho 330 (1985), the Idaho Supreme Court provided that "the plans should be sufficient to generally apprise the public of the efficacy of the proposed use in the planned facility, and of its potential impact." The court also stated that the Director of the Department has the "affirmative duty to assess and protect the public interest" (emphasis added) and that public interest criteria to be considered by the Department includes fish and wildlife habitat, aquatic life, recreation, aesthetic beauty, transportation, navigation and water quality.
- 3. Water Appropriation Rule IDAPA 37.03.08040.04.b.i. provides as follows:

The applicant shall bear the initial burden of coming forward with evidence for the evaluation of criteria (a) through (d) of Section 42-203A(5), Idaho Code;

4. Water Appropriation Rule IDAPA 37.03.08040.04.b.ii. provides as follows:

The applicant shall bear the initial burden of coming forward with evidence for the evaluation of criterion (e) of Section 42-203A, Idaho Code, as to any factor affecting local public interest of which he is knowledgeable or reasonably can be expected to be knowledgeable. The protestant shall bear the

initial burden of coming forward with evidence for those factors relevant to criterion (e) of Section 42-203A(5), Idaho Code, of which the protestant can reasonably be expected to be more cognizant than the applicant.

5. Water Appropriation Rule IDAPA 37.03.08040.04.b.iii. provides as follows:

The protestant shall bear the initial burden of coming forward with evidence for the evaluation of the public interest criteria of Section 42-203C(2), Idaho Code, and of demonstrating a significant reduction, except that the applicant shall provide details of the proposed design, construction, and operation of the project and directly associated operations to allow the impact of the project to be fully evaluated.

- 6. The applicant has not provided plans with sufficient detail which will allow the Department or the protestants to evaluate the impact of the proposed uses.
- 7. The applicant has not shown that man-made wildlife ponds are better habitat or would significantly contribute more to wildlife habitat than the Snake River itself nor has the applicant shown a need for creating wildlife habitat on his property.
- 8. The applicant has not shown that the water supply (10.5 cfs) is sufficient for the wildlife use or power generation use.
- 9. Approval of the application will not reduce the quantity of water under existing water rights.
- 10. The application is speculative in nature in that the proposed uses are not adequately described in enough detail either in the application or in the supporting information.
- 11. Based on the information submitted, the applicant appears to have sufficient financial resources with which to complete a project such as proposed in the application.
- 12. The application conflicts with the local public interest in the respect that the effect of the proposed uses on wildlife can not be determined with the information submitted.
- 13. The application is contrary to the conservation of water resources within the state of Idaho.
- 14. The applicant has not met the required ultimate burden of proof on each of the decision criteria described in Section 42-203A, Idaho Code.
- 15. The Department should deny Application for Permit No. 36-08570A since the application is speculative in nature and the

applicant has not shown that the application is in the public interest or that the water supply is sufficient for the purposes intended.

ANALYSIS

The parties participating in the November 23, 1993 hearing presented conflicting testimony concerning the purpose and nature for the filing of application for permit no. 36-08570A. protestants believe the applicant filed the application to procure the difference between the 10.5 cfs claimed to be historically diverted by the applicant and the 4.5 cfs recommended by the Department in the SRBA as the rate which has been beneficially used for irrigation by the applicant through the pipeline. applicant insists that the application is not related to the recommendation of SRBA claim no. 36-04260B other than that the applicant may need to generate power for a sprinkler irrigation system if the 4.5 cfs recommended by the Department is ultimately determined by the court to be the extent of the irrigation right.

The parties also provided conflicting testimony relative to when the plans for the proposed power generation and wildlife facilities were prepared. The protestants claim the plans had not been prepared by September 14, 1993 when the Department held a conference in the matter. The applicant states that the plans have been in existence for about a year. The plans received as exhibits from the applicant at the hearing are undated and do not clear up this question.

The applicant's motive in filing the application and the timing of plan preparation are essentially not of consequence, since the plans provided by the applicant are not complete enough for the Department or the protestants to evaluate the effects of the proposed project and to consider the application as other than speculative in nature.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE, hereby ORDERED that Application for Permit No. 36-0857A is hereby DENIED.

IT IS FURTHER, hereby, ORDERED that the protests of those parties who did not appear at the hearing are SET ASIDE and will not be further considered in this matter.

STATE OF IDAHO EASEMENT NO. 5223

THIS INDENTURE, made this 4th day of March , 1985, by and between the STATE OF IDAHO, acting by and through the State Board of Land Commissioners, as party of the first part (Grantor), and PLATEAU TRUST COMPANY, c/o Robert Brailsford, 300 Morrison Drive, #644, Twin Falls, Idaho 83301, as party of the second part (Grantee);

WITNESSETH: That for and in consideration of the sum of TWO HUNDRED FIFTY AND NO/100ths DOLLARS (\$250.00), lawful money of the United States of America, receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the Grantor does hereby grant to the Grantee an easement for the purpose of constructing, using and maintaining a submarine water pipeline over and across the following described lands situated in TWIN FALLS and GOODING COUNTIES, State of Idaho, to-wit: so much of the following described lands which were below the ordinary or natural high waterline on the date the State of Idaho was admitted to the Union with the right to additions thereto and subject to deletions therefrom which have occurred, causing the boundary of the State's ownership to change;

A strip of land ten (10.00) feet wide, being five (5.00) feet on each side of the following described centerline:

Commencing at the northeast section corner of Section 7, Township 8 South, Range 14 East, Boise Meridian, thence South 65°51'56" West, 1,306.62 feet to a point on the ordinary high waterline on the West bank of the Snake River, said point being the REAL POINT OF BEGINNING; thence North 37°51'27" East, 920.36 feet to a point on the ordinary high waterline on the East bank of the Snake River, said point being the point of terminus of said easement, the above described area containing 0.21 acres, more or less.

It is understood and agreed that the submarine water pipeline is to be constructed and maintained in such a manner that will not obstruct the river channel or hinder or affect navigation, recreation, or other authorized and customary use of the Snake River. The State Board of Land Commissioners reserves the right to terminate this easement for failure to construct and maintain the submarine water pipeline as herein provided, upon thirty (30) days written notice to the Grantee.

It is understood and agreed that this easement authorizes use of this submarine water pipeline only on the lands lying below the ordinary high watermark.

Also subject to State of Idaho Easement No. 4855, issued to Idaho Power Company on February 14, 1980 for an overhead powerline.

It is further understood and agreed that in the event the lands hereinabove described are not used for the purposes herein specified for any five-year period the State Board of Land Commissioners may declare such right of way forfeited and the use of the lands will revert back to the State of Idaho or to the record owner of the lands.

ORDER DENYING
PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION

On December 8, 1993, the department hearing officer issued a Recommended Order in connection with Application for Permit No. 36-08570A in the name of Plateau Trust (applicant). By letter dated December 21, 1993 and January 11, 1994 and an Order issued April 1, 1994, the hearing officer extended the time for filing a Petition for Reconsideration in this matter to April 22, 1994. On April 22, 1994, the applicant submitted a Petition for Reconsideration of the Recommended Order (petition). On May 5, 1994, protestant Fish and Game filed a response to the petition.

The department has reviewed the petition of the applicant and Fish and Game's response to it and responds to both as follows:

General response:

Most of the information and exhibits offered by the applicant in its Petition for Reconsideration is new information which was not provided at the hearing and can not now be considered by the hearing officer without a further hearing. It is apparent that the applicant contacted an engineer after the hearing and asked for the review of "hydroelectric potential" of the proposed generating facility. Irrespective of this general concern, this order responds to each of the points raised by the applicant.

Specific response:

Finding of Fact 4.

The applicant objects to Finding of Fact No. 4 which lists, but does not address, the issues identified by the protestants at the hearing. The applicant's objection discusses the evidence relating to these issues but does not suggest that the issues are incorrectly identified. No change is required.

Finding of Fact 5.

The applicant objects to the admission by the hearing officer of Protestant's exhibits, A, B, C, D. The applicant's objection does not justify a change in the finding.

Finding of Fact 6.

The applicant's statement concerning the function of the Snake River Basin Adjudication court does not disagree with this

finding and does not justify a change to it.

Finding of Fact 7.

The applicant apparently is referring to Finding of Fact No. 9 and is disagreeing with the requirements of a hydropower producer to file with the IPUC or the FERC. Contrary to the applicant's statement, either federal and/or state approval or a disclaimer such as an exemption must be obtained for hydropower projects. A change to this finding is not appropriate.

Finding of Fact 8.

Conceptual review of a proposed power generating facility by an engineer after the department has conducted an administrative hearing and has issued a Recommended Order in the contested matter conflicts with the holding of Shokal v. Dunn and can not be considered timely. The letter dated April 20, 1994 from Jack Straubhar can not be considered as a design and does not constitute plans and specifications for the proposed hydropower facility.

Finding of Fact 9.

Exhibit #7 either has not been labeled by the applicant or was not included by the applicant as a part of its Petition for Reconsideration.

Finding of Fact 10.

The applicant's statement concerning wildlife use of wetland areas does not disagree with the finding and does not justify any change to it.

Finding of Fact 12.

Based on information provided in the objection, the hearing officer has changed Finding of Fact No. 12 in the Recommended Order to show that the intended recreation use is hunting.

Finding of Fact 13.

The applicant's statement does not disagree with the finding and does not justify any change to it.

Finding of Fact 14.

The department's letter dated March 18, 1986 which was not offered as evidence at the hearing, addresses stabilization of a bank of an estuary of the Snake River, does not relate to the application in question and does not justify any change to Finding of Fact 14.

Conclusion of Law 1.

Applicant objects to Conclusion of Law No. 1. which lists, but does not address the issues which can be considered by the department in the approval of an application. The objection does not justify a change to this conclusion.

Conclusion of Law 2.

The applicant objects to Conclusion of Law No. 2 which describes the holding in Shokal v. Dunn. The applicant's latest submittal of "plans" are neither timely nor sufficiently complete enough to satisfy the holding in Shokal v. Dunn and does not justify any change to the conclusion.

Conclusion of Law 3.

The applicant objects to Conclusion of Law No. 3. which describes the text of a water appropriation rule. No change to his conclusion is appropriate.

Conclusion of Law 4.

The applicant objects to Conclusion of Law No. 4. which describes the text a water appropriation rule. No change to this conclusion is appropriate.

Conclusion of Law 5.

The applicant objects to Conclusion of Law No. 5. which describes the text a water appropriation rule. No change to this conclusion is appropriate.

Conclusion of Law 6.

See the response to Finding of Fact 8 above.

Conclusion of Law 7.

The applicant's statement does not disagree with this conclusion and does not justify any change to it.

Conclusion of Law 8.

The request for reconsideration apparently did not include exhibits 7 and 9. This conclusion should not be changed, since the applicant does not address the conclusion.

Conclusion of Law 9.

The applicant's statement does not disagree with the conclusion and does not justify any change to it.

Conclusion of Law 10.

See the response to Conclusion of Law 6 above.

Conclusion of Law 11.

No change is appropriate since financial ability is not at issue in this contested matter.

Conclusion of Law 12.

No change is appropriate, since the applicant has not shown that the application is in the local public interest.

Conclusion of Law 13.

No change is appropriate, since the applicant has not shown that the application is not contrary to the conservation of water in Idaho.

Conclusion of Law 14.

No change is appropriate, since the applicant has not met the required ultimate burden of proof.

Conclusion of Law 15.

The applicant's disagreement with the Recommended Order is not sufficient justification to change the conclusion.

Response to Analysis

The analysis section should not be changed, since the applicant has not shown any error in it.

Summary

Contrary to applicant's assertion, protestant Fish & Game has visited the spring and the proposed place of use. The failure of the other protestants to make an on-site examination of the applicant's proposed water use facility does not show error by the protestants.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE, hereby ORDERED that applicant Plateau Trust's Petition for Reconsideration is **DENIED**.

IT IS FURTHER, hereby, ORDERED that the Recommended Order issued December 8, 1993 is modified as specified above under the paragraph headed **Finding of Fact 12**.

Thank you for taking the time recently to meet informally with me and other protestants to the above-referenced water applications.

I also appreciate the time you spent showing me and Dave Parish the diversion works for the source of water for the applications.

Having discussed the matter with members of Citizens' Alert's Board of Directors, I must advise you we still have concerns. While we all applaud your apparent attempts to remove sediments from your point source discharge through wetlands and settling ponds, what now enters the river as clean water during non-irrigation season will necessarily be less clean after your proposed usage. Moreover, some of our members see the hydroelectric usage as speculation if you are not going to pursue the FERC licensing process and sell the wattage you are not using to a utility company.

While we are sympathetic to your situation vis a vis the adjudication process, our members have decided we must sustain our protest on both parts of your application.

CONFERENCE AND HEARING PROCEDURE

APPLICATION FOR PERMIT

ISSUES

Section 42-203A, Idaho Code, requires the department to consider the following issues in connection with an application for permit:

- 1. Will the proposed appropriation injure other water rights?
- 2. Is the water supply sufficient for the purpose for which it is sought to be appropriated?
- 3. Was the application made in good faith or for delay or speculative purposes?
- 4. Does the applicant have sufficient financial resources with which to complete the proposed project?
- 5. Is the proposed appropriation in the local public interest, which is defined as the affairs of the people in the area directly affected by the proposed use?
- 6. Is the proposed use contrary to conservation of water resources within the state of Idaho?

BURDEN OF PROOF

The applicant has the initial burden of proof for issues 1, 2, 3, 4, and 6 above and must provide evidence for the department to evaluate these criteria.

The initial burden of proof on issue 5 above lies with both the applicant and protestant as to factors of which they are most knowledgeable and cognizant. The applicant has the ultimate burden of persuasion, however, for this issue.

PROCEDURE

The department generally conducts an informal conference with the parties to determine the issues and to try to settle a protested matter before a hearing is scheduled. If a hearing is held, the department will issue a written decision based on the hearing record.

CONFERENCE

The purpose of a pre-hearing conference is to provide the opportunity for the parties and the department to familiarize themselves with a contested matter and to attempt to resolve the matter. At the conference, the department may also formulate and simplify the issues, identify documents to avoid unnecessary proof, exchange proposed exhibits or prepared testimony, limit witnesses, discuss settlement or make settlement offers, schedule hearings, establish procedure at hearing and address other matters that may expedite orderly conduct and disposition of the proceeding or its settlement.

HEARING

The department will tape record the hearing. Copies of a hearing tape are available upon request and the payment of the cost of reproducing the tape.

The hearing likely will be conducted by a hearing officer appointed by the Director rather than by the Director himself. If so, the hearing officer will prepare a recommended order for the the Director's consideration. Parties can file exceptions to a recommended order, briefs in support of the exceptions or may request oral argument. Parties may seek judicial review of any final order issued by the Director.

Parties may by written stipulation waive the right to a recommended order, particularly when a shortened decision process is desirable or necessary. Such a waiver does not eliminate any rights of the parties in connection with the final order of the Director and judicial review of the order.

EXHIBITS

A party who plans to offer an exhibit as part of the hearing record must provide a copy of the proposed exhibit to the parties and to the hearing officer.



- An affidavit to establish residence and indicate the ownership of any existing man-made works to be used in the project must be completed and filed with your application. (Sections 42-205 through 208, Idaho Code) A form is enclosed for your completion and return.
- 2) All information required by rule 4,5,3 of the Rules and Regulations for Water Appropriation. This requirement may be met in one of two ways:
 - A) Submit all information required by rule 4,5,3 to the department for review. The department may then act on your application independently of actions of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) and/or the Idaho Public Utilities Commission (PUC).
 - B) Submit all required approvals of FERC and/or PUC.
