The original application for permit was submitted by Stanley and Sylvia Capouch. The property was later sold to Patricia Russell. Ms. Russell submitted the Statement of Completion in June of this year. When I contacted Ms. Russell, she had sold the property to George and Margaret Wilson. The current permit is still under Ms. Russell's name.

Patricia Russell Communication Summary

- 10/2/2019 I called Ms. Russell to set up a field exam and left a message.
- 10/3/2019 I emailed Ms. Russell to set up a field exam.
- 10/7/2019 Ms. Russell responded to my email and let me know she sold the property and who the current owners contact information.
- 10/7/2019 I emailed Ms. Russell to ask if she could fill out the Assignment of Permit form and return it back to the Department.
- 10/8/2019 I tried to contact Ms. Russell again to ask about the installed system and received no response.
- 10/17/2019 I sent an Intent to Void letter to Ms. Russell and copied George Wilson.
- 11/18/2019- I did not receive any communication from Ms. Russell, therefore, the permit will be voided.

George Wilson Communication Summary

- 10/7/2019 I emailed Mr. Wilson about setting up a field exam.
- 10/7/2019 Mr. Wilson emailed back that he is not aware of a water system on his property that brings water from the Snake River.
- 10/17/2019 I copied Mr. Wilson on the Intent to Void letter I sent to Ms. Russell. Mr. Wilson emailed me back on 10/17/2019 and requested that we call him to discuss the water permit.
- 10/17/2019 Dan Nelson and I called Mr. Wilson to discuss the system and a new application for permit on his property. He did not answer the phone so we left a message.

Based on this communication summary, the permit should be voided because the requirements set forth in the permit were not fulfilled and a field examination could not be completed.

Dear Ms. Russell:

The Department of Water Resources (IDWR) is reviewing the above-referenced permit because you submitted the Statement of Completion on June 27, 2019.

On October 2, 2019, I called the phone number provided on the Statement of Completion form to set up a field exam and left a message. On October 3, 2019, I sent you an email to set up the field exam. You responded to my email on October 7, 2019, and let me know that you sold the property and who the new owners are. I am sending a copy of this letter to the new owners as a courtesy, so they are informed of the actions that need to be taken.

On October 7, 2019, I sent an email asking you to fill out the Assignment of Permit form to assign the permit to the new property owner. I have not gotten a response from you regarding this request. A water right permit is considered personal property, and it is not automatically conveyed to the new owners. Until I receive an assignment of permit, all actions taken on this permit must be done by you, and all correspondence must be sent to you. On this day, I also emailed the new property owners about setting up a field exam to review the system. The new property owners informed me that to their knowledge they do not have an irrigation system with water from the river on their property.

On October 8, 2019, I tried to contact you again to discuss what system was installed on the property. Since I have received no response to the items previously mentioned, the Department cannot move forward with the permit licensing process. Per my conversations with the current owners of the property, it also appears as though the water system from the Snake River has never been developed.

Pursuant to Idaho Code § 42-219(8), if the conditions of approval on a permit are not complied with, IDWR may issue an order voiding the permit or issue a license for only that portion of the authorized use developed in

accordance with the permit. Since the proposed water system does not appear to have been developed, we cannot move forward with the licensing process. If you believe a water right license should be issued, please supply information to demonstrate that the system was fully developed and utilized during your development period. If I do not receive the requested information from you within thirty (30) days, I will take action to void your permit under the provision of Section 42-219(8) of the Idaho Code. If you are no longer interested in your permit, you can shorten the voiding process by signing and returning the enclosed relinquishment form. If you have any questions, please contact me.
