

STATE OF IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES

The Idaho Department of Water Resources ("Department") has examined this application for temporary approval to use water under the provisions of Idaho Code § 42-202A and has determined that:

____ A. The application for temporary approval should be denied because ______

 \checkmark B. The application for temporary approval should be approved, since

- 1. The temporary approval can be properly administered.
- 2. Other water sources are not readily available.
- 3. The approval is in the public interest.
- 4. The approval will not injure known public values associated with the water source or any known water rights.
- 5. If the temporary approval is within a water district, the Department has sought and considered the recommendations of the watermater.

This application is therefore hereby:

____ A. DENIED

B. APPROVED, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Diversion and use of water under this approval is subject to all valid existing water rights.
- 2. The applicant assumes all risk of the use of the water under this approval.
- 3. This approval authorizes a maximum diversion volume of **D**. **I** AF and a maximum diversion rate of **D**. **H** cfs.
- 4. This approval does not grant a right-of-way across the land of another.
- 5. The Department may cancel or reduce the rate of flow or volume authorized by this approval. For example, the Department may cancel or reduce this approval if it concludes the water use is injuring other water rights or adversely affecting fish, wildlife or other public values.
- 6. The applicant shall not divert water when downstream minimum flow water rights are not being satisfied.
- 7. This approval does not create a continuing right to use water.
- 8. A temporary approval for ground water recharge or prevention of flood damage shall be an opportunistic use of surplus water and shall not interfere with the filling of surface water reservoirs.
- 9. For a temporary approval authorizing ground water recharge or ground water or surface water remediation, the applicant shall measure and record the weekly quantity of water diverted and report the diversion data to the Department upon request.
- 10. This temporary approval is not an authorization for the described water use to be used as mitigation or credit for any other purpose.
- 11. Other: SEE ATTACHED
- 12. This approval expires on AUGUET 1, 2020.

- 13. Diversions of water under this temporary approval shall not continue after August 1, 2020. This is necessary to protect the downstream municipal water supply for Idaho City.
- 14. The temporary approval is subject to the availability of Water District No. 63 Rental Pool water to mitigate water losses and injury to existing water rights. Prior to diversion and use of water the recipient of this temporary approval must contact Water District 63 Watermaster at 208-908-5480.
- 15. This temporary approval is subject to control of Water District No. 63 Watermaster.
- 16. Prior to the diversion and use of water under this approval, the right holder shall comply with all fish screening and/or fish passage requirements of the Idaho Department of Fish and Game.
- 17. The stream channel shall not be altered in a manner that creates a physical barrier preventing upstream or downstream fish movement.
- 18. Prior to diversion and use of water under this approval, the recipient shall obtain U.S. Forest Service authorization necessary to access the point of diversion or place of use or to convey water across Forest Service land.
- 19. This temporary approval does not authorize the discharge of wastewater or slurry directly into any body of water.

Your application for temporary water appropriation has been approved and is enclosed. The approval authorizes the temporary use of water and does not grant trespass or other activity on public land or on private property.

Please be advised, **this approval is subject to the effective dates and conditions stated on page 2 of the application**. Review these conditions to understand the limitations associated with the temporary use of water.

Water sufficiency for senior water rights along with associated public values must be protected during summer-fall low flows. Elk Creek is the primary water source for Idaho City. Therefore **the approval expires on August 1, 2020.** The expiration date cannot be extended under this temporary approval.

Also note the condition requiring the **purchase of storage water from the Boise River Rental** Pool to mitigate the injury to senior water right holders below the Boise River. A Boise River Rental Pool Lease Agreement form is enclosed for your convenience. Contact Boise River Watermaster, Rex Barrie at 208-908-5480 to complete the lease agreement prior to diverting water under this temporary approval.

Applicant: The Department received an application for temporary use of water on 5/18/2020 from Trent Starkey proposing to divert water from Elk Creek for recreational mining activates.

Upon initial review, the application was not complete. The application did not list a place of use (POU) description and the maximum volume over the duration of the request was listed as 1000 gallons/day. Furthermore, the proposed use of water was listed as groundwater recharge with a settling pond. Upon locating the proposed point of diversion (POD) in the SWNESW QQQ of Sec. 30, Twp. 07N, Rge. 06E, the groundwater recharge use did not appear to match the intent of Mr. Starkey. Therefore, I called him on 6/8/2020 to clarify the proposed use of water, the location of the POU and the total AF of water that would be diverted. Mr. Starkey informed me that the application was indeed meant for mining activities and he was simply confused as to how to fill out the form. Based on our discussion, he proposes to divert from June through October approximately 1 time per week with some weeks diverting on 2 occasions. Based on the 1000 gallons/day use listed on the application, the overall water diverted was estimated to be 25,000 gallons or .078 (rounded to 0.1) AF. The applicant will conduct the mining activities under Serial Number IMC224743. The diverted water will be used within 50 feet of the POD and all wastewater will be discharged back into a settling pond.

Mr. Starkey also authorized me to make the necessary changes to the application. I clarified the POU, proposed use of water, and maximum volume over the duration of the request and initialed next to each change.

Proper Administration: The application proposes diversion from Elk Creek East of Centerville, ID, which is located within Water District 63. If necessary, the water use could be administered by Watermaster Rex Barrie or Assistant Watermaster Mike Meyers.

Public Interest: Based on the available information, the proposal appears to be within the public's interest.

Injury to Public Values: Based on the available information, the requested use of water does not appear to cause injury to public values. On 6/8/2020, comments were submitted to the United States Forest Service (USFS), Idaho Water Resource Board (Board), Idaho Department of Fish and Game (IDFG) and Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ). The USFS responded on 6/9 with no concerns. No response

was received from the Board, IDFG or DEQ within 14 days, by 6/22, so it was presumed there were no concerns.

Other Sources of Water: There are no other sources of water available nearby. It is it reasonable for the applicant to request diversion from Elk Creek.

Injury to Existing Water Rights: The requested POD and POU overlap with the POU for water right 63-24638. This right is owned by the USFS for stockwater use and authorizes two PODs from Elk Creek, one above and one below the proposed POD location. Injury to this right does not seem apparent since the POD downstream on Elk Creek is located far enough below the proposed POD.

Minimum Stream Flow (MSF) right 63-12034 exists on Elk Creek above and below the proposed POD/POU. This MSF right authorizes that at least 5.0 cfs is maintained in Elk Creek year round. The proposed use of .08 AF is minimal enough that injury to right 63-12034 does not seem apparent.

Senior municipal water right 63-2627 sources water from Elk Creek downstream of the proposed POD. This right provides the main water supply for Idaho City. To avoid injury to 63-2627, the authorization to divert water shall expire on August 1, 2020 and the application will include conditional language to make this clear.

The application proposes diverting 200 gpm (.44 cfs), maximum daily volume of 1000 gallons and 25,000 gallons over the duration of the request. 25,000 gallons equates to approximately 0.1 AF which is well within the 5.0 AF maximum allowed.

Department Staff and Watermaster Comments: Comments were sent to Western Regional manager Nick Miller as well as Water District 63 watermasters Rex Barrie and Mike Meyers on 6/8/2020. Nick responded on 6/8 with the consideration that temporary diversions from Elk Creek end on August 1st to protect the supply of water for Idaho City. Elk Creek is the main source of water for Idaho City. No comment was received from Mike or Rex so it was presumed they did not have concerns. The application will be conditioned with the requirement to rent water from Water District 63 rental pool.
