ACTION OF THE DIRECTOR, DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES

This is to certify that I have examined Application for Permit to appropriate the public waters of the State of Idaho No. 47-7640, and said application is hereby approved.

1. Approval of said application is subject to the following limitations and conditions:

a. SUBJECT TO ALL PRIOR WATER RIGHTS.

b. Proof of construction of works and application of water to beneficial use shall be submitted on or before August 1, 19 85.

c. The rate of diversion, if water is to be used for irrigation under this permit, when combined with all other water rights for the same land shall not exceed 0.02 cubic feet per second for each acre of land.

d. Other: (1) A measuring device of a type approved by the Department shall be permanently installed and maintained as part of the diverting works. (2) Use of water under this permit is subject to control by the watermaster of State Water District # 45-J, Rock Creek. (3) The issuance of this permit in no way grants any right-of-way or easement across the land of another. (4) Maximum rate of diversion allowed under this permit shall not exceed 130 cfs.
