ORDER CANCELLING
PERMIT

This matter having come before the Idaho Department of Water Resources (Department) as a requirement of Section 42-203D, Idaho Code, the Department finds, concludes and orders as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Permit No. 47-7617 (permit) authorized the diversion of 5.60 cfs of water from a groundwater source for the irrigation of 280 acres of land.

2. The Department mailed notice to the permit holder(s) on April 6, 1989 informing them that Permit no. 47-7617 was subject to the review requirements of Section 42-203D, Idaho Code. The notice further informed the permit holder(s) that he must submit to the Department within 30 days either the readvertisement fee required by Section 42-221F, Idaho Code and Water Appropriation Rule 4,2,3,3., or evidence that the development proposed by the permit was completed prior to July 1, 1985.

3. The permit holder(s) failed to submit the required readvertisement fee or evidence of development completed prior to July 1, 1985.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Water Appropriation Rule 4,2,3,4. specifies that failure to pay the required readvertisement fee within 30 days after the permit holder is notified to do so is cause for the Director of the Department to cancel the permit.

2. The permit should be cancelled as provided in Water Appropriation Rule 4,2,3,4.

NOTICE OF PENDING ORDER CANCELLING PERMIT

On December 3, 1980, the Department of Water Resources (Department) issued Permit No. 47-7617 which authorized the diversion of 5.60 of water from a groundwater source for the irrigation of 280 acres.

The Department mailed a letter and questionnaire to you on April 6, 1989 in connection with the permit. The letter provided notice that the Department was reviewing the permit in connection with development which was not complete prior to July 1, 1985.

This letter also requested that you return the Department's questionnaire concerning any prior development under the permit and/or your plans for pursuing completion of the proposed project. The correspondence further requested that you submit with the questionnaire either a re-advertisement fee in the amount of twenty dollars (\$20) and/or evidence showing that development under the permit was complete prior to July 1, 1985. Finally, the letter notified you that failure to submit the required fee or information within thirty (30) days of the date of the letter was cause for the Department to cancel the permit.

The purpose of this letter is to provide a second and final opportunity for you to submit the requested information. If you fail to respond to this inquiry within fifteen (15) days of the date of this letter, the Department will issue an order cancelling the permit pursuant to Water Appropriation Rule 4,2,3,4.

If no development has been completed as authorized by the permit, and you are no longer interested in pursuing the development, please complete and return the enclosed relinquishment form.

MEMORANDUM DECISION
AND ORDER

On January 4, 1980, LaRay L. Easterday filed an application for permit with the Department of Water Resources to appropriate 5.60 cubic feet per second of water from a groundwater source. The application proposed to divert the water by means of a well located in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$, Sec. 2, Twp. 10S, Rge. 13E B.M., Twin Falls County, and use it for the irrigation of 280 acres within the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$, NE $\frac{1}{4}$, Sec. 33; W $\frac{1}{2}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$, Sec. 34, Twp. 9S, Rge. 13E B.M.

Notice of the application was published in the Twin Falls Times News on January 24 and 31, 1980.

On February 7, 1980, a protest was received from Magic Water Company, Inc. The issues raised in the protest are as follows:

- 1) That the proposed well would reduce the quantity of water in Salmon Falls Creek and would reduce springs flowing into Salmon Falls Creek.
- 2) That the water supply is insufficient for the purpose for which it is sought to be appropriated.
- 3) That the application is not made in good faith and is made for delay and/or speculative purposes.
- 4) That the applicant lacks sufficient financial resources to complete the work involved.

On March 19, 1980, the Department received a letter from the protestant's attorney allowing the Director of the Department of Water Resources to issue a decision in the matter without a hearing.

Based upon the information in the records of the Department and his understanding of the law, the Director of the Department of Water Resources makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1) The well location proposed by the applicant is not within the boundaries of critical groundwater area.
- 2) Studies done by the Department and published as Bulletin No. 20, Water Resources of the Blue Gulch Area show that insufficient groundwater supplies exist

on the west side of Salmon Falls Creek where the place of use is located. Studies published as Department of Water Resources Bulletin #22, Water Resources of the Twin Falls Tract also show there is considerable inflow from groundwater to Salmon Falls Creek from the east side as a result of irrigation on the Twin Falls tract.

3) There is a confining layer between water bearing strata in the Idavada volcanic formation located about 500 feet below land surface.

4) The applicant has filed Desert Land Entry No. I- 2009 on the land described in the application.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1) The applicant is entitled to a permit to appropriate groundwater subject to any prior water rights that may be affected by the appropriation.

2) The well must be constructed with unperforated casing to a depth of 500 feet and in a manner that will prevent the depletion of water from Salmon Falls Creek.

ORDER

IT IS, THEREFORE, HEREBY ORDERED that Application for Permit No. 47-7617 is APPROVED subject to the following conditions:

1) Subject to all prior water rights.

2) Proof of construction of works and application of water to beneficial use shall be submitted on or before November 1, 1985.

3) The well must be cased with unperforated casing into a confining layer below the first aquifer in order to prevent interference with surface flows in Salmon Falls Creek.

4) An access port or other device as specified by the Department shall be installed by the permit holder to provide for the installation of measuring equipment and the determination of the rate of diversion by the Department.





Date of Inspection: February 26, 1981

The Ken Marshall well is being drilled by Elsing Drilling with a cable tool rig in the Salmon Falls Creek Canyon just downstream from the Balanced Rock crossing. When inspected by Allen and I, the rig was being operated by Ray Gramer. He reported the well depth as 350 feet, drilling in hard, gray rhyolite and obtaining no water.

The well has a 26" casing down to 30 feet. A 20" casing is grouted inside this from the surface down to a depth of 90 feet. The well is 20" open hole from 90 to 200 feet and 12 inch open hole from 200 feet to the bottom.

The operator says artesian water was encountered in the first 90 feet of hole, and this has been sealed out except for a small amount of leakage. Two 3/4 inch pipes have been grouted into the annular space between the 26" and 20" casings to tap some of the artesian flow for possible domestic use. The combined flow of the two taps and the leakage out of the well is no more than 20 gpm.

Gramer said he thought the leakage could be sealed off with additional grout after the well is completed.

We also inspected a well being drilled for La Ray Easterday under Permits # 47-7614, 15, 16, 17, 18, in the SWSE, Sec. 2 T10S, R13E. The well is being drilled by Elsing Drilling with a rotary rig.

The driller reported the depth as 725 feet, drilling in gray rhyolite.

The well has 512 feet of 12" casing installed. The operator said that only 125 gpm of water had been encountered and that this was cased out. He is currently drilling in a dry hole.

Both the Marshall and Easterday wells have hole bottom elevations of less than 3100 feet and therefore any water now encountered can be appropriated under the permits.
