MEMORANDUM DECISION
AND ORDER

On March 26, 1973, Heritage Valley Ranches filed Application for Permit No. 45-7127 to appropriate 8.84 cubic feet of water per second from a spring, tributary to Marsh Creek, to be diverted within the NE4NW4, Sec. 5, Twp. 12S, Rge. 25E, B.M., Cassia County, to be used for irrigation and stockwater purposes. Notice of this proposed appropriation was published in the South Idaho Press, Burley, Idaho, on April 10, and April 17, 1973.

The application was protested by Ira C. Parke, Harry DeNaughel, P. D. Penrod, and Lennie Sam Skaggs. A conference was held concerning this matter at the Cassia County Courthouse, Burley, Idaho, on April 9, 1974. The protestants represented themselves and the applicant was represented by Mr. Roger Ling, attorney at law.

The protestants and applicant agreed that the Department could issue a decision in this matter without a formal hearing.

Following the conference, a field inspection of the area was conducted by Robert G. Haynes, hearing officer, with both the applicant and protestants being represented.

Based upon the information in the file, the statements made in the conference, an inspection of the area, and the Department's understanding of the law, the Director makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order.

Findings of Fact

- 1. The Application No. 45-7127 proposes to divert water from two springs located on property owned by the applicant. One spring does not flow overland into Marsh Creek. The other spring is tributary to Marsh Creek and some water presently flows into the Marsh Creek drainage.
 - 2. The applicant proposes to develop and increase the outflow of the springs.
- 3. Any water developed from the springs over and above that which is presently flowing into Marsh Creek may be appropriated and is not subject to the rights decreed in the case of R. L. Wood, et al -vs- William Stokes, et al, and the case of John Bridger -vs- Hiram Tremayne on Marsh Creek and its tributaries.

Conclusions of Law

- 1. The Department of Water Administration may issue a permit to appropriate the waters which can be developed in the unnamed springs which are the subject of the application.
- 2. The applicant, Heritage Valley Ranches is entitled to a permit from the State of Idaho.

0rder

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED and Application for Permit No. 45-7127 is hereby APPROVED subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The permit be and is subject to all prior existing water rights.
- 2. That proof of construction of works and application of water to beneficial use shall be submitted to the Department on or before May 1, 1979.
- 3. That a measuring device of the type approved by the Department shall be permanently installed and maintained as part of the diverting works.
- 4. That the amount of water presently flowing into Marsh Creek from the springs shall not be diminished or interfered with.
- 5. The applicant has the burden of proof of showing conclusively that it has developed "new" water which is not presently flowing into Marsh Creek and which is therefore subject to previously established water rights.
