Dear Mr. Holland:

As a follow-up to our phone conversation on September 12, 1985, the Department has conducted a computer search for water rights (in addition to Permit No. 43-7205) which are recorded as appurtenant to the 640 acres you own in parts of Section 26 and 27, T16S, R26E in Cassia County, Idaho. The research did not show that there are any other recorded rights for the property.

I also wish to repeat in this letter several water right concepts which we discussed. In times of water shortage, water is distributed in the order of priority, with the oldest water right receiving the water first. In the case of the use of water from Holt Creek, the prior older water rights, if there are any, are entitled to divert and use water ahead of your permit right. If all prior water rights are being supplied water or are not being used, and there is still water in Holt Creek, you would then be entitled to divert water under the permit.

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

#### ACTION OF THE DIRECTOR, DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES

This is to certify that I have examined Application for Permit to appropriate the public waters of the State of Idaho No. 43-7205, and said application is hereby APPROVED.

1. Approval of said application is subject to the following limitations and conditions:

- a. SUBJECT TO ALL PRIOR WATER RIGHTS.
- b. Proof of construction of works and application of water to beneficial use shall be submitted on or before July 1, 19 86.
- c. The rate of diversion, if water is to be used for irrigation under this permit, when combined with all other water rights for the same land shall not exceed 0.02 cubic feet per second for each acre of land.
- d. Other: A lockable device, subject to the approval of the Department, shall be installed on the diverting works in a manner that will provide the watermaster suitable control of the diversion.  
The issuance of this permit in no way grants any right-of-way or easement across the land of another.  
Use of water under this permit is subject to control by the watermaster of State Water District No. 43B, Upper Raft River.
