#### **RENTAL AGREEMENT CONDITIONS OF ACCEPTANCE**

- 1. The use of water under this agreement shall be subject to the provisions of Idaho Code § 42-1766.
- Rental of the specified right from the bank does not, in itself, confirm the validity of the right or any elements
  of the water right, or improve the status of the right including the notion of resumption of use. It does not
  preclude the opportunity for review of the validity of this water right in any other department application
  process.
- 3. Use of water under this agreement does not constitute a dedication of the water to renter's place of use, and upon expiration of this agreement, the points of diversion and place of use of the water shall revert to those authorized under the water right and/or again be available to rent from the bank.
- 4. Use of water under this agreement shall not prejudice any action of the Department in its consideration of an application for transfer or permit filed by the applicant for this same use.
- 5. Renter agrees to comply with all applicable state and federal laws while using water under this agreement.
- 6. Renter agrees to hold the Board, the Director and the state of Idaho harmless from all liability on account of negligent acts of the renter while using water.
- 7. Renter acknowledges and agrees that the Director may terminate authorization for the use of a water right based on a water right's priority date.
- 8. Failure of the renter to comply with the conditions of this agreement is cause for the Director to rescind approval of the rental agreement.
- 9. This rental is limited to the irrigation of 85 acres within the authorized place of use in a single irrigation season.


- 10. This right does not authorize the irrigation of land not previously irrigated.
- 11. This right when combined with all other rights shall provide no more than 0.02 cfs per acre nor more than 4.0 afa per acre at the field headgate for irrigation of the place of use.
- 12. The period of use for the irrigation described in this approval may be extended to a beginning date of 3/1 and an ending date of 11/15 provided that beneficial use of the water can be shown and other elements of the right are not exceeded. The use of water before 4/1 and after 10/31 is subordinate to all water rights having no subordinated early or late irrigation use and a priority date earlier than 4/8/2008.
- 13. Use of water under this right may be regulated by a watermaster with responsibility for the distribution of water among appropriators within a water district. At the time of this approval, this water right is within State Water District No. 02.
- 14. Prior to diversion of water under this rental agreement, the right holder shall install and maintain a measuring device and lockable controlling works of a type acceptable to the Department as part of the diverting works.
- 15. Pursuant to Idaho Code § 42-1412(6), this water right is subject to such general provisions necessary for the definition of the rights or for the efficient administration of water rights as determined by the Snake River Basin Adjudication court in the final unified decree entered 08/26/2014.

### **Water Modeling Requirement Information Sheet**

Information on water modeling requirements for rental requests within special administrative areas

Important information on requesting rental water within special administrative areas: Refer to the information below to determine whether the modeling of potential impacts from your rental request is necessary. Use Section 4 of the rental application to identify selected water rights. If you submit an application to rent water from within a special administrative area and water modeling is required, your rental request will be returned if water modeling is not provided.

Water modeling may be required when an application to rent water involves one of two scenarios:

Scenario 1: The rental request proposes to divert water from a regulated water source and/or within a special administrative area AND the distance between the rental point(s) of diversion (POD) and the POD(s) for the leased water right(s) is greater than the administratively established, acceptable distance.

#### Regulated water sources may areas include:

- A. Ground water resources within the modeled area of the Eastern Snake Plain Aquifer (ESPA) and tributary aquifers;
- B. Ground water within Ground Water Management Areas (GWMAs) or Critical Ground Water Areas (CGWAs);
- C. Water resources within other specified administrative areas, as established by the Idaho Water Resource Board (IWRB) or the Idaho Department of Water Resources.

The distance between any rental POD(s) and the POD(s) for a leased water right to be rented is important. On the ESPA, distance is measured in terms of model cells that cover an area of one square mile. Ground water modeling is not required if lease POD(s) and rental POD(s) are located within the same model cell or within adjacent model cells. If the lease and rental PODs are separated by more than one model cell groundwater modeling must be completed using the IDWR ESPA Transfer Tool and modeling results must be submitted with the rental application. ESPA modeling tools can be accessed and freely downloaded from IDWR's website by visiting: <a href="https://www.idwr.idaho.gov/WaterManagement/WaterRights/WaterRightTransfers/resources.htm">www.idwr.idaho.gov/WaterManagement/WaterRights/WaterRightTransfers/resources.htm</a>.

Ground water modeling may be required within GWMAs, CGWAs or other regulated administrative areas. Applicants who desire to rent water within an established GWMA, CGWA or other regulated administrative area should consult IDWR's website before submitting their application to review the current status of administrative orders related to regulated administrative areas. Consult <a href="https://www.idwr.idaho.gov/WaterInformation/GroundWaterManagement/designated\_areas.htm">www.idwr.idaho.gov/WaterInformation/GroundWaterManagement/designated\_areas.htm</a> for information on GWMAs or CGWAs, visit <a href="https://idwr.maps.arcgis.com/home/">https://idwr.maps.arcgis.com/home/</a> to use mapping tools to find other regulated areas.

Applicants interested in renting water within a GWMA, CGWA or other regulated administrative areas should request water rights that have been leased into the Bank from within the same administrative area. Generally, the Bank will not permit a rental of water within a regulated administrative area if the leased water rights are not located within that same administrative area.

Scenario 2: A rental request proposes to divert water from a different but hydraulically connected water source.

#### Modeling situations may include:

- A. Rental requests that propose to divert surface water rights via ground water POD(s) (wells); and
- B. Rental requests that propose to divert ground water from one aquifer when the right being rented authorizes the diversion of ground water from a hydraulically connected, tributary aquifer.


Rental requests that propose to divert surface water rights from ground water points of diversion may be considered if ground water modeling establishes that the surface and ground water resources are directly and immediately hydraulically connected. An acceptable hydraulic connection occurs when at least 50 percent of the total depletions from a well are detectable from the original water source within a 24 hour period. The existing (leased) POD and proposed (rental) POD must be proximate such that diversion and use of water from the proposed POD would have substantially the same effect on the hydraulically-connected source as diversion and use of water from the original POD.

Requests to rent ground water across tributary aquifer sources may be considered if ground water modeling is provided to demonstrate that two aquifers are hydraulically connected and the anticipated impacts of diverting ground water from one source through the other is modeled accordingly.

The Department of Water Resources acknowledges receipt of your application to rent water from the Water Supply Bank. I have enclosed two Water Supply Bank Rental Agreement for your review and signature. Upon signature and return of the original agreement, together with the rental fee described below, the Department will also sign the original agreement and return an executed copy to you. Execution of the agreement and compliance with the conditions of approval authorize diversion and use of water as provided in the agreement.

For Agreement 413, a rental fee of \$6800.00 was calculated based on the current rental rate of \$20.00 per acre-foot times a diversion volume of 340.0 acre-feet. Since you are both the lessor and the renter of the right(s), you are only obligated to pay the 10% administrative fee or \$680.00.

For Agreement 414, a rental fee of \$2280.00 was calculated based on the current rental rate of \$20.00 per acre-feet time a diversion volume of 114.0 acre-feet. Since you are both the lessor and the renter of the right, you are only obligated to pay the 10% administrative fee or \$228.00.

An annual payment shall be received by the Department prior to the execution of this agreement and prior to January 1 in all subsequent years for the duration of the rental period. The agreement will be void if payment is not received prior to the due date in a given year. If you would like to terminate the agreement prior to the end of the rental period, you must submit written notice of your intent to the Department at least 30 days prior to the rental fee due date.

**Purpose/Narrative:** Application to rent water from the Water Supply Bank (Bank) was received from Vic Conrad on behalf of the JR Simplot Company on January 2, 2020. This rental was received as part of a lease/rental package and proposes to rent 85 acres within a 650 acre PPU at a total flow rate of 1.7 cfs, and 340 af of water from water right (WR) 2-10471, also held by the JR Simplot Company. The statement in section 3.A. of the application essentially states that there are concerns of exceeding the combined flow rate limit for three rights that encompass the PPU described in the application during peak irrigation season, and that the applicant wishes to rent additional flow to cover the potential for exceedance.

This application requests the same rental amounts as was authorized under agreement 331 for 2019. The current application requests this amount for 3 years. The most current lease application for WR 2-10471 requests to lease that right for the next 5 years.

**Authority to File:** The application was signed by James Alderman, Senior VP and Secretary for the JR Simplot Company. According to tax lot data available to the Department of Water Resources (Department), all parcels at the place of use (POU) are owned the JR Simplot. No concerns over authority to file.

Water Right Validity/Forfeiture Evaluation: Right 2-10471 was split from WR 2-10449, which was subsequently split from WR 2-10433, which was decreed in 2008 and placed in the bank in 2009 indefinitely. Right 2-10471 has remained in the Bank every year since it was spit off in 2011, with the latest lease contract expiring the end of 2019. This rental application was part of a lease/rental package that included lease application 1590, proposing to lease WR 2-10471 to the Bank for another 5 years. No concerns over validity of the right.

**Injury Evaluation/Rentability:** The lease POD is located on the Snake River arm of CJ Strike reservoir, and the rental POD is located on the Bruneau arm of CJ Strike. Both PODs are in water district #2 and both are outside the ESPA modeling area boundary. The only other rights diverted through the rental POD are those listed on the application and held by JR Simplot Company. There are no apparent concerns of injury to other rights.

Enlargement of Use/Rentability: The POUs for rights 2-6, 2-15, 2-2166 and 2-10440 all cover the same area as the rental POU. Three of these, 2-6, 2-15, and 2-2166, have a combined rate limit of 9.05 cfs, and WR 2-10440 is authorized for 0.16 cfs. Because the objective of this rental is to add additional flow to what is already authorized, and not to add any additional acres of irrigation, a condition will be added to the rental restricting the combined flow rate to that authorized by all existing rights combined plus that of the rental (9.05 + 0.16 + 1.70 = 10.91 cfs). Additionally, conditioning will be added restricting volume to no more than 4.0 acre feet per acre.

There were concerns regarding what appeared to be irrigation outside the authorized POU of WRs 2-6, 2-15, and 2-2166, and occurring on lands owned by the BLM. These concerns were brought forward to Vic Conrad.

**Local Public Interest:** Review staff has no information to suggest this application is inconsistent with the local public interest.

**Beneficial Use/Conservation of Water Resources:** The rental appears consistent with the conservation of water resources in Idaho.

Thanks Vic, that definitely helps.

I have another question on another of the rentals of 2-10471, this one about the rental associated with WRs 2-6, 2-15, 2-2166 & 2-10440 (now rental app 1601). In the application you stated "Due to potential for exceeding the combined rate of diversion under IDWR water right Nos. 2-6, 2-15, 2-2166, and 2-10440 during certain periods of the irrigation season, the applicant seeks to rent additional flow under water right 2-10471 to cover the potential exceedance during peak crop water demands". I believe the purpose was stated the same last year, and as such, the POU was described by matching the outline of these combined rights. My question is in regards to what appears to be irrigation taking place in small sections outside the combined POU of these rights and, according to the parcel data I have, is also on BLM lands? I've attached a map displaying those areas, basically in Lot 9 (SNNW) of Sec. 18 and the NENE of Sec. 24. The imagery is from last year, 2019, and clearly there is some sort of differing practice taking place on these "slices" of the pivots, however it still appears there is some form of irrigation taking place outside of any authorized POU.

#### Scott,

Thank you for taking the time to put this together – and I think I understand the question. The WSB application is for the area shown in purple and green for both the land that is covered under the Jacks Creek water rights; and land that is not covered by a water right. Jacks Creek rarely has enough water in it at this location to irrigate the places of use – and the yield from the low-temperature geothermal wells is declining due to declining water levels. The application is intended to provide a reliable water supply for the irrigation season from a different source that serves to preserve water in the low temperature geothermal aquifer and make-up for the little flow in Jacks Creek.

Yes, there are areas as you've identified that were previously and will continue to be irrigated with water WSB water only. These are generally shown in the purple areas you identified in the image.

Hello Vic,

I am reviewing the WSB rental applications associated with the lease of WR 10471 and I have some questions about the application involving supplementation/replacement of water rights sourced from Jacks Creek (as well as a couple groundwater), now application 1591. The application states that the rental is "A substitute supply for water diverted under 51-2254, 51-2113C, 51-2111, 51-2164, 51-21112, 51-2015, 51-2117, 51-2124, 51-10377 and 51-2131 is necissary due to declining water levels and insufficiant flows." In reviewing the rental POU, I also found WR 51-7279, also sourced from Jacks Creek, covers a portion of the rental POU and am also including it in my review. Examining the POU for all these rights and comparing with the POU described for the rental, I'm coming up with some descrepancies as far as what is covered by these rights and what looks to be irrigated. It appears there is aproximatly 87 acres being irrigated that does not fall within the POU of any water rights. I've attached a map that hopefully helps descrbe what I'm looking at. The red outline displays the POU of all exitsting water rights in this area, and the green and purple displays the rental POU description. The purple portion is that which falls outside of existing water right coverage. Some of this may just be a matter of projection alignment and digitizing, however I am particularly curious about the larger portions, especially those located in the NENW, SWNW and NWSW of Sec. 21.

Esentially, I just need a better explination of the purpose of this rental, as it appears the entirety of the POUs for all water rights haved been irrigated over the past several years, including those portions not covered by this or prior rentals, as well as irrigation on lands that currently have no existing water rights.
