Mr. Barker,

We talked earlier today about amending application for permit 37-23018, now in the name of South Valley Ground Water District. I had mentioned the possibility of amendments to the place of use possibly impacting the priority date. I was recalling a section in the water appropriation rules (available at the following link)....

https://adminrules.idaho.gov/rules/current/37/370308.pdf

On page 8, are some rules discussing amended applications. Specifically, Rule 035.04.c states....

An amendment which increases the rate of diversion, increases the volume of water diverted per year or the volume of water depleted, lengthens the period of use, or adds an additional purpose of use shall result in the priority of the application for permit being changed to the date the amended application is received by the department.

Since an amendment to the Place of Use is not specifically listed here, I think you should be good to go.

Submit an amended, signed, application and request processing and we should be able to get things started on the processing front.
