

Applicant

On 12/20/2019, the Department received applications for permit 74-16224, 74-16225, 74-16226 and 74-16227 from the State of Idaho, Fish and Game Commission. The applications were all signed by Tom Curet, the Salmon Regional Supervisor for the Idaho Fish and Game. Additionally, Mike Demick, easement specialist at the Fish and Game, is listed as the representative on all applications.

The applications propose to divert water though fish screens in order to prevent fish from entering irrigation canals. Water is diverted at the appropriate headgate where it subsequently enters the fish screen before it is diverted back to the creek/stream by a bypass pipe. Of the four applications, there is one fish screen/bypass on Canyon Creek, one on Eighteen Mile Creek and two on Pratt Creek at different locations. The applications propose a non-consumptive use of water.

The beneficial use listed on all applications is fish propagation. However, I believe the water use is intended to be wildlife due to the fact that the use is indeed not for rearing of commercial fish. I will not be requesting the applicant to change the beneficial use from fish propagation to wildlife on the applications. Rather, I will record the use as wildlife for the applications but the physical application files will list fish propagation.

Under item 5 on all applications, the period of water use is listed as "season of use". According to Mike Demick, he was directed by the Department of Water Resources to list "season of use" which is meant to align with the local standard irrigation season of use. All four applications will have a season of use from 03/15 to 11/15. Similar to the beneficial use change, I will not request the applications to list the specific irrigation season. The season of use from 03/15 to 11/15 will be recorded and data entered for the applications but the paper files will list "season of use".

On applications, 74-16225 and 74-16226, the place of use (POU) and point of diversion (POD) descriptions did not match the PLSS locations on the maps included with the applications. Specifically, the associated Government Lot for the POU and POD was missing on the applications. I called Mike Demick on 1/29/2020 to explain and discuss this discrepancy. I followed up with an email to him the same day which included copies of the applications in order to add the Government lots. He returned the completed applications by email the same day, on 1/29/2020. The priority date of 74-16225 and 74-16226 will be advanced to 1/29/2020 to reflect the date that the Department received completed applications.

Source, Diversion System & Water Use

Application 74-16224 proposes to use water from Canyon Creek. According to the application, water runs through a modular closed drum fish screen which has a 16 inch x 4 foot perforated plate and is powered by a paddle wheel. A 10 inch bypass pipe flows water and fish from the

fish screen to the creek. The POU and POD are in the NWSW QQ of Sec. 24 Twp. 16N Rge. 26E.

Application 74-16225 requests to use water from Eighteen Mile Creek. Item 7 on the applications lists a modular closed drum fish screen (with an 18 inch by 4.5 inch perforated plate), powered by a paddlewheel. A 10 inch bypass pipe from the screen flows water and fish back to the creek. The POD and POU are in the SWSW QQ Govt. Lot 4 of Sec. 07 Twp. 15N Rge. 27E.

Application 74-16226 proposes to use water from Pratt Creek. The application states that water will flow through a single-bay, rotary drum with a single screen (with dimensions of 36 inch by 6 foot perforated plate). A Paddlewheel with a 10 inch bypass pipe flows from the screen to Pratt Creek. The POD and POU are in the NENE QQ Govt. Lot 1 of Sec. 6 Twp. 20N Rge. 24E.

Application 74-16227 also proposes to use water from Pratt Creek. Item 7 on the application lists the diversion works as a double-bay, rotary drum screen (with dimensions of 36 inch by 12 inch and a 6 foot perforated plate) powered by a paddlewheel. A 10 inch bypass screen allows fish to bypass from the screen to Pratt Creek. The POU and POD are in the NWSW QQ of Sec. 32 Twp. 21N Rge. 24E.

All applications state that a lockable headgate is in place as part of the diversion works and that the use of water enables fish entrained in the relative ditch to return to the appropriate stream though a bypass pipe that runs from the fish screen to the stream/creek. Furthermore, item 10 claims that the POD for each application is shared with right holder(s) but this proposed use is the only right for a fish screen.

The beneficial use would occur under these applications because the 0.8 cfs proposed for each application is in addition to water diverted to a canal by irrigators. The water goes through the fish screen and flows back to the stream and not to the canal. According to Mike Demick, the fish screens need a certain amount of water flowing though in order to operate. The 0.8 cfs requested comes from National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) guidelines.

Item 12 on all applications states that the applications are being submitted to the Department in order to record a non-consumptive use of water for an existing fish screen installed and currently operating.

Additional Comments

All four applications propose to use water from tributaries to the Lemhi River, which is tributary to the Salmon Wild and Scenic River. Therefore, all are subject to wild and scenic processing steps.

The applications were understood to meet the description of a non-consumptive use as described in the partial decree for minimum streamflow (MSF) right 75-13316. Therefore, the applications will be advertised with the remark that the proposed use will benefit from the subordinate provision because it is a non-consumptive use.

The applicant stated in Section 11 of all four applications that they do not own the property at the location of the POD or POU. However, the applications state that there is an easement, right of way or agreement with the respective property owner. Legal access to the project sites is not a concern at this time.

To answer IDWR request for additional information on how our proposal for the above mentioned Water Rights (WRs) invokes any local public interest concerns for ESA species recovery the Idaho Department of Fish and Game (IDFG) submits the following:

The IDFG Anadromous Fish Screen and Habitat Program has been an integral part of improving conditions to support recovery of ESA-listed fish species Chinook salmon, steelhead, and bull trout in the Upper Salmon Basin. IDFG works collectively with the Upper Salmon River Basin Watershed Technical Team to coordinate and prioritize projects that are implemented in the basin.

Over the past 30 years our program has installed over 270 fish screens to prevent ESA-listed fish species from being entrained in irrigation ditches. In order to safely return the fish from the fish screen back to the river or stream, from which they were diverted; a bypass flow is required.

The application for WRs represents a non-consumptive use. Where the water is diverted at the headgate, travels a short distance downstream to the fish screen (usually less than 100 yards), and is then returned to the river via a bypass pipe. The bypass is designed to transfer the fish back to the river or stream. Without the critical bypass flow the fish would become stranded at the face of the fish screens and would not be reverted to the river. Fish screens and the bypass flows protect irrigators from illegal take of ESA-listed species and provide a benefit to the community by protecting and enhancing ESA-listed species populations for future generations.

The Department of Water Resources' (IDWR) records show you filed applications to establish new uses of water in the upper Salmon River basin. Idaho Code § 42-203A(5) requires IDWR to determine whether each water right application satisfies all the criteria necessary for appropriating water in Idaho. One statutory criterion requires IDWR to determine the local public interest relative to the proposed water use. Idaho Code § 42-202B(3) defines the local public interest as "the interests that the people in the area directly affected by a proposed water use have in the effects of such use on the public water resource." The local public interest has many facets, including the effects of a proposed water use on aquatic habitat for fish and wildlife resources.

The upper Salmon River basin is home to stocks of chinook salmon, sockeye salmon, steelhead trout, and bull trout, all of which are listed as threatened or endangered under the Endangered Species Act (ESA). Since the early 1990s, local water users, conservation districts, and federal and state agencies have cooperated to implement conservation measures intended to protect and restore habitat for ESA-listed species in the upper Salmon River watershed. For example, at the request of local water users the Idaho Legislature directed the Idaho Water Resource Board (IWRB) to establish a minimum stream flow in the lower Lemhi River for fish passage. The minimum stream flow is maintained through a water supply bank and temporary or permanent acquisition of additional water supplies by willing buyers from willing sellers.

Pursuant to the Snake River Water Rights Agreement of 2004, Idaho has been developing a long term conservation plan for the benefit of ESA-listed species in the Lemhi River basin. Improving conditions in flow-limited river reaches and streams is a fundamental component of the Lemhi plan. In addition to IDWR, numerous state agencies, including the Office of Species Conservation, Idaho Department of Fish and Game, Idaho Department of Environmental Quality, Idaho Soil and Water Conservation Commission, and Idaho Department of Lands, have committed and continue to commit significant resources toward this objective under the following programs:

- Columbia Basin Water Transactions Program
- National Marine Fisheries Service Pacific Coastal Salmon Recovery Fund
- U. S. Fish & Wildlife Service Aquatic Species Conservation Fund

• Salmon and Clearwater River Basins Habitat Fund

A myriad of habitat restoration projects are being constructed/implemented in other parts of the upper Salmon River basin. These projects have been coordinated with the local communities and water users through the Upper Salmon River Basin Watershed Program and predecessor programs, including the model watersheds. Furthermore, the Snake River Water Rights Agreement of 2004 contemplates the development of additional conservation plans for other upper Salmon River basin watersheds. Accordingly, the Comprehensive State Water Plan revised by the IWRB contains policies for the Salmon River basin that focus on the protection and restoration of instream habitat for ESA-listed species through voluntary participation in conservation programs.

Because of the ESA-listed species recovery efforts in the upper Salmon River basin, IDWR must determine on a case-by-case basis whether it is in the local public interest to authorize proposed water uses that would further deplete flow-limited stream reaches.

Pursuant to Rule 40.04.c of the Water Appropriation Rules (IDAPA 37.03.08.040.04.c), the applicant has the ultimate burden of persuasion regarding the items that must be evaluated in connection with each water right application. Before proceeding further with your application, IDWR requests you submit additional information about how your proposal invokes any local public interest concerns for ESA species recovery.

Within 30 days, please submit any additional information you believe IDWR may need to evaluate and determine the local public interest in the water you propose to divert and use. If IDWR has not received a response from you within 30 days, IDWR will assume you have no comment regarding the local public interest, and processing of your application will resume with the information currently on file. Processing will include public notice and the potential for formal protests by other interested parties. Applications that are not in the local public interest will be denied. If you wish to withdraw your application before it is processed, please notify IDWR in writing.
