

I am writing this letter in protest of Greg Johnsons request to transfer his existing water right #63-32616 transfer request #83875. I live in the Danskin Properties on Regina Road. This is directly next to the proposed Mayfield Springs planned community of 2500 homes as well as a shopping center and school. Water that has been allocated for agriculture needs to stay for agriculture. As you are aware, we are in a drought situation in Custer and Elmore counties. Boise will be supplying water to Custer and Elmore is looking to Anderson Ranch for water. Agriculture land is at risk of being eliminated if water is constantly diverted to houses and shopping centers. We rely on the bare land to supply food. The proposed community will use in excess of 26,260,000 gallons of water per month. How fast does our aquifer replenish itself? Not to mention the individual wells that could be affected if the planned community uses more water than anticipated. Is Greg Johnson going to guarantee that none of the individual wells will be affected. Agriculture water is used at a slower rate than water used by a planned community. Water by this community will be used 12 months a year whereas agriculture water is used during planting season and has time to replenish itself.

I am encouraging you to deny Greg Johnson's water transfer application 83875 for the reasons I have listed above. Water is becoming more and more scarce. If we have more years like this year, our water tables will decrease faster than they already have.
