This matter having come before the Department of Water Resources (Department) as a result of an application to transfer water rights, the Department finds, concludes, and orders as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. On January 4, 2019, Chris Unruh (Applicant) applied to the Department for authorization to change the 42.0 acre place of use for 0.83 cubic feet per second of water diverted from the Snake River for irrigation purposes in Owyhee County in accordance with decreed Water Right 2-10201. The application for transfer was designated No. 82946 by the Department.
- 2. On June 10, 2019, the Department mailed the Applicant a letter requesting documentation demonstrating the authority to make changes to water right 2-10201. Current Owyhee County tax lot data suggests 14 acres within the place of use is owned by Theodore and Sandra Cantrell. In the letter, the Department informed the Applicant that if they did not respond to the request within 30 days, the Department would reject the application for transfer.
- 3. On September 16, 2019, the Department mailed the Applicant a letter confirming concerns of authority to make changes to water right 2-10201. The letter outlined options to provide additional information, pursue changes to the right for a portion of the water right or withdraw application for transfer No. 82946. The letter granted the Applicant 30 days to respond.
- 4. On December 18, 2019, the Department mailed the Applicant a second letter reiterating the concerns of authority to make changes to water right 2-10201 and the options for the Applicant to pursue with the application for transfer. In the letter, the Department informed the Applicant if they did not respond to the request within 30 days, the Department would reject the application for transfer.
- 5. As of this date, the Department has not received a response from the Applicant to the request for additional information and/or modification of Application for Transfer No. 82946.
- 6. Idaho Code § 42-222(1) states that a person "entitled to the use of water" may apply to the Department to change certain elements of the authorized water use.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. Idaho Code Idaho Code § 42-222(1) requires that an applicant must be "entitled to the use of water" as part of their authority to make the changes proposed in an application for transfer. If the applicant does not have the authority to make the changes to the water rights proposed in the application for transfer, or if the Department is not able to verify that they have such authority, the proposed change cannot be approved, and any further analysis is moot.
- 2. The Applicant has not responded or provided information to establish the authority to make the changes proposed in Application for Transfer No. 82946 and the Department cannot confirm the Applicant has the authority based on available information.
- 3. The Department should reject Application for Transfer No. 82946.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Application for Transfer No. 82946 in the name of Chris Unruh is **REJECTED** without prejudice.

EXPLANATORY INFORMATION TO ACCOMPANY A PRELIMINARY ORDER

(To be used in connection with actions when a hearing was **not** held)

(Required by Rule of Procedure 730.02)

The accompanying order or approved document is a "Preliminary Order" issued by the department pursuant to section 67-5243, Idaho Code. It can and will become a final order without further action of the Department of Water Resources ("department") unless a party petitions for reconsideration, files an exception and brief, or requests a hearing as further described below:

PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION

Any party may file a petition for reconsideration of a preliminary order with the department within fourteen (14) days of the service date of this order. Note: the petition must be <u>received</u> by the department within this fourteen (14) day period. The department will act on a petition for reconsideration within twenty-one (21) days of its receipt, or the petition will be considered denied by operation of law. See Section 67-5243(3) Idaho Code.

EXCEPTIONS AND BRIEFS

Within fourteen (14) days after: (a) the service date of a preliminary order, (b) the service date of a denial of a petition for reconsideration from this preliminary order, or (c) the failure within twenty-one (21) days to grant or deny a petition for reconsideration from this preliminary order, any party may in writing support or take exceptions to any part of a preliminary order and may file briefs in support of the party's position on any issue in the proceeding with the Director. Otherwise, this preliminary order will become a final order of the agency.

REQUEST FOR HEARING

Unless a right to a hearing before the Department or the Water Resource Board is otherwise provided by statute, any person aggrieved by any final decision, determination, order or action of the Director of the Department and who has not previously been afforded an opportunity for a hearing on the matter may request a hearing pursuant to section 42-1701A(3), Idaho Code. A written petition contesting the action of the Director and requesting a hearing shall be filed within fifteen (15) days after receipt of the denial or conditional approval.

ORAL ARGUMENT

If the Director grants a petition to review the preliminary order, the Director shall allow all parties an opportunity to file briefs in support of or taking exceptions to the preliminary order and may schedule oral argument in the matter before issuing a final order. If oral arguments are to be heard, the Director will within a reasonable time period notify each party of the place, date and hour for the argument of the case. Unless the Director orders otherwise, all oral arguments will be heard in Boise, Idaho.

CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE

All exceptions, briefs, requests for oral argument and any other matters filed with the Director in connection with the preliminary order shall be served on all other parties to the proceedings in accordance with IDAPA Rules 37.01.01302 and 37.01.01303 (Rules of Procedure 302 and 303).

FINAL ORDER

The Director will issue a final order within fifty-six (56) days of receipt of the written briefs, oral argument or response to briefs, whichever is later, unless waived by the parties or for good cause shown. The Director may remand the matter for further evidentiary hearings if further factual development of the record is necessary before issuing a final order. The department will serve a copy of the final order on all parties of record.

Section 67-5246(5), Idaho Code, provides as follows:

Unless a different date is stated in a final order, the order is effective fourteen (14) days after its service date if a party has not filed a petition for reconsideration. If a party has filed a petition for reconsideration with the agency head, the final order becomes effective when:

- (a) The petition for reconsideration is disposed of; or
- (b) The petition is deemed denied because the agency head did not dispose of the petition within twenty-one (21) days.

APPEAL OF FINAL ORDER TO DISTRICT COURT

Pursuant to sections 67-5270 and 67-5272, Idaho Code, if this preliminary order becomes final, any party aggrieved by the final order or orders previously issued in this case may appeal the final order and all previously issued orders in this case to district court by filing a petition in the district court of the county in which:

- i. A hearing was held,
- ii. The final agency action was taken,
- iii. The party seeking review of the order resides, or
- iv. The real property or personal property that was the subject of the agency action is located.

The appeal must be filed within twenty-eight (28) days of this preliminary order becoming final. See section 67-5273, Idaho Code. The filing of an appeal to district court does not itself stay the effectiveness or enforcement of the order under appeal.

On June 10, 2019 I sent you a letter to let you know that a part of water right 2-10201 appeared to be appurtenant to land owned by someone other than yourself, and you may not have the authority to make changes to that portion of the right. We spoke on the phone shortly after and you asked me to look into the history of the file. After a review of the history of the water right, it appears that the water right has always been appurtenant to the ground on which it is now authorized. On January 4, 2019 the Idaho Dept. of Water Resources received your application (application for transfer) to change the place of use for water right 2-10201. The Department advertised your application on April 3 and April 10, 2019 and did not receive any protests. The next step in the transfer approval process is to evaluate your proposed changes to the water right in accordance with 42-222 Idaho Code.

Part of the Department's evaluation is to determine if the applicant is the current owner of the right to be changed, i.e. if the applicant has the authority to file the application. Water rights are considered appurtenant to the land on which they were historically used unless otherwise noted on a conveyance document in the sale of the land.

For the purposes of your application, it appears that 14 acres of irrigation authorized by right 2-10201 are on land owned by Theodore and Sandra Cantrell. If you withheld the water right in the deed when you sold this land, you may still be the current owner of this portion of the water right. It that is the case, please provide the appropriate conveyance document demonstrating that you withheld the water right from sale of the land. However, if you did not withhold the water right during the sale of the land you may not be the legal owner of the right and therefore do not have the authority to make changes to those 14 acres of irrigation rights. If you did not withhold the water rights when you sold the land please contact me to discuss amendments that are required to your application.
