IDWR has committed to applying one of two conditions to trust water rights. These two conditions are as follows...

When the minimum stream flow water rights in the Snake River at Murphy Gage are not being satisfied, the right holder shall cease diverting water for the consumptive uses authorized by this right. The minimum stream flow water rights are for 3,900 cfs from April 1 through October 31 and 5,600 cfs from November 1 through March 31. See IDAPA 37.03.08.030.

Or

Administration of this right to satisfy the minimum stream flow water rights in the Snake River at Murphy Gage shall not be required because use of water pursuant to this right is either non-consumptive or the right holder is required to provide ongoing mitigation to offset the depletion of water resulting from the use of this right.

The first condition applies to consumptive uses and the second condition applies to non-consumptive uses (or consumptive uses that are mitigated). Of the two conditions, the second seems most appropriate in my mind considering the water use proposed by this particular application.

The only question that gives me pause is #9 which deals with the Swan Falls Agreement. In the pending Buckeye permit applications the cities have identified a scenario where the diversion of groundwater could cause a breach of the minimum flows at Murphy Gage even though the use of water is non-consumptive. In light of this my inclination is that condition #9 should not be included in the BLCC permit. What are your thoughts on this?
