

EXPLANATORY INFORMATION TO ACCOMPANY A PRELIMINARY ORDER

(To be used in connection with actions when a hearing was **not** held)

(Required by Rule of Procedure 730.02)

The accompanying order or approved document is a "Preliminary Order" issued by the department pursuant to section 67-5243, Idaho Code. <u>It can and will become a final order without further action of the Department of Water Resources ("department") unless a party petitions for reconsideration, files an exception and brief, or requests a hearing as further described below:</u>

PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION

Any party may file a petition for reconsideration of a preliminary order with the department within fourteen (14) days of the service date of this order. Note: the petition must be <u>received</u> by the department within this fourteen (14) day period. The department will act on a petition for reconsideration within twenty-one (21) days of its receipt, or the petition will be considered denied by operation of law. See Section 67-5243(3) Idaho Code.

EXCEPTIONS AND BRIEFS

Within fourteen (14) days after: (a) the service date of a preliminary order, (b) the service date of a denial of a petition for reconsideration from this preliminary order, or (c) the failure within twenty-one (21) days to grant or deny a petition for reconsideration from this preliminary order, any party may in writing support or take exceptions to any part of a preliminary order and may file briefs in support of the party's position on any issue in the proceeding with the Director. Otherwise, this preliminary order will become a final order of the agency.

REQUEST FOR HEARING

Unless a right to a hearing before the Department or the Water Resource Board is otherwise provided by statute, any person aggrieved by any final decision, determination, order or action of the Director of the Department and who has not previously been afforded an opportunity for a hearing on the matter may request a hearing pursuant to section 42-1701A(3), Idaho Code. A written petition contesting the action of the Director and requesting a hearing shall be filed within fifteen (15) days after receipt of the denial or conditional approval.

ORAL ARGUMENT

If the Director grants a petition to review the preliminary order, the Director shall allow all parties an opportunity to file briefs in support of or taking exceptions to the preliminary order and may schedule oral argument in the matter before issuing a final order. If oral arguments are to be heard, the Director will within a reasonable time period notify each party of the place, date and hour for the argument of the case. Unless the Director orders otherwise, all oral arguments will be heard in Boise, Idaho.

CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE

All exceptions, briefs, requests for oral argument and any other matters filed with the Director in connection with the preliminary order shall be served on all other parties to the proceedings in accordance with IDAPA Rules 37.01.01302 and 37.01.01303 (Rules of Procedure 302 and 303).

FINAL ORDER

The Director will issue a final order within fifty-six (56) days of receipt of the written briefs, oral argument or response to briefs, whichever is later, unless waived by the parties or for good cause shown. The Director may remand the matter for further evidentiary hearings if further factual development of the record is necessary before issuing a final order. The department will serve a copy of the final order on all parties of record.

Section 67-5246(5), Idaho Code, provides as follows:

Unless a different date is stated in a final order, the order is effective fourteen (14) days after its service date if a party has not filed a petition for reconsideration. If a party has filed a petition for reconsideration with the agency head, the final order becomes effective when:

- (a) The petition for reconsideration is disposed of; or
- (b) The petition is deemed denied because the agency head did not dispose of the petition within twenty-one (21) days.

APPEAL OF FINAL ORDER TO DISTRICT COURT

Pursuant to sections 67-5270 and 67-5272, Idaho Code, if this preliminary order becomes final, any party aggrieved by the final order or orders previously issued in this case may appeal the final order and all previously issued orders in this case to district court by filing a petition in the district court of the county in which:

- i. A hearing was held,
- ii. The final agency action was taken,
- iii. The party seeking review of the order resides, or
- iv. The real property or personal property that was the subject of the agency action is located.

The appeal must be filed within twenty-eight (28) days of this preliminary order becoming final. See section 67-5273, Idaho Code. The filing of an appeal to district court does not itself stay the effectiveness or enforcement of the order under appeal.

Dear Mr. Bradbury,

I understand there is some concern at the regional level that granting an additional point of diversion for water rights 65-1131A, 65-12721 and 65-22350 could allow an enlargement. In my conversations with Mr. Kelsey I can testify this is not his intention. Instead, delivery by pumping is intended to be a backup method when canal delivery fails.

The Smith Ditch delivers water to the Kelsey property and is not managed constantly. The result is flow rates that range from too much to not enough. I would not oppose a secondary point of diversion where a pump system could supplement during times of scarcity. I believe the financial burden of operation a pump will insure that pumping on top of sufficient flow through the canal system should not take place.

I do not oppose this request for an additional point of diversion.

Mr. Bradbury,

Thank you for your email reply.

There would be no economically feasable way for me to pump year round for wildlife and irrigation, so I would have to keep my Ditch gravity flow to keep the property supplied most of the time, and the additional POD's on this application would only be used when my water in the Ditch has been overused or diverted by upstream users dropping my water to insufficient levels to keep the fish and wildlife alive. I therefore could not afford to abandon the Ditch POD for economic reasons.

Having said this, I have been working with several water delivery design companies to best solve the problem. My intention is to measure flow and/or level at the Ditch coming onto the property, and if the flow/level drops below a certain point, then turn the pumps on until Ditch flow is again supplying my water right, then turn them off again. I am the last user on the DItch so this does not affect any downstream users. In fact, all water that flows onto my property for the wildlife, flows back into the river at the bottom of the last pond. I am not a pump expert, but am told that it would not be difficult to accomplish setting a pump to run as a supplement to bring my supply to a certain level without overpumping or enlarging, and that there are various ways to accomplish flow maintenance while avoiding enlargement in general.

Mr. Shurtleff is well aware of the Ditch supply problem to my property, and I spoke to him about the Department's concerns regarding enlargement this morning. I believe he is supportive of my efforts to maintain flow by adding a pump at my property as a supplement, while keeping the Ditch gravity flow open to alleviate burden of the cost of pumping year round. We discussed various options moving forward that I think he believes would work. I am happy to work with him on an ongoing basis to ensure the process does not result in enlargement. I have copied him on this email so that he can be involved in this process as you have suggested, and I have asked him to provide a letter to you regarding his position on this matter.

Mr. Kelsey,

After regional management review of your transfer application, I have received it back with continued concerns about enlargement. The particular concern is that you will have multiple diversions from the same source. Which means you could potentially divert water from the ditch and the pumps at the same

time, which would be considered enlargement. The Department wants to know what controls will be in place to prevent diversion of water from both points-of-diversion (POD's). One potential solution is to abandon the POD from the ditch. Another route may be to contact the Water District 65 (WD65) water master, Ron Shurtleff. The Department would need to know whether or not Mr. Shurtleff is in support of having both POD's and whether he thinks this situation could be managed in a way to avoid enlargement. The Department would need a letter from WD65 confirming their position on the matter. I have included Mr. Shurtleff's contact information below.

Dear Mr. Bradbury,

This letter is in reply to your letter of Sept 3, 2019 in which IDWR stated its concern about potential enlargement issues related to my application for transfer to a new diversion point(s). I do not believe that enlargement is an issue with my application for two reasons. First, water availability at the current point of diversion at the head of the Smith Ditch is on the main channel of the Payette River, is quite substantial and reliable, and is consistently available year round. My property, and the new points of diversion that I am requesting are just a mile or so downstream along the same Payette River source. For this reason, I do not believe there is any availability change to the water supply at any of these points along the Payette, and that adding these new points of diversion would therefore not result in an enlargement.

Next, my request for the additional points of diversion are due to Ditch delivery problems. I am the last user on the Ditch. Water is first used by the Woodgrain Mill, then 3 or 4 other downstream users, then lastly myself. Because I am the last user on the Ditch, I am highly subject to the taking of water by users upstream from me, including the Mill, which has a very large water right, and sometimes takes its water intermittently. This problem has become a significant issue since they received a large water right split from Boise Cascade a couple of years ago that has allowed them to use the Smith Ditch for delivery of their large water right. With such a large and intermittent water use by the Mill, and without close daily monitoring and adjustment of the head gate my supply varies greatly day to day. I am also subject to intermittent tampering of the Ditch control points, including the head gate and overflow diversions back to the river, and have had to involve Law Enforcement to assist in gaining access to these control points to keep my water right supplied. For these and other reasons, the inconsistent delivery of water in my water right is solely a Ditch related issue, and not an availability or reliability issue with water availability at the existing POD. In addition, I have the only year round water right on the Ditch, which is particularly important as a good portion of that right is for wildlife ponds. I have had several incidents where water was diverted or a gate was locked, and we experienced a fish die off.
