Dear James,

This is a follow-up to your letter of April 5, 2013 requesting more information on the pending application. This letter answers your questions listed in that letter. There are also several other things that I would like to bring to your attention as you go through the approval process for my Permit No. 34-7511.

One item discussed again was the requirement to leave an amount of water in the canal equal to the shrink and to determine the shrink over the past 5 years. The shrink in the Arco Canal for the last 5 years is shown in the attachment. Notice that the percent shrink has decreased from the 40s to the 20s because of better management of the canal.

Leaving shrink water in the canal is understandable if it was consistent across the entire District, but it is not and I know each application is unique. You provided me with a copy of Permit 34-14101 where they were in and out in the same ditch but I have 2 others attached that are not (34-7595 and 34-13763). However, if I am shrinking it in the canal, then I should get credit for it because if I don't get credit for it, then people with wells will use it without any mitigation on their part and not have to pay for any shrinkage. Where do well owners get their water? From my shrink not from any mitigation as is required of me.

There are <sup>3</sup>~~two~~ examples attached (34-13791 and 34-2374B) <sup>34-2452</sup> that I know of and I am sure there are more, where in 2002 these individuals were allowed to drill supplemental wells to be used only if their surface water rights were curtailed and they have been using the wells. I would be content to just have a supposedly supplemental well. All I want is a dependable water supply to 100 acres not expand my irrigated acres as we are seeing everywhere in this valley. Do I need a new application so I can to do this?

I am not sure you really read my first letter. It seems like all the examples I gave were not addressed or even considered. There are numerous examples of people who have avoided shrink that was pointed out in the last letter.

Every surface water user suffers some type of shrinkage where most ground users do not. Some surface water users like on the Burnett Canal, lose as high as 70% of their allocated surface water and where does this water go; ground water. How is this equitable especially where some surface water users are not allowed to drill a well to supplement their surface water while others are (example above) and the surface water users supply the water to the wells? How can all these wells keep being drilled when they do not have to provide any mitigation and yet there is significant expansion of irrigated acres that have never been under irrigation? If interested, I can give you a tour.

I have requested to mitigate my surface water by putting it in the head of Spring Creek. The Big Lost River Irrigation District owns the Spring Creek heading and there would be no problem with putting the mitigation water there. If needed, I could send a copy of board approval. You also suggest that maybe the water I am putting into the ground up the valley will be pumped out by wells that are located between my purposed mitigation site and the site of retrieval before it can be retrieved. If that is the case, why are the wells allowed to take my mitigation water and where is their mitigation water so they can pump ground water????

There has been no water in the Ferris Sloughs since the 1970s because all the increased pumping of ground water since that date has kept the sloughs dry by using the ground water and thus preventing rising water. This is substantiated by IDWR in Rule 050 **Conjunctive Administration of Ground Water and Surface Water Rights**

Please provide me with a written response to address the issues mentioned above and what additional hurdles I have to address in order to get final approval of this application. I understand there is a change in IDWR philosophy and each application is unique, as I try to develop an adequate dependable water supply to one of the oldest farm grounds in the valley that has the earliest water right that is in the Irrigation District. Thanks for your consideration.
