Attachment A: Idaho Conservation League's protest of application for Permit No. 1-10613, in the name of the Idaho Water Resource Board

Basis of Protest

Pursuant to Idaho Code § 42-203A(4) & (5)(e)&(g), the Idaho Conservation League respectfully protests the above referenced application.

As an initial matter, ICL acknowledges the potential benefits of managed aquifer recharge as well as the stated managed aquifer recharge goals of the Eastern Snake Plain Aquifer Comprehensive Aquifer Management Plan. However, unless this application is conditioned appropriately, ICL contends that this use of water threatens fish and wildlife populations.

Additionally, ICL is concerned that this use of water will negatively affect water quality. It both threatens compliance with regulations put in place by the Total Maximum Daily Loads of pollutants allowed in multiple reaches of the Snake River and threatens groundwater quality, which, in turn, poses a threat to drinking water supplies.

What would resolve this Protest?

ICL's basis for protest might be resolved by:

- Establishment of the Managed Recharge Environmental Consultation Committee that is described in the application. Committee topics would need to include: the effect of timing on aquatic habitat; the effect of reduced flow amounts on aquatic habitat; annual or biannual streamflow analysis; the effects of reduced flow on instream water quality; protection of groundwater quality; and possibly other topics.
- Establishment of funding for the Committee.
- Establishment of greater groundwater quality monitoring.
- Establishment of a percentage of instream flows in conjunction with recharge.

This list is open to modification, and ICL looks forward to discussing options with the IWRB and its counsel in efforts to resolve our protest.
