Roger: Your approach to "fixing" the application sounds good. Please have the applicant send you back the original copy with his initials - not a faxed version - or you can have them mail it directly to me if you would like to.

On applications where the folks have filed on too many acres I normally don't worry about it. When we do the licensing exam we will find out how many acres are developed and can issue the license for actual development. I would just make the shape as close to what is mapped out and call it good. If the acreages don't match, I would then data enter what was filed on without having to reduce lands or quantity. I don't know that I am politically correct in my thinking but it has worked so far. Thanks. Kay

Roger:

In first review of this application, and discussion with Shelley, we have issues that need resolved on this application before permitting.

Applicant filed on 23 acres of land and 0.46 cfs.

Lands were GIS'd and discovered to be only 18 acres which were marked on application in pencil and the 23 acres applicant filed on were crossed out.

Application was advertised as being 18 acres and 0.46 cfs.

Front of application form has rate applicant filed on (0.46cfs) penciled out and 0.32 cfs penciled in.

There are no indications that the applicant was notified of any of these changes.

Pursuant to Admin. Memo - Application Processing No. 9 - "Changes to applications for permit must be made by the applicant, not by department staff."

What do you propose we do with this application now? Do you want to solicit an amended application from the applicant so that he is informed of what we are doing? I was preparing to issue a permit for 18 acres and 0.36 cfs but Shelley says we cannot issue a permit that is not in accordance with the application. I am attaching Admin. Memo - Application Processing No. 9, for your convenience. Please read and advise your staff that this guideline is out there.
