3. jstanton 10/8/2003 Comment/Analysis

Comment: The exact purpose of this application was unclear, so I called Mr. Nagy. He said that they just want water for some outside irrigation around their cabin, as they already have a license for culinary use from a nearby spring. They did apply for the standard domestic diversion rate, but I do not know if this would be considered as excess flow for under 1/2 acre of outside irrigation; I did not discuss this issue with Mr. Nagy, but it may have to be looked at later. I told him about the moratorium, and said that that issue would hopefully be resolved within a few months (as opposed to years). I added comments to the application based on our conversation. Lime Creek is technically a tributary of Warm Springs Creek, but is shown as an intermittent stream in its lower reaches. The 2 streams join about 3 miles below the applicant property. So it appears that this project will have little measurable effect on Warm Springs Creek (which is used for irrigation and other purposes). So it may be possible to approve this application once the moratorium is lifted (subject to prior rights, of course).
