- 3. Prior to the diversion and use of water under Transfer approval 69339, the right holder shall install and maintain acceptable measuring device(s), including data logger(s), at the authorized point(s) of diversion, in accordance with Department specifications.
- 4. Use of water under this right will be regulated by a watermaster with responsibility for the distribution of water among appropriators within a water district. At the time of this approval, this water right is within State Water District No. 130.
- Prior to diversion of water under this approval, the right holder shall provide a lockable controlling works for all authorized points of diversion. The controlling works must be suitable for control of the diversions and acceptable to the watermaster.
- 6. Right holder shall comply with the drilling permit requirements of Section 42-235, Idaho Code and applicable Well Construction Rules of the Department.
- Commercial use is for a dairy with barn located in the NWSE, S36, T6S, R14E.
- 8. The place of commercial use authorized by this approval includes land upon which wastewater may be applied for irrigation purposes to satisfy water quality requirements. Water diverted under this approval shall not be used for irrigation unless the water is first used in the dairy as authorized by these water rights.
- 9. Prior to the diversion of water under this approval, the right holder shall comply with applicable water quality standards of the Department of Environmental Quality.

Such gains have not been quantified at this time. The right holder retains the right to seek quantification of such gains resulting from this transfer approval. Protestants retain the right to object to the quantification of such gains. If such reach gains are quantified and acknowledged by the Department, credits for such gains shall be available for use only after the Department has implemented a system for administering such credits.
- 13. The right holder shall accomplish the change authorized by this transfer within one (1) year of the date of this approval.
- 14. Failure of the right holder to comply with the conditions of this transfer is cause for the Director to rescind approval of the transfer.
- 15. Pursuant to Section 42-1412(6), Idaho Code, this water right is subject to such general provisions necessary for the definition of the rights or for the efficient administration of water rights as may be determined by the Snake River Basin Adjudication court at a point in time no later than the entry of the final unified decree.

Memo Recommending Approval of Variance of a Device Requirement

A request for variance has been received from Kevin Lott, General Manager of the Travelers' Oasis Truck Plaza in Eden, Idaho. Transfer 69053 contains conditions of approval requiring an approved measuring device and data logger to be installed on an existing well. Mr. Lott requests a variance to continue using the meter which is presently installed on the system.

I have conducted a field check of this flow meter and operating system. The system pumps from a single well to an array of pressure tanks and serves a truck stop, restaurant, convenience store and food court, trucker lounge and showers and a few outdoor faucets for patron use. There is no irrigation use.

The flow meter which is installed on the system is of an undetermined age, but is operating well within specified accuracy limits. A timed volume test using a standard polysonic meter resulted in a calibration factor of 1.03 (2.9% below standard). The flow meter is installed upstream of the pressure tanks and is therefore not subject to low velocity flow. The system operates at a flow of approximately 35 gallons per minute in a cyclic pattern. The odometer capacity (100 million gallons) is sufficient to prevent rollover. There is no instantaneous flow scale, but a sweep hand may be timed to determine an approximate rate of flow.

Odometer readings are taken on a daily basis by the maintenance supervisor or his staff. Readily available data indicate that total withdrawals from Jan 30, 2003 to April 17, 2003 were 2.9 acre-feet. Projected over a full year, total withdrawals are about 15 acre-feet. The authorized transfered volume is 23.7 acre-feet.

I RECOMMEND APPROVAL of this request for variance, with the conditions that all reporting is submitted in a complete and timely fashion, and the meter be re-tested in two years.

The accompanying order or approved document is a "Preliminary Order" issued by the department pursuant to section 67-5243, Idaho Code. It can and will become a final order without further action of the Department of Water Resources (department) unless a party petitions for reconsideration, files an exception and brief, or requests a hearing as further described below:

PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION

Any party may file a petition for reconsideration of a preliminary order with the department within fourteen (14) days of the service date of this order. The department will act on a petition for reconsideration within twenty-one (21) days of its receipt, or the petition will be considered denied by operation of law. See Section 67-5243(3) Idaho Code.

EXCEPTIONS AND BRIEFS

Within fourteen (14) days after (a) the service date of a preliminary order, (b) the service date of a denial of a petition for reconsideration from this preliminary order, or (c) the failure within twenty-one (21) days to grant or deny a petition for reconsideration from this preliminary order, any party may in writing support or take exceptions to any part of a preliminary order and may file briefs in support of the party's position on any issue in the proceeding with the Director. Otherwise, this preliminary order will become a final order of the agency.

REQUEST FOR HEARING

Unless a right to a hearing before the department or the Idaho Water Resource Board (Board) is otherwise provided by statute, any person aggrieved by any final decision, determination, order or action of the Director of the department and who has not previously been afforded an opportunity for a hearing on the matter may request a hearing pursuant to section 42-1701A(3), Idaho Code. FINAL ORDER

The Director will issue a final order within fifty-six (56) days of receipt of the written briefs, oral argument or response to briefs, whichever is later, unless waived by the parties or for good cause shown. The department will serve a copy of the final order on all parties of record.

Kevin Lott from the truck stop called. He indicated Mr. Willie wanted him to call me. We discussed that I needed ownership records for the place of use. In discussing the business name he indicated that they created recently created an LLC and it is in the name of "Danso". I looked it up and it is there.

Another issue we discussed was Corbin going out and doing the FE. I told him Corbin would be contacting them soon asking questions about the use and probably taking information about the wells and probably tag and GPS them. He indicated that there is now only one well. He indicated that there used to be two but one was in the parking lot near gas tanks and they abandoned it. He indicated that there is one large well serving the truck stop that serves the permits and the transfer. He indicated there is a small domestic type well in back of the property serving a truck repair shop. He indicated that well is not connected to the truck stop and they do not plan to connect it. As I recall when we issued the drilling permit it was intended to be separate and not part of the permits. I requested that Mr. Willie write us a letter and request the transfer be modified to just one well.

Evaluation of Sufficiency

Evaluation of Sufficiency of Information Submitted (Transfer 69053 in the name of Dan Willie)

This transfer initially proposes to dry up 8.75 acres of land (rounded to 8.8 by IDWR), which is a portion of a PPU of 372 acres on the Larsen Farm. The water used for irrigation is proposed to be converted to commercial uses at an existing truck stop covered under decree 36-7045 and permits 36-8766 and 36-8767. The transfer moves the water across the ESPA approximately 23 miles down gradient toward the SW to the site of the truck stop where the water will be combined with the existing rights. The transfer does not propose to drill any new wells at the site of the truck stop but to divert the water from the existing wells. The water being transferred is assumed to be totally consumptive. Note that permit 36-8767 was processed on the basis that it was non-consumptive with documentation in file showing water is wasted through drain fields back to ground water.

Authority to File:

The subject land involved in transfer is owned by John and Vivian Larsen. The file contains an agreement for purchase and sale of subject lands from John and Vivian Larsen to Del Kohtz. Also in the file is an agreement for purchase and sale of 0.10 cfs of water from subject rights from Del Kohtz to Dan Willie. (0.10 cfs equates to 8.8 acres of the original place of use)

The subject land involved in the mitigation plan is owned by Vernon and Marilyn Phillips. The file contains an agreement for purchase and sale of subject lands from Vernon and Marilyn Phillips to Del Kohtz. Also in the file is an agreement for purchase and sale of 68.5 af of appurtenant water rights from Del Kohtz to Dan Willie. 68.5 af a equates to 30.2 acres of the original place of use based on the historical use volume of 2.27 afa/acre.

Water Right Validity:

All rights involved in the transfer have been recently decreed in the SRBA with dates of partial decrees ranging from 12/1996 to 1/1998. Forfeiture does not appear to be an issue. Included with the application are documents evidencing the recent use of the irrigation rights in years 1996 through 2000.

All rights involved for mitigation are recommended in the SRBA pending before the court. Included in the file are documents evidencing the recent use of the irrigation rights in years 1994, 1995 and 1998 through 2002. The three rights based on licenses were partially decreed; however, due to a typographical error, they were returned to the court to be corrected and have not yet been re-decreed. The fourth right is an enlargement right objected to by parties over the enlargement language. This objection is still pending before the SRBA court.

Injury to Other Water Rights:

Included with the application is a proposed mitigation plan prepared by Brockway Engineering. The plan is based on modeling of the ESPA and involves a stepped reduction of use of the mitigation rights

at the Phillips farm. The plan acknowledges the historical use of the Larsen rights and acknowledges the reduced volume available to be pumped at the truck stop.

Enlargement of Use:

Due to the irrigation rights being changed to commercial needs an analysis of the historical use information has been made for both the Larsen and Phillips farms. Based on this analysis the consumptive use allowable to be transferred from the Larsen farm should be limited to no more than 2.69 afa per acre of dried up land for conversion of nature of use. The 8.75 (8.8 acres as rounded) yields 23.7 afa at the truck stop. Likewise, the Phillips farm should be limited to no more than 2.27 afa per acre when figuring the consumptive impacts of the historical irrigation and how it will be used for mitigation.

Local Public Interest:

The truck stop has existed for many years and continues to provide jobs and tax base for local economy. No adverse impacts identified. Transfer is based on total consumption of water however it is likely a large portion of water diverted will be returned to aquifer through drain field since use of water at truck stop generates waste water from showers, cooking, cleaning and other activities at the truck stop.

Beneficial Use/Conservation of Water Resources:

No Issue Identified.

Review of the application finds there is no clear inconsistency with criteria set forth in Section 42-222 Idaho Code preventing processing of this application.

The application has been advertised and protested by Clear Springs. Negotiations continue regarding withdrawal of the protest.

Other issues: Ownership of the proposed place of use needs to be included in the file and the ownership record for all rights at the proposed truck stop may need to conform to land ownership.

Enclosed is a revised mitigation plan for the Dan Willie Transfer No 69503. The application for transfer proposed drying up 8.75 acres at the Larsen farm which would have allowed a transfer of 3.0 af/a of consumptive use or 26.25 af. Subsequent to that time, the historical consumptive use has been determined by the Department on the Larsen farm to be 2.69 acre feet per acre. With the dry up of 8.75 acres, the new allowed transferable consumptive use would be 23.5 af/a.

With the reduction in allowable consumptive use of 10 percent and the subsequent reduction in pumping to mitigate the hydrologic impacts on the springs entering the Snake River in the Milner-King Hill reach, the applicant cannot extract sufficient ground water to meet the requirements of the truck stop Therefore, the applicant is proposing to dry up additional acreage at the Phillips farm to mitigate for the make up for the consumptive use reduction and to mitigate for the hydrologic effects on the springs. The historical



consumptive use on the Phillips farm, located adjacent to the Larsen farm, has been determined to be 2.27 af/a.

The hydrologic analysis was performed with the modified Effects spreadsheet utilizing negative pumping at the Phillips farm to simulate the effect of drying up additional acres. For the analysis, it was assumed that water from 8.75 irrigated acres would be dried up at the Larsen farm under the transfer to achieve a continuous annual pumped transferable volume of 23.5 af/a. This 23.5 acre feet annual volume pumped would begin in 2003 and would not be decreased.


This analysis shows that the net effect on the Milner-King Hill springs can be mitigated by drying up an additional 30.2 acres at the Phillips farm for a period of two years after the commencement of new pumping in 2003. After this two year period, the required dry up of acres at the Phillips farm will decrease based on the attached schedule. The remaining acres could be irrigated beginning in 2005, sold and transferred, or offered for rent in the Water Bank.



Stipulations Regarding Mitigation Transfer Number 69053 Dan Willie December 2, 2002

1. Mitigation

The Applicant has agreed to reduce pumping of those water rights under this water right transfer and/or to dry up additional previously irrigated acreage at a nearby location (Phillips farm) in a quantity sufficient to assure that no additional impact to the Milner to King Hill reach is experienced. The quantity of reduced pumping and/or additional dry-up has been calculated and agreed to by the Parties. This reduction in pumping is in addition to the reduction resulting from the calculation of the consumptive use component of the water rights. The quantity of reduced pumping for each year and/or additional dryup is set out in the table(s) appended hereto. These mitigation requirements will be incorporated by the Department into the transfer approval and set out as permanent conditions on the affected water rights.

2. Monitoring of mitigation requirements

Discharge from the new well(s) will be monitored by the Applicant, in accordance with the Director's new water right transfer guidance or other applicable requirements as determined by the Director. The quantity of pumped volumes will be reported annually to IDWR.

3. Positive impacts on other reaches

The Department does not currently have a mechanism in place to recognize the positive impacts that a transfer may have on other river reaches within the Eastern Snake Plain Aquifer. The Applicant and the Protestant have agreed that no "reach credits" will be recognized in conjunction with the approval of this transfer at this time. The Parties have agreed, however, that if such "reach credits" are recognized in the future by the Department or other appropriate entity, the Applicant retains the right to apply for such credits based on this transfer. Likewise, the Protestant retains the right to oppose their recognition. If and when such credits are subsequently recognized, they will accumulate only from that point in time forward.

4. No reopening of mitigation calculation

The Applicant and the Protestant have agreed that the quantification of the mitigation obligation (as set out in the attached table(s)) will be permanent. The quantity of mitigation will not be subject to re-opening, re-examination, or re-calculation, except my mutual agreement and approval by the Department. This restriction applies even in the event that new data, new modeling or other information becomes available.

5. Substitute mitigation

As specified above, the mitigation will be provided in the form of reduced pumping and/or additional dry-up. No other method of achieving the mitigation may be substituted by the Applicant, except upon approval of the Department of an application for modification of the mitigation requirement as provided for by law. Moreover, the Protestant shall be given notice of such application.

In any event, the Protestant will not be required to accept any substitute form of mitigation that is less effective than the original mitigation. Specifically, any substitute mitigation must be "in kind" (meaning that it must provide a substitute supply of water—rather than some other kind of compensation—to make up for the depletions caused by the transfer), "in time" (meaning that the make-up water must be provided so as to reach the impacted area at the appropriate time to respond to the depletion caused by the transfer), and "in place" (meaning that the replacement must provide water to same area as the depletions are experienced). Finally, the substitute mitigation must provide water to the depleted impacted areas with the same degree of certainty and reliability as the original mitigation.

6. Consumptive use

The parties recognize that this transfer is premised upon the assumption of 100 percent consumptive use of water by the dairy. Consequently, the Applicant will be free to improve the efficiency of water use in the future or make other changes under those rights that reduce or eliminate any return flows, without providing further mitigation.
