
Gentlemen:

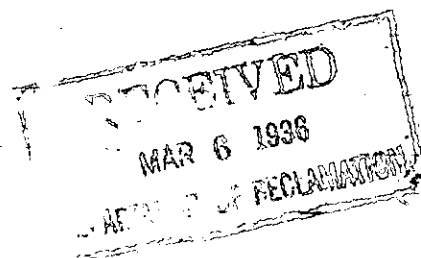

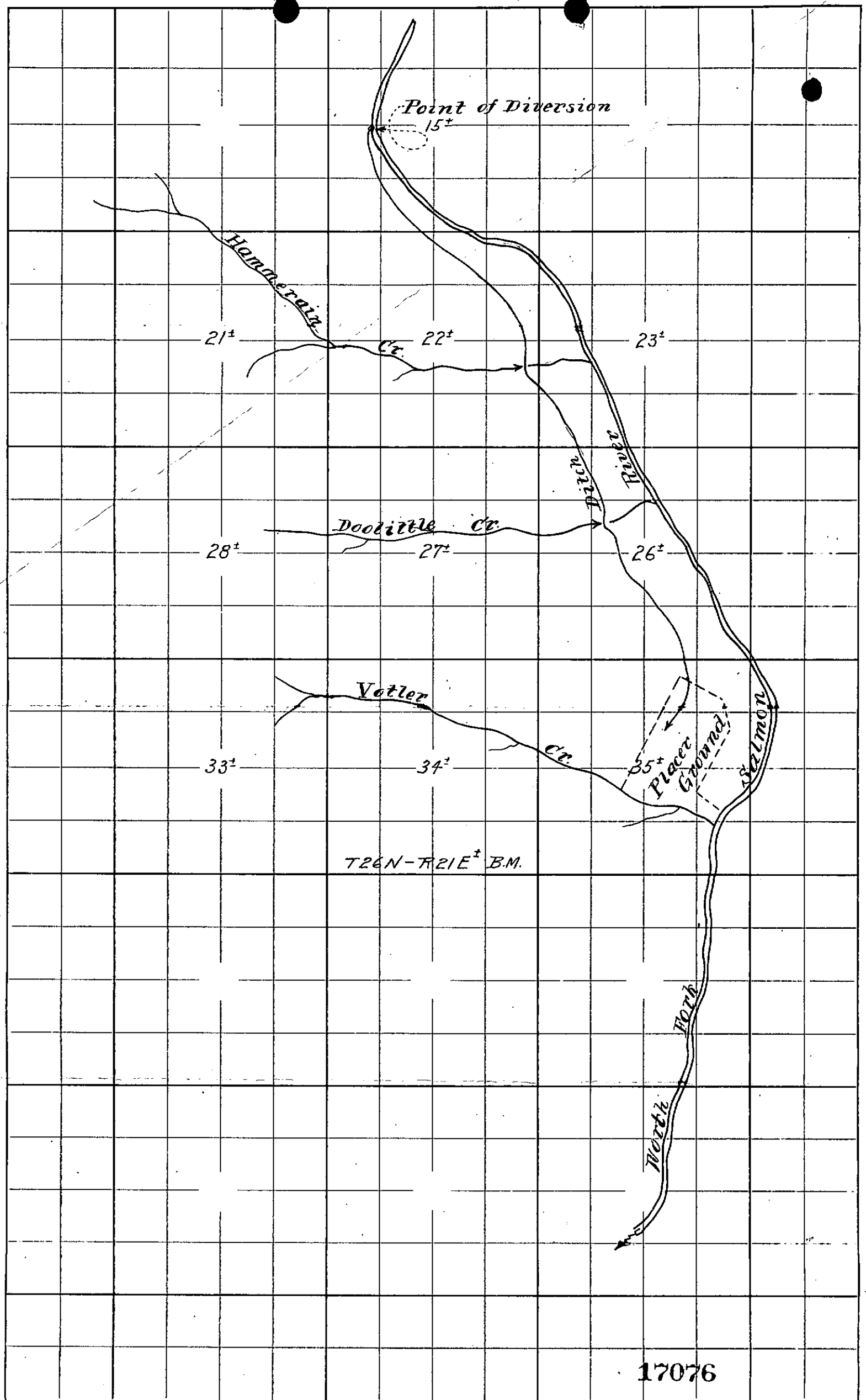

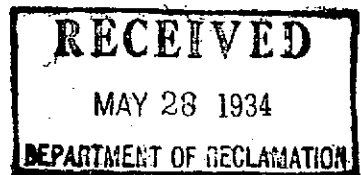

Dear Sir:

Under date of April 28, 1934, we received depositions which had been executed by Mr. Burrow and his two witnesses on the 28th day of April and also the affidavit of publication from the newspaper in connection with final proof under the above permit.

Accompanying these papers was an instrument conveying all of Mr. Shaw's interest in a certain mining claim to Mr. Burrow. Presumably, Mr. Shaw intended to convey his interest in Permit No. 17076 to Mr. Burrow but there is nothing in this instrument to indicate as much since there is no mention made of the permit or of any water rights. Therefore, we cannot accept it as a conveyance and for that reason we are enclosing a short form of Assignment which we suggest you have Mr. Shaw sign and return to this department. The permit can then be assigned on the department records and a license issued to Mr. Burrow. Since proof was made only in the name of Mr. Burrow it probably would be advisable to date the Assignment prior to the date when proof was offered.
