

RECEIVED 1999 Goose Creek Water District 78-C minutes

The annual meeting of the Goose Creek waterusers of District 78-C met at 2:00 PM on February 1, 1999 at the Scout Hall at New Meadows, Id. The meeting came to order with Dean Dryden, Chairman. Members present were, Dean Dryden, Alice Branstetter, Ed Raney, A.R. Krigbaum, Dick + Mary Clay, Sean McConnor, Jana Kerby, and Jeanette Farrell. Gene Gibson from Water Resources was also present.

The minutes from last year were read and approved. Nominations were then taken for officers. Ed made a motion that we retain the same officers as last year. Dick seconded. The motion was voted on and approved. The officers are as follows: Dean Dryden, Chairman, Jeanette Farrell, Secretary, and Jana Kerby, Treasurer. The advisory committee is to remain the same as well. They are: A.R. Krigbaum, Dick Clay, and Darrell Campbell. The Treasures report was then read and approved.

The issue of rock piles was then discussed. It was brought to everyone's attention that it is time to put rocks in the forks of the creek and the forks of the creek need to be fixed this spring.

The wage for the watermaster was discussed and Dick made a motion that the watermaster wages remain at \$25⁰⁰ per day. Sean seconded and it was approved by the floor.

The budget was then discussed and Dick made a motion that all waterusers

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all bills are to be paid as they come due. The motion was approved.

Dick made a motion that the next annual water meeting be held on February 1, 1999 at 2:00 P.m. Corky seconded and the motion was approved.

Dene Gibson was present and informed waterusers that funding has been reduced, therefore, permits are being issued from the office.

Dean mentioned the flooding that took place at camp stoves. He said the waterusers are not responsible for the adjacent property. The County/State may stockpile the rocks off the road for the water users at the beginning of the creek. The Fork of the river at Packer John may need more rock in the near future. It might be possible to get rock out of goose creek, however, Dene made note that round rocks will not work. Corky mentioned that for a short period of time (1 year) the rock may be stored at his rock pit.

Jack mentioned that there may be money left for willow brush or emergency water shed protection money left.

Dean made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Alice seconded and the motion was passed.
