

Skip Jones asked me to sit-in during a conference call with Ray Kagel because I had accompanied Skip to Hawley Creek to meet with Kelly Smith and take some pygmy current meter measurements.

Skip explained to Ray that the measurements the Smiths were taking were not perfect measurements, but were part of a Bureau of Rec. measurement book and the amount of water Skip and I measured was still well below the amount senior users were entitled to before the Kagels' water could be delivered. Skip also explained that the Smiths did not have to deliver to Kagel's because they didn't have a measuring device or a headgate.

Ray told Skip he knows a lot about stream flows and Nancy was going to measure other rancher's ditches w/ a Pygmy meter they had recently purchased. Skip told Ray that Nancy could measure other ditches if she had permission to go on others' property, but her measurements could not be used to make deliveries because she was not appointed Water Master of the State.

Ray was rather belligerent because he thought he was the only one who had to give a headgate, but Skip explained that it was up to the discretion of the District/Water Master.
