In the Matter of Creation of Water District No. 74, Lemhi River and Tributaries

ORDER

This matter having come before the Department of Water Resources (department) at the request of waterusers in the Lemhi River Drainage to form a water district on the Lemhi River, the Director of the department makes the following Findings of Pact, Conclusions of Law, and Order:

### FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Lemhi River is a tributary of the Salmon River in Lemhi County, Idaho.
- $2\,.$  On May 11, 1987, waterusers of the Lemhi River advised the department there was an immediate need for the regulation of waters being diverted from the Lemhi River.
- On December 30, 1982, the District Court of the Seventh Judicial District entered a partial decree in the case of The State of Idaho v. Mary A. Adams et. al. which included all the water rights in the Lemhi River Drainage except the water rights on Geertson Creek and its tributaries and the rights of the U.S.
- The surface water run off available for diversion and use during the water year of 1987 is substantially less than in normal water years
- 5. The department has the duty to supervise the distribution of Idaho's public waters pursuant to Section 42-602, Idaho Code; and further has been charged with the responsibility for creation of water districts pursuant to Section 42-604, Idaho Code.
- 6. There are a number of existing water districts in the Lembi River drainage which have been created in the past for the distribution of water. Inc existing water districts include the
  - 74-A Geertson Creek and tributaries 74-B Kirtley Creek and tributaries

  - 74-c Bohannon Creek and tributaries 74-F
  - Pratt Creek and tributaries
  - 74-G Sandy Creek and tributaries
  - Withington Creek and tributaries
  - 74-K Pattee Creek and tributaries

74-M Agency Creek and tributaries

Mill Creek and tributaries Texas, Hawley, Fimber, Junction, Bull, Jake, Canyon and Eighteenmile Creeks and their tributeries

Big Eightmile and Lee Creeks and their tributaries

- Water District 74-U has been established to distribute water rights from the Andrews and Slough Ditch which diverts from the Lemhi River.
- 8. The decree in the case of The State of Idaho v. Mary A. Adams et al. specifically states that certain tributaries of the Lemhi River are not considered tributary to the Lemhi River for the purposes of water distribution.

# CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. There is a need for the creation of a water district for the proper distribution of the public waters of the Lemhi River and its tributarles.
- 2. The department is authorized by provisions of Sections 42-602 and 42-604, Idaho Code to create a water district on the Lemhi River and its tributaries.
- The existing water districts described in Finding No. 6, and Finding No. 7. above should operate as separate entities as they have in the past and should not be included in the water district created by this order.

# ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that Water District No. 74, Lemhi River and tributaries is created for the distribution of water from the Lemhi River and its tributaries which are not included within existing water districts described in Finding of Fact No. 6. and 7. above, except that distribution of water from the Lemhi River to the diversion of the Andrews and Slough Ditch shall be the resconsibility of Water District No. 74 hereby greated. the responsibility of Water District No. 74 hereby created.

II IS FURTHER HEREBY ORDERED, that the streams and water sources declared to be non-tributary to the Lemhi River for the purposes of water distribution but which are not included in an existing water district are to be administered as separate entities with respect to the water rights on the Lemhi River and other sources which are considered tributary to the Lemhi River.
