The secretary stated that \$ 1372.15 is in the account. Next years meeting was set for the first Monday of March 2006 (3/6/06). Next it was decided to continue in the Idaho Water Users Association. The advisory board, chairman, and secretary will remain the same. A motion carried for items 7, 9, 10, and 12 of the 2004 minutes was agreed upon. The water masters pay was raised from \$ 35 to \$ 40 a day and expenses for his motorbike were also raised from \$ 100 to \$ 200 dollars. All members agreed to make payments due by May 15th instead of June 20th. The meeting was followed by a presentation by Greg Martinez of the USACE informing water users about new regulations of culverts ditches etc. that are tributary to streams.
