

WATER DISTRIC 13-S WHISKEY CREEK



Irrigators of Water District 13-S. Whiskey Creek met in the Scott Eastern District Office room of the Williams Ward Church in Niter, Idaho on Saturday March 12, 1994 at 1:40 p. m. Those present were Daniel Mickelson, Glenn Turner,

John Kunz, Dewayne Mendenhall, Gene Rasmussen, Blair Mickelson, Michael Tingey and Martha Bassett. Daniel Mickelson, chairman of the 1993 meeting, called the meeting to order and called for nominations for a chairman for this meeting. Gene Rasmussen moved and Glenn Turner seconded the motion that the chairman and secretary from last year serve this year also. Motion carried.

Minutes of last years meeting were read and approved.

Daniel Mickelson called on John Kunz to report on the activities of the advisory committee. To his knowledge everything had gone satisfactorily. Glenn Turner and Dewayne Mendenhall told of how they had made adjustments to the troublesome division box and Glenn felt that more adjustments could be made to improve the delivery still more.

Blair Mickelson asked what Roger Mickelson was going to do about taking out his water and was told he would handle it the same as in the past.

Since the creek doesn't carry as much water as the historic rights \(\frac{1}{2} \) allot, the water available allocated on a percentage basis. Last year was a much better water year than the past several so every one was happier.

The water master was asked to explain the proposed budget which he did. These amounts will paid to the County Treasurer. Any other projects that are necessary would be paid for by special assessment prorated according to the inches of water held by the irrigators using the ditch that was worked on. Assessments listed in the budget were practillay the same as last year, within a few cents.

Since the budge is under the \$3000mark we aren required to have a treasurer as such, therefore the County Treasurer will collect it for us. The chairman entertained a motion to accept the budget. Dewayne Mendenhall moved and Blair Mickelson seconded the motion to accept the budget. Motion carried.

The motion was made by Glenn Turner and seconded by Blair Mickelson to keep the same advisory committee as last year, namely: Dewayne Mendenhall, Daniel Mickelson, John Kunz and the watermaster.

Dewayne Mendenhall moved and Michael Tingey seconded the motion to retain Glenn Turner as watermaster. Motion carried.

The watermaster brought up the necessity to do something about the Mickelson ditch. A New headgate is a must. A discussion ensued as to what to do and when the work should be done. There is less water in the ditch now than there will be in the fall.

Gene Rasmussen was excused at 2:25.

Glenn Turner made a motion that the work be done this spring, weather permitting by May 1. Dewayne Mendenhall seconded the motion. It was the consensus of the group that they could handle most of the work themselves with a little assistance from Earl Hamp. Motion carried. Irrigators would be assessed for the expenses with those contributing time given credit on their bill. Any bills owed by John Tedrow should go to Mickelsons but designated as for improvements.

With no further business the meeting was adjourned at 2;40 p.m.
