Boise Residano, owners and users of adjudicated water rights met in Department the Bingham County Courthouse in Blackfoot, Idaho, at 12:30 p.m.,

Eastern January 10, 1994.

The meeting was called to order at 12:35 p.m. by Chairman Vincent Reid.

The minutes of the meeting held on January 13, 1992, were read. A motion by Lola Dawn Hernandez, seconded by LaVerle Stecklein, to approve the minutes passed unanimously.

The minutes of the meeting held February 8, 1993, were read. A motion by Zane Caldwell, seconded by Francis Whitten, to accept the minutes as read passed unanimously.

The 1993 Advisory Board consisted of Francis Whitten, Vincent Reid, Allen Oliver, Keith Hunsaker and Lane Hamilton. A motion by Zane Caldwell, seconded by Lola Dawn Hernandez, to retain the present Advisory Board carried unanimously.

Vincent Reid was elected by acclamation as Chairman for the 1994 year.

A motion by Zane Caldwell, seconded by LaVerle Stecklein, to retain Leah Jones to perform secretarial duties carried unanimously.

A motion by Lola Dawn Hernandez, seconded by LaVerle Stecklein, to retain Ed Hall as Watermaster with John Davidson assisting him passed unanimously.

The proposed budget for 1994 was presented. It was noted that the budget had not increased. Ed Hall reported that the excess during the past year was between \$200.00 and \$300.00. A motion by Zane Caldwell to accept the proposed budget was seconded by Lane Hamilton and passed unanimously. The budget is as follows:

MINUTES-WATER DISTRICT #27 - 2 January 10, 1994

Harold Jones from the State Water Resources Board reported when the new management plan goes into effect probably about April, 1994, the water districts will include well users; he felt this will require additional manpower and cost to the State.

There was discussion concerning water quality, Endangered Species Act, NAFTA, and the adjudication of water. Lola Dawn Hernandez urged everyone to contact their congressmen voicing their opinions on issues. Harold Jones stated it was his opinion that it is very important for the adjudication to be continued and a decree issued; he stated a ruling should be made soon on the presumption clause and then adjudication will continue on District #34, Lost River area.

Allen Oliver stated the snow report which came in today was about 60% of the average. He reported storage in the reservoir about 185,000 acre feet with the average being 260,000. He noted, however, the storage water was higher than last year.

A motion by Lane Hamilton, seconded by Zane Caldwell, to retain the same Fort Hall Agreement passed unanimously.

AGREEMENT

Upon due consideration, in meeting assembled, the Blackfoot River Wateruser's Association hereby adopts the following articles of resolution and agreement, to be in effect and to govern the action of the said organization for the year commencing January 1, 1994, and ending December 31, 1994, or upon the date of election next succeeding the election of the Watermaster for 1994.

1. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

An executive committee consisting of five members shall in all matters represent this organization during the term of this agreement and the organization shall be bound by the action of the committee.

2. <u>METHOD OF ASSESSMENTS</u>

It is hereby agreed that the natural flow users under the Stevens Decree shall pay 40% of the Watermaster's salary and other expense incurred in distributing the waters of the Blackfoot River, hereinafter called District 27, and that the Fort Hall Project shall pay 60% of said expense. The rate of assessment per 24 hour second foot shall be computed in accordance with the above proportions.

3. NOTICE OF ASSESSMENT

The Secretary is hereby directed to file with the auditors of Bingham and Caribou counties, copies of these resolutions and the budget adopted, covering estimated expenses of the operation of District 27 for the year 1994.

4. PAYMENT OF ASSESSMENTS

No water shall be delivered to any delinquent user until all delinquencies have been paid, and no water shall be delivered after the first day of June, 1994, until the current year's assessment has been paid: Provided that assessments in excess of \$100.00 may be paid in installments of 1/3 of the total assessment, less any credit due on previous years, May 1, 1994, and 1/3 of the total assessment on the first of July, 1994. The balance of the assessment shall become due and payable upon approval of the Watermaster's report by the Director of the Department of Water Resources for the State of Idaho, as provided in Section 42-614 of the Idaho Law.

5. WATERMASTER

The Watermaster elect will distribute the water of District 27 in accordance with the terms of the Stevens Decree and the Statutes of Idaho, Section 42-614. The Watermaster's term of service is to begin April 15, of each year without notice. He will, not later than November 15th of each year, prepare and submit a report in accordance with the aforementioned statute. In addition to the information required by statute, the Watermaster will include in his report a statement of the decree rights and the respective owners of such rights to whom water has been delivered during the irrigation season. The Watermaster will be governed by the following rules:

(a) Water measurements

The Watermaster will make, or cause to be made, measurements of all water diverted to each canal or water user entitled to receive water from the Blackfoot River. The results of such measurements shall become part of the record, and the property of the Blackfoot River Water User's Association. The results of water measurements shall at all times be available for inspection by any member of the Association. Measurements of each separate diversion shall be made as often as required in the judgment of the Watermaster, but in no case shall measurements be made less than once in each fifteen days during the months of June, July and August. Measurements may be made by means of current meter, standard orifice, weir, or other standard measurement device.

- (b) The Watermaster shall in like manner make, or cause to be made, measurements and keep records of inflows to the Blackfoot River. Record of measurements obtained by the Watermaster through cooperation with the Fort Hall Project personnel shall be accepted as fulfilling requirements of the resolution. The Watermaster shall, upon request, furnish the Fort Hall Project Engineer copies of measurements.
- (c) The Watermaster will adjust the headgates of all natural flow rights in accordance with the Stevens Decree and measurements obtained as directed in paragraph (b). The Fort Hall Project Engineer will adjust the central gates of the Blackfoot Reservoir, the equalizing reservoir, and the North and Main Canal headgates. The Watermaster will be duly advised of all changes made in the gates regulated by the Fort Hall Project Engineer.

6. ACCEPTANCE BY THE UNITED STATES INDIAN SERVICE

Adoption of these resolutions shall become effective with respect to the Fort Hall Project and all water distributed to the Fort Hall Project from any source, when the Fort Hall Project Engineer has affixed his signature in the presence of two witnesses. They shall otherwise be null and void with respect to the Fort Hall Project.
