THIS HAS BEEN AN EXTREMELY GOOD WATER YEAR. UNTIL ABOUT JUNE FIRST THERE HAS BEEN ENOUGH WATER IN THE CREEK TO SATISFY ALL THE USERS WITHOUT BENEFIT OF CALLING OUT THE WATERMASTER. BY THE TIME I WENT ON DUTY JUNE 8, 1996, MOST OF THE WATER USERS IN THE UPPER BASIN HAD STARTED HAYING AND THE CREEK WAS ALREADY TAKING A SHARP DROP IN VOLUME.

ON JANUARY 1, 1997 WE EXPERIENCED A FLOOD OF MUCH THE SAME MAGNITUDE AS THAT IN 1964. IN TALKING WITH THE PEOPLE AT THE ARS IN REYNOLDS CREEK THEY NOTED THAT ABOUT 4 PM JAN 1 THERE WAS ABOUT ELEVEN AND ONE HALF FEET OF WATER GOING OVER THE OUTLET WEIR AT REYNOLDS CREEK. THE CREEK DID NOT CREST UNTIL ABOUT MIDNIGHT ON JAN 1. THERE WAS CONSIDERABLE DAMAGE DONE AT SEVERAL OF THE LOWER REACH DIVERSIONS. I ATRIBUTE THE MORE SEVERE DAMAGE IN THE LOWER REACHES OF THE CREEK TO THE FACT THAT THERE IS MUCH MORE WATER/DRAINAGE AREA BELOW THE UPPER REACH DIVERSIONS (MACKS, COTTLE, SALMON, AND WILSON CREEKS PLUS SEVERAL USUALLY DRY SAND DRAWS. THE GROUND WAS FROZEN, WE HAD ALOT OF SNOW, AND THEN CAME A CHINOOK WIND THAT TOOK IT ALL OFF FAST.
