COME NOW Southwest Irrigation District, Goose Creek Irrigation District and Petitioners, Jack Duncan, Paul Duncan, Bill Hepworth, Bruce Newcomb, Mark Newcomb, Mark Sanderson, Dan Walton, Gary Fowler, William McManus, Ron Heib, Ardel Wickel, Lynn Mitchell and Del Mitchell and petitions the Department for reconsideration of the Final Order Creating Water District No. 140 and allege:

The petitioning parties concur with the Department in creating Water 1. District No. 140, however, the petitioning parties allege that certain references to the boundary of the Eastern Snake Plain Aquifer as shown on attachment A and as referenced in the Order are inappropriate and were not subject to the proceedings creating Water District No. 140.

PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION - 1

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The petitioning parties particularly ask for reconsideration of Findings of 2. Fact 25, 26, 27, 33, and 37 for the reasons that any reference to the Eastern Snake Plain aguifer and the boundaries outlined on attachment A are more complicated than described in the referenced USGS Professional Paper and the dash line on the attachment. The boundary described by the USGS is determined by areal extent of basalts considered to be in the Snake River Plain group. The geology of tributary valleys must be considered when finalizing the ESPA boundary. Without extensive chemical profiling, it is impossible to determine the boundary of the ESPA water. Voluminous amounts of water coming from the surrounding and leakage from canals and containment basins enter the ground water and mix with water of the ESPA. Not all ground water in tributary basalts is ESPA water. Maintaining this description of ESPA increases the responsibility of mitigation on ground water irrigators within Basin 45. Irrigators holding ground water rights with wells completed in basalts pumps water that is more likely derived from surrounding mountains. Ground water boundaries cannot be determined with vertical lines described by the juxtaposition of stratigraphic formations. New and pending scientific data on ground water of the area will more adequately describe the "mixing zone."

- As to Finding No. 27 this is similar to the preceding point. The mound 3. created by leakage of surface water to ground water in the Murtaugh Lake area intercepts the boundary of the ESPA as described in paragraph 27. As with other areas of the ESPA, ground water pumpers cannot be responsible to mitigate for ground water pumped from sources other than the ESPA.
 - As to Finding No. 33 this is as heretofore noted in this Petition. 4.
 - As to Finding No. 37 the IDWR Water Right Data Base returned 8,748 5.

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acres with expanded water rights within the boundary of SWID/GCID. The additional 3,000 acres is not accounted for.

- 6. As to Conclusion of Law No. 10 it was the understanding of the petitioning parties that the IDWR would provide funding for a water master for a period of two years. The moving parties understood that in creation of other Water Districts, i.e., 120 and 130. that that was the case, and the moving parties ask that this be incorporated for equal treatment.
- 7. Finally, the petitioning parties request that any reference to the Eastern Snake Plain Aquifer be eliminated from the final Order as it was not discussed. requested to be determined by the Director or in any manner a basis to create Water District No. 140.
- 8. Alternatively, the petitioning parties would respectfully request a hearing with the Idaho Department of Water Resources to resolve this matter as to have a final Order on the basis that it now stands with relation to the Eastern Snake Plain Aquifer would have an effect of res judicata in subsequent proceedings either before the Department or in the courts.

Marsh Creek Water District 45F surface irrigation is a unique water district in its self. The watershed takes in all tributaries off the north side of the Albion Mountain Range, which starts out at 9,267 feet elevation and its lower basin of the Albion Valley is at 4500 feet. The Albion Basin is surrounded on the west side with the Declo Hills and the east side with the Contrell Mountains, all their drainages going to the main channel streams of the Howell Creek, Land Creek and Marsh Creek. The Albion Basin also sets on two faults (uplifting) on both the west (Declo Hills) and east sides of the (Contrell Mountain) ranges. The water district 45F ends at the North End of Marsh Creek at the Anderson Slip Located on the Main 6S-Ranch, which is at the East side of Declo valley at a elevation of 4,100 ft. Marsh Creek at this point on through to the Snake River is another sub-district within the current water district in 45. The overall area of Water District 45F, takes in an estimated total of 150 sq. miles.

The major land uses in the area include rangeland, agriculture, and recreation. Agriculture produce is limited due to higher elevations and the proximity to the mountains but does include alfalfa, wheat, beans, potatoes and dairy. This is primarily handled through our surface water irrigation and few wells that replaced areas that were irrigated with surface waters. This basin is very short on live stream irrigation therefore, leaving each year individuals that due have rights, without water.

Under the Stocks VS Woods the Albion Marsh Creek Water District earliest rights stand at <u>April 1, 1873</u> and what we call High Water is any right that falls in with a date of 1892. These rights may or may not get water only when we have a good spring run off. Usually to help build good water storage in the ground some water right users will call for water and irrigate in off-season to build a water table.

I too, would like The Idaho Department of Water Resources to consider making The Albion Marsh Creek Water District a separate water district from the consideration of being combined with the Oakley Water District 140. I believe after the complete over view that Mr. Earl Warthen submits and the Albion Mayor elect, Mr. Don Bowden, who submitted maps and documents, will open up a complete new picture for Water District 45F in keeping it as a separate district.
