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## HEARING TRANSCRIPT

Hearing conducted on Wednesday, October 3, 2007, Albion, Idaho.

**DIRECTOR TUTHILL**: Good evening, my name is Dave Tuthill, the Director of the Idaho Department of Water Resources. It's the evening of October 3, 2007. We began this discussion at 7- a few minutes after 7 pm, as identified in the notice of hearing. Now its 8:51pm. We are here in the matter of creating the Oakley Valley Area Water District, Water District No.140 for the administration of Water Rights in Administrative Basin 45. This hearing notice was sent out on the 20<sup>th</sup> of September, 2007. We have about 15 or so of the water users and local people from the area here in Albion. We've had a discussion about pre hearing matters and at this point I have committed in this discussion to prepare and send a letter to Water District 45F in which I would indicate that to the extent that 45F is providing adequate delivery of surface water and associated records, that 45F would not pay a fee to water district No.140 for the surface water delivery relative to ground water delivery in the Albion area, the area that's covered by water district 45F. It's not determined exactly what the process will be. There are presently a couple of options. One option is for the members of 45F to assume the responsibilities of water delivery for the ground water in this area, another option is for water district 140 to assume those responsibilities. Either way the measurement reporting need to be in accordance with the standards that have been adopted by the Department in water districts for ground water delivery.

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We are not at the point we can beginning taking statements and comments from any persons who desire to be heard. I will ask this group if there are those who wish to provide information for the record. Based on our discussion some of the questions have been answered, not necessarily all so with that I will go through the document where people signed in to see if they wish at this point to testify. 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**EARL WARTHEN:** I will withhold for a moment.

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**DIRECTOR TUTHILL:** You will withhold for a moment, thank you.

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**DIRECTOR TUTHILL:** And the third name I can't read from Albion Ranches.

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UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: Mr. Teeter

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**DIRECTOR TUTHILL:** Mr. Teeter do you wish to make a statement. Ok, thank you.

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**DIRECTOR TUTHILL:** Mr. Gunderson

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**MR GUNDERSON:** I would just as soon pass ...I'm pretty well......inaudible... with what's been discussed this evening.

**DIRECTOR TUTHILL:** Ok, thank you Mr. Gunderson -chooses not to make a statement at this time. Mr. Bell?

MR BELL: Inaudible

**DIRECTOR TUTHILL:** Ok, thank you Mr. Bell. Uh, I am not seeing, oh yes Mr. Bowden. Mayor Bowden.

**MAYORR BOWDEN:** Yes, I would like to make a comment for the record.

**DIRECTOR TUTHILL:** Oh yes, please approach the mic, pull up a chair and please state your name and address for the record Mr. Bowden.

MAYOR BOWDEN: My name is Don Bowden, I reside at 363 S. Main, Albion. I am the current Mayor for the City of Albion. I want to thank you gentlemen for extending the courtesy and taking the time to come down here to meet with these folks of this valley, you can see it's a good group who care and most of the issues you covered in our pre hearing discussion. I want to say thank you for that but I would like to request of you as you see this issue moving forward as we have requested to be a separate district, if you gentlemen can see an advantage or a level playing field for this group of folks who live in this small community, to keep an open mind and create and give consideration to creating a separate district if it would better serve the needs of these people. I understand right now the discussion that has taken place that, you have addressed most everything and it appears to me that we are being treated fairly and justly and you are doing the very best with the conditions that you can so that would be my request that if conditions change and being a separate district would better serve this group, I would ask that you keep that as an open option.

DIRECTOR TUTHILL: Ok, thank you Mr. Bowden. I would reiterate at this point that in the discussion I did mention that a water district is created by the Director of the Department based on statutory authority. The water district that is created can be changed over time. If this water district is created, including Marsh creek as part of water district 140, there is a potential that at some point in the future that this portion could be split off. If that is found to be best serving the interests of both the local area and also the state water delivery so, thank you for bringing that up Mayor Bowden.

MAYOR BOWDEN: Thank you.

**DIRECTOR TUTHILL:** With that is there anybody else in attendance this evening that would wish to make a comment for the record.
